VILLAGE BOARD PROCEEDINGS. Kewaskum, Feb. 8, 1896, 7:30 P. M. Board met in regular session with President Adolph Rosenheimer in the chair and all trustees present except M. Remmel. Minutes of previous meeting were read and approved. The following resolutions, on motion of Wm. Krahn, were adopted: WHEREAS, The following described real estate—to-wit: sw 1/4 of sw 1/4, S. 10, T. 12, R. 19—was assessed to Aug. Backhaus and the amount of taxes on same as per tax roll is \$11.18; and, WHEREAS, The above described real estate is in the town of Kewaskum and was erroneously assessed by the village of Kewaskum; therefore, be it Resolved, That the clerk be and is hereby authorized and directed to issue a village order to Aug. Backhaus for the sum of \$11.18; and, further, Resolved, That the clerk be and is hereby authorized and directed to cancel the foregoing described real estate from the assessment roll. On motion of Frank Smith the following resolutions were adopted: WHEREAS, Lot 1 of block 1 in Altenhofen addition has been assessed twice—to Jo. Gritter and to Carl Backhaus; and said lot belongs to C. Backhaus; therefore, be it Resolved, That the clerk be and is hereby authorized and directed to cancel the assessment against Jo. Gritter; and, further, Resolved, That the treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to credit himself with \$3.09, the amount of said assessment, as same was not collected by said treasurer. Henry Backhaus, Jr., representing Henry Backhaus, Jr., & Co., came before the board and reported that he paid tax under protest on personal property illegally assessed against said company. Said report was laid over till next meeting. Application and bond of John Guth, for license to sell intoxicating liquors were accepted. It was moved and carried to have the monthly stock fair on last Wednesday of each month instead of last Saturday, and the clerk was directed to have hand-bills printed to this effect. On motion the following resolution was adopted: Resolved, That the ensuing municipal election be held in the village of Kewaskum on the first Tuesday in April, instead of the first Tuesday in May. Krahn, publishing ordinances..... \$25.00 Kewaskum Electric Light Co., electric light..... 4.00 David Casey, monthly salary as marshal..... 25.00 Frank Smith, expenses for village purposes..... 2.00 The bill of the Pilot, for printing election tickets, was laid over till the next meeting; also, that of David Casey, for attending to the wants of quarantined families during diphtheria sickness.
