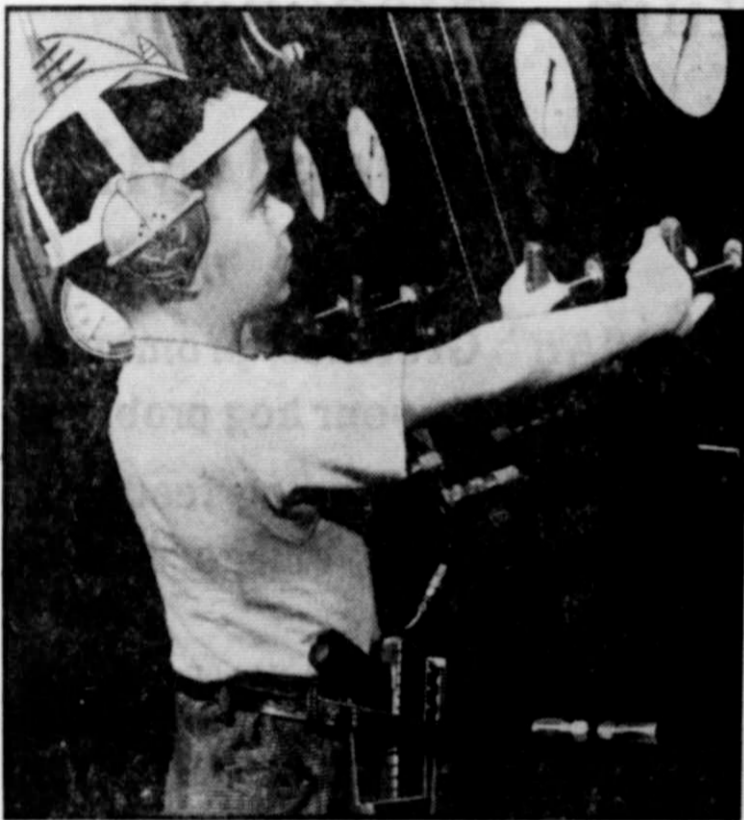

**Bird Owners Warned Against Psittacosis**

Parakeets are now the most popular of all bird pets and their popularity has prompted issuing of a warning about a serious disease sometimes carried by parakeets and other birds to their owners.

The disease is psittacosis. It is a severe and sometimes fatal respiratory infection and it gets its name because most human cases have been traced to members of the parrot family, perhaps because parrots and parakeets are most likely to be in close association with human beings.

An epidemic of the disease about 20 years ago in the United States caused stringent restrictions to be placed on importing any birds of the parrot family. But controls have been relaxed recently, the bulletin points out, and the result has been a rapid creation of new sources of birds from unknown stock. Also illegitimate peddlers have appeared offering birds for quick sale, unsuspecting and sometimes infected.

Five states in this general area have reported an increase in human psittacosis, recently, and this is what the doctors advise to help keep human psittacosis in control, here.

First: Never buy a parakeet from anybody but a reliable dealer of inspected birds since most of the identified cases seem to stem from unscrupulous dealers of illegally acquired birds.

Second: Have your birds tested periodically because apparently normal birds are capable of spreading infection.

Third: Never allow a parakeet to kiss you or take food from your mouth. In several cases the illness was clearly acquired that way.

Fortunately, treatment with some of the new antibiotics has removed some of the fear associated with the disease and, though the number of cases has increased, the mortality rate has diminished. Nevertheless, it is a serious illness and every parakeet owner should be aware of the danger and of the measures needed to keep it in control.

