VILLAGE OF KEWASKUM. Notice is hereby given that the Board of Review for the village of Kewaskum will meet at the office of the undersigned, clerk of said village on the 29th day of June, 1905, last Monday at 10 a. m., for the purpose of reviewing and certifying the assessment roll of real and personal property in said village, and all sworn statements and returns of assessors and collectors thereon, and of collecting all arrears in said roll within the description of property or otherwise. Dated at the village of Kewaskum this 29th day of June, 1905. JOSEPH SCHMIDT, clerk.

ORDINANCE NO. VI. The Village board of Kewaskum do ordain as follows: Sec. 1. It is unlawful for any person or persons to fire or discharge any pistol or firearm of any description, with the intent and willful purpose of Kewaskum, except by permission of the Village board of said village. Sec. 2. Any person or persons who shall violate the provisions of the foregoing section (1) of this ordinance shall forfeit a penalty of not less than three dollars (\$3) nor more than ten dollars (\$10) for each violation. Sec. 3. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage and publication. Passed June 1, 1905. ADOLPH ROSENHEIMER, President. JOSEPH SCHMIDT, Clerk.

ORDINANCE NO. VI. The Village board of Kewaskum do ordain as follows: Sec. 1. Every owner or keeper of a dog in said village of Kewaskum shall on or before the first day of July in each year cause it to be licensed for one year from that date in the village clerk's office of said village, and shall pay for said license one dollar (\$1) for every male and two dollars (\$2) for every female dog. The license shall consist of a brass plate, differently designed for each year, which plate shall be properly stamped and numbered and shall be furnished each year by said village. Sec. 2. It shall be the duty of the village clerk in conjunction with the village marshal to collect the said license money, and said clerk, upon receiving payment of the required license fee, issue and properly record the same in a book kept for that purpose, and shall retain a fee of ten (10) cents for each license issued by him and the balance into the village treasury, to be appropriated with other funds belonging to said village. Sec. 3. Upon receipt of said license tag, or plate, the owner or keeper of each licensed dog shall secure and attach to the neck of each dog by means of a collar or band. Sec. 4. Any owner or keeper of a dog who shall violate the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not less than five dollars (\$5) nor more than ten dollars (\$10) with cost of prosecution, and it is hereby made the duty of the village marshal or said village to make complaint to any justice of the peace in said village against any person or persons who shall violate the provisions of this ordinance. Sec. 5. The license issued in accordance with the ordinance shall be transferable only upon a change of the ownership of the dog. Sec. 6. 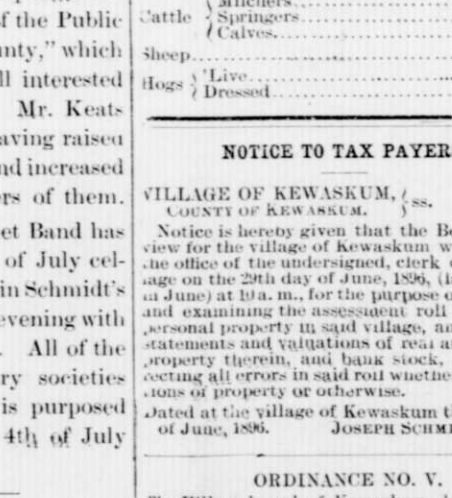
