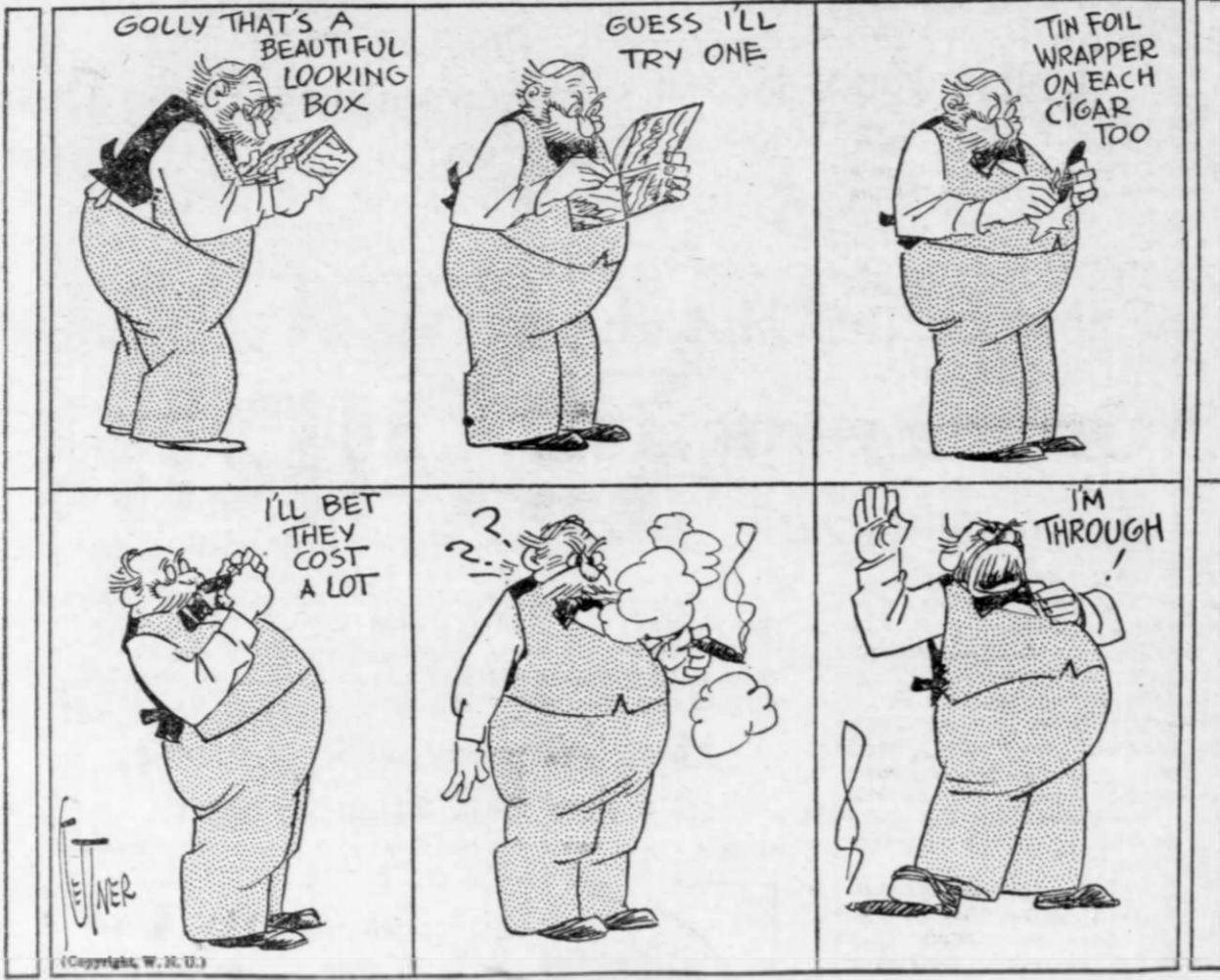

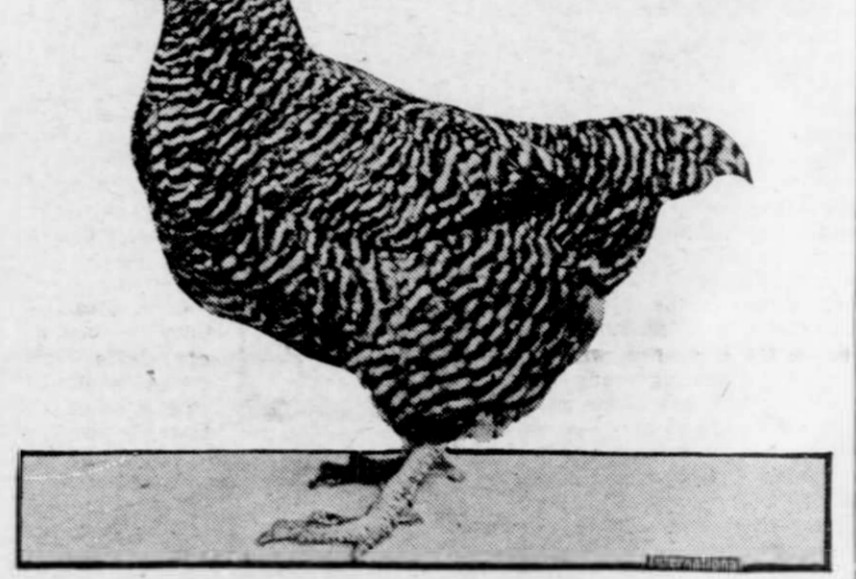

Plants Improve Main Highways

Twenty-Five States Have No Laws Governing Trees. The act, passed at the last session of congress, which permits the federal government to pay half the cost of wayside planting along federal-aided highways, will give considerable impetus to the movement long fostered by women's clubs and other social organizations, and its effect will quickly be evident in an improvement of the appearance of the main interstate roads, according to the bureau of public roads of the United States Department of Agriculture.

Medium Producing Cows Like Alfalfa and Corn Since there is seldom a deficiency in carbohydrates and fat when the dairy cow has all the roughage that she can eat, a roughly balanced ration may be obtained by balancing the protein of the grain mixture to go with the roughage and disregarding the carbohydrates and fat. 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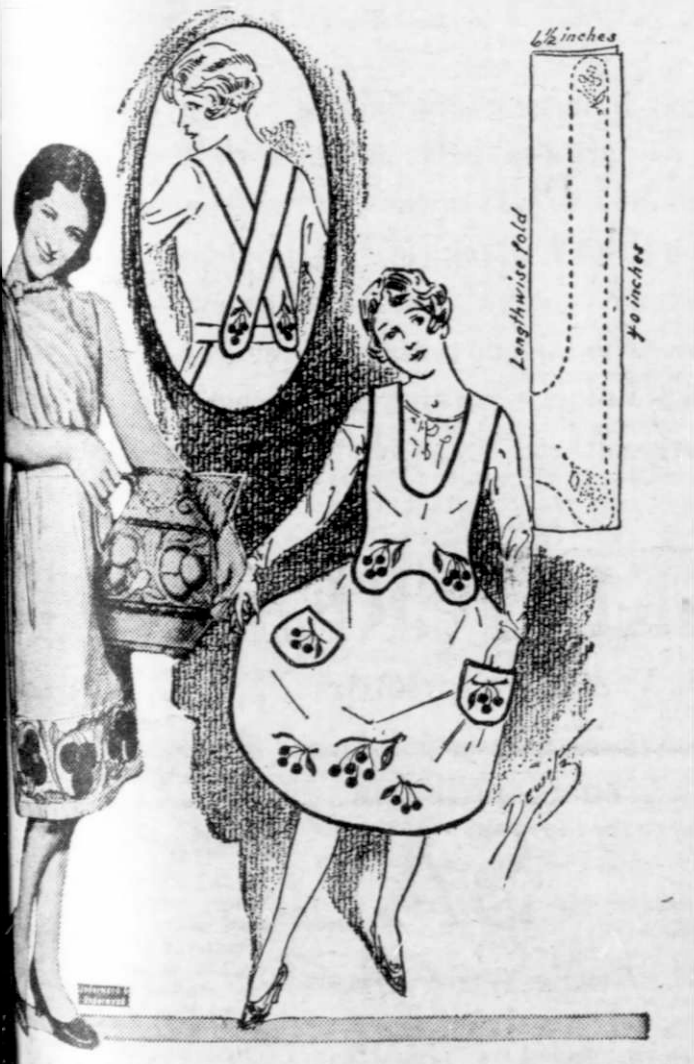

The Kitchen Cabinet

The art of cooking cannot be learned out of a book any more than the art of swimming, or the art of painting.

Here is a nice dessert which will add variety to the dinner: Ginger Pudding.—Take three ounces of chopped candied ginger, two ounces of crushed macaroons, the grated rind of a lemon, two table-spoonfuls of sugar, one-half cupful of milk and one-half cupful of cream.

Oyster Cakes.—Chop two dozen oysters. To two table-spoonfuls of butter and one-half cupful of cream add the oysters; scald, add one table-spoonful of bread crumbs, salt and pepper to taste.

Mayonnaise of Eggs.—Take six hard cooked eggs, six medium-sized tomatoes, lettuce and one cupful of mayonnaise. Shell the eggs and cut into halves; cut the tomatoes into halves and bake them until tender.