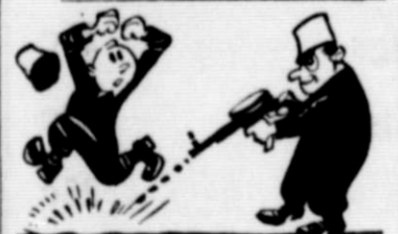

## Doughboy Trailer Exhibit is Coming to Kewaskum April 14

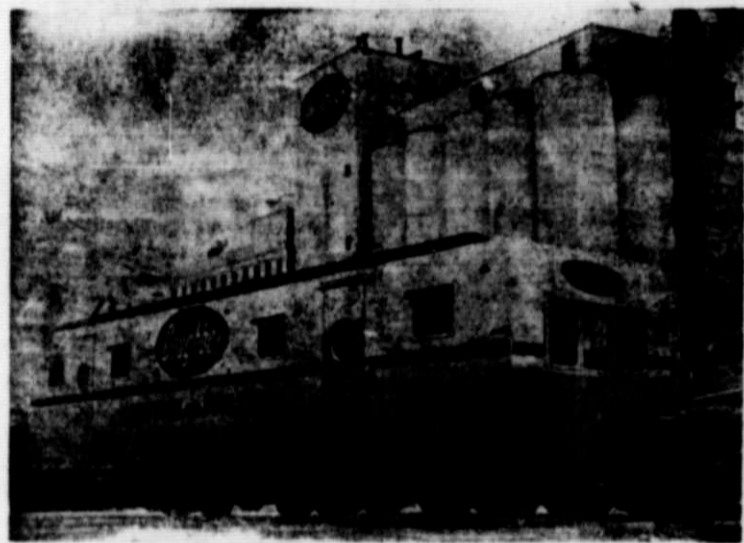
Something new is coming to Kewaskum, Wednesday afternoon, April 14.

It's the Doughboy Trailer Exhibit, "Livestock and Poultry Education Exhibit," a unique live farm animal show on wheels containing:



W. A. "Art" Greenlee, prominent Doughboy Hog Specialist, will be here in connection with the showing of Doughboy's mobile live animal exhibit.

Live experimental hogs, chickens and turkeys taken from the Doughboy Experimental Farm at New Richmond, Wis.

The 38-foot specially constructed trailer will be parked near the Rosenheimer Feed Mill, open free to the public from 1 to 5 p. m. Its appearance here was arranged by the L. Rosenheimer Feed Mill of Kewaskum, local Doughboy dealer, in cooperation with the Formula Feeds Division of Doughboy Industries, Inc.

In charge of the walk-in animal exhibit is W. A. "Art" Greenlee, prominent hog specialist, who will point out the difference in growth of hogs fed different feed rations. Assisting him will be Hulbert Sandmand and Tony Schulz, Doughboy representative for this area.

The unit also contains pens of live poultry which have been fed vitamin-deficient rations; samples of ingredient found in formula feeds, and pictures showing how modern feed is manufactured scientifically.

Mr. Greenlee, who has spent many years raising and studying hogs and servicing midwest hog feeders, will also be on hand to help local farmers with their individual problems.

From here, the unit will move on to Jackson, where it will be shown the same evening, April 14, in connection with a hog feeder meeting at the village hall starting at 8 p. m.

## What Do You Think of Your Kewaskum?

Again we hear that some of our youngsters ran into difficulty with the law. One even had the misfortune of having run errand once before. Or is it misfortune? What caused him to make such a move? Is the youth and his companion solely to blame? He may now be an outcast of society, but isn't society very much to blame for his and others' downfall?

S. B. Powers, supt. of the state reformatory at Green Bay, warns that there may be a 45% increase in juvenile delinquency unless a plan to keep youth out of trouble is developed.

He feels that society might profitably spend more time, effort, thought and money in an attempt to reduce opportunities and the

likelihood of young people getting into trouble with the law.

Your Community Service committee feels also as does Mr. Powers that an aggressive prevention program should be developed which would include recreational facilities, adequate schools, and the use of school facilities after hours.

The contemplated new high school district is a move in this direction. The village board is also bearing the foregoing thoughts in mind because the plans they had

drawn for the municipal building include more than just the present low structure as we see it.

These are proper progressive thoughts and your committee would like to see fulfillment of same for the benefit of our community and especially our youth.
