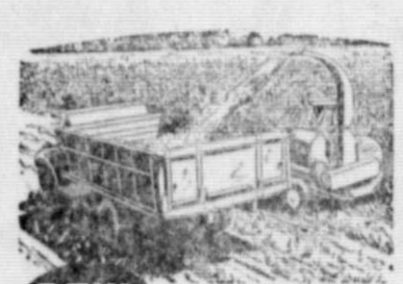

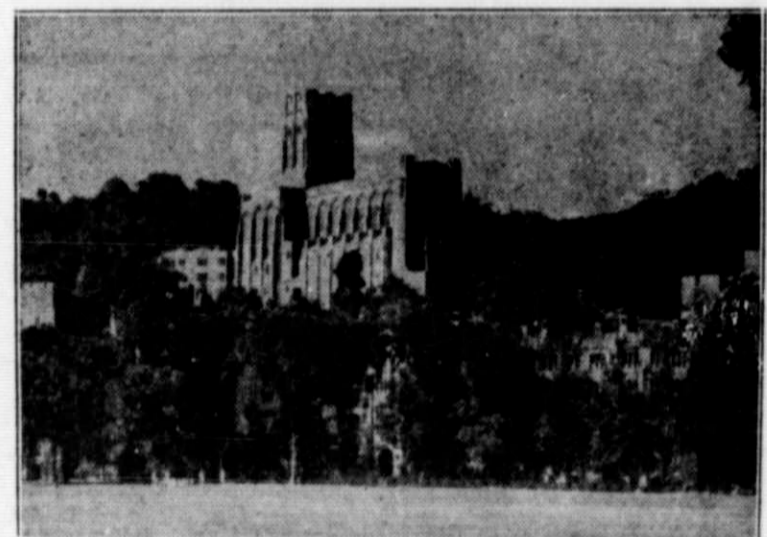

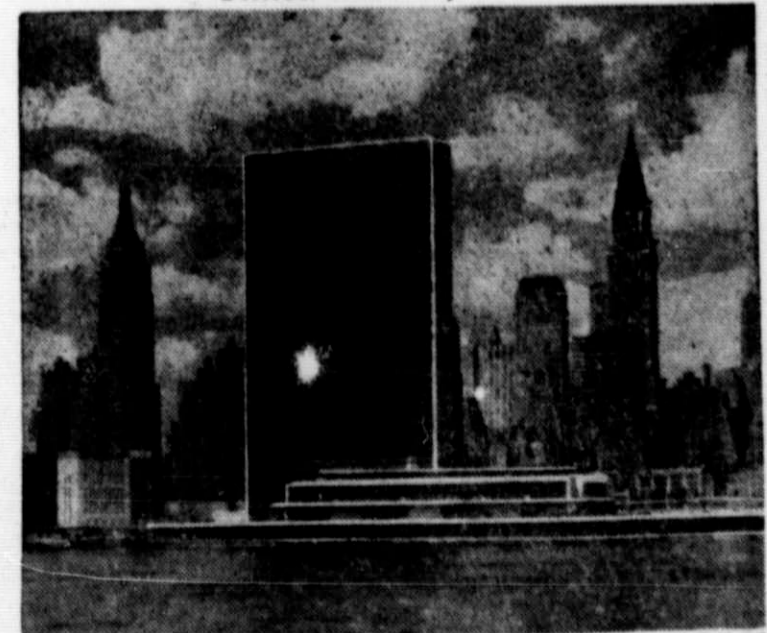


CADET CHAPEL, U. S. MILITARY ACADEMY— This structure, erected in 1910, dominates the grounds at West Point and is a center of interest among visitors at the sesquicentennial exercises this year. The stained glass window over the altar has twenty-seven panels, each depicting a militant Biblical character. The window at the entrance pictures the Revelation of St. John the Divine; it shows also the designs of the Medal of Honor and the Distinguished Service Cross. The windows in the nave are gifts of the several classes; the flags hanging in the nave were used in the War of 1812, the Mexican, Civil, and Spanish-American Wars. The Chapel Organ is the largest church organ in the Western Hemisphere, and contains over 14,000 pipes. The seating capacity is 1,500.

Milk Care During Warm Weather

The original goodness of milk from healthy cows can be retained even in warm weather, says Harvey Weavers, Chief of the Dairy Division of the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture.

Clean production methods and efficient cooling are the two practices that will make milk "stand up" in warm weather, Weavers declared.

Proper production and cooling will also prevent losses to producers, haulers, dairy plants and marketing organizations, which result from off-flavored milk, souring, poor quality production and rejected milk.

Weavers listed several suggestions that will aid in maintaining the original goodness in milk.

1. Prepare cows for milking by washing the udders with warm water and sanitizing solution.
2. Immediately after milking rinse all utensils with luke warm water.
3. Wash utensils with a good dairy washing powder and brush.
4. Store utensils, inverted, in a clean place, preferably in the milk house.
5. Before again using utensils sanitize with boiling hot water or an approved sanitizing agent.
6. Always cool milk quickly and keep it cold—50 degrees F. is about right.
7. Always protect milk when in transit.