Some Luncheon Dishes. Luncheon dishes are always popular especially at this season when bridge parties and dinners are so frequent.

Deviled Oysters.—Wash and drain one quart of oysters, chop them and season with one teaspoonful of salt, one-third of a teaspoonful of cayenne, two table-spoonfuls of lemon juice and one-fourth teaspoonful of mustard.

Browned Asparagus.—Drain one can of asparagus, dip each stalk in beaten egg, then in grated cheese and then again in egg and crumbs. Fry a delicate brown in deep fat and serve garnished with celery tops.

Mincéd Ham in Cider Mold.—Chop one cupful of boiled ham, add one-half cupful of celery finely minced, the yolks of three hard-boiled eggs mashed, one-half teaspoonful of salt and a little cayenne; stir in just before serving.

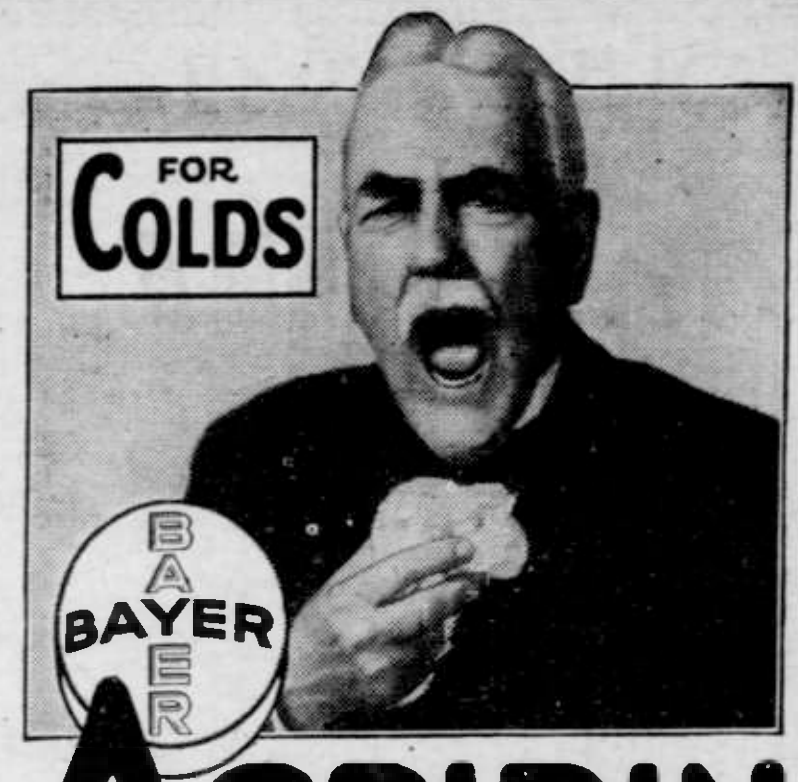

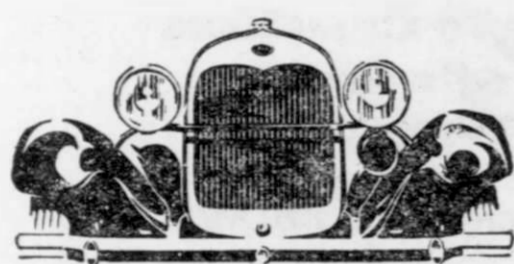

The hot water around the cylinder head is drawn to the radiator to be cooled by a centrifugal water pump of new design.

The radiator should be kept full, of course, and drained once each month so that sediment will not collect and retard the free passage of water. In cold weather, a reliable anti-freeze solution should be added.

As owner and manager of this important water plant you should also see that the water pump and fan shaft are properly lubricated and the packing around the pump shaft kept in adjustment.

MEMORIAL

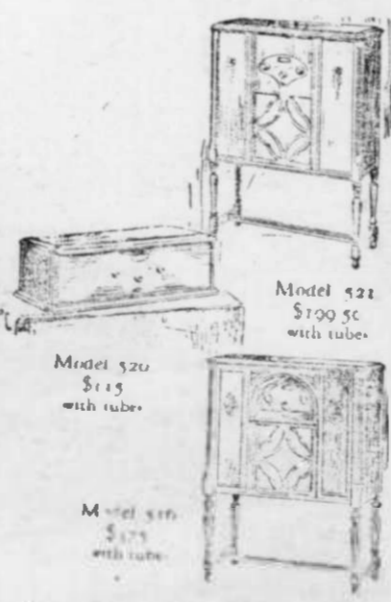
In sad remembrance of our beloved son, Wilmer Probst Jr., who passed away in death one year ago January 15, 1928:
