WAS HE BURIED ALIVE?

W. F. Torke, the cigar manufacturer who was found dead in bed at the home of his sister, Mrs. Geo. Gersmehl, in Adell on March 21st, was well known in Kewaskum, as he sold goods here many times.

He retired on Saturday night in his usual health, and at about 8 a. m. of the following Sunday, when awakened by his brother, he expressed a desire to sleep a while longer. At about 11:30 his sister called him, and on failing to receive a reply, she went to the room and found him dead.

He had been subject to epileptic fits since he was 9 years old, and the physicians who were summoned said that was the cause of his death. However, Frank Rose, who was here from Adell last Monday, was of the opinion that the deceased entered the grave alive, as when viewed in the church Torke's face had changed color so that it was deemed advisable to leave the body uncovered in the grave except by the lid of the coffin; and Mr. R. said that when the remains were reviewed on the day after the funeral, the hands had moved from the breast to the back of the head.
