Dimes Drive Here Nets \$2293, Over Double of Last Year

FINAL RESULTS SHOW RECORD AMOUNT COLLECTED IN VERY SUCCESSFUL DRIVE IN VILLAGE

Wayland Tessar, village of Kewaskum chairman in the recent March of Dimes drive, reported this week that a total of \$2,293.10 was collected locally during the campaign. This total is a record high for the village and more than doubles the amount collected last year when \$995.31 was solicited.

The largest amount was collected in the Mothers' March house to house canvass, which netted \$609.39. Broken down, the total was reached through contributions received from the following sources:

Kewaskum and community had an epidemic of polio last year and local residents showed that they want to prevent this from happening again as much as possible by going all out in this year's drive. Severe Snowstorm Causes Accidents

The most severe snow, sleet and electrical storm of the winter struck this area Saturday. Although only about three or four inches of snow fell it was accompanied by a high wind which piled the snow into drifts and made driving very hazardous. At times the swirling snow made it almost impossible to see ahead while driving. Saturday's snow fall was the third in about a week after having very little snow all winter.

The slippery roads and blinding snow caused a number of minor accidents, none of them serious, and cars to get stuck. It is reported that three local couples were marooned in their car while returning home early Sunday. The auto ran into a snowbank on Co. Trunk north of Kewaskum and got stuck, forcing the couples to remain in the car most of the night. A passing truck got them out hours later.

Some of the Kewaskum bowlers returning from the Legion tournament at Middleton Saturday night are reported to have had a hazardous trip home with one car running into the ditch.

No storm damage was reported in this community but near West Bend a home was struck by lightning and badly damaged. A cow in the barn was also killed by the bolt. Lights were also "knocked out" by lightning in some areas.

Parish Tops Quota in Charities Drive

Results were most gratifying in the Catholic Charities and Seminary fund drive conducted in Holy Trinity church, Kewaskum, and the mission parish at St. Bridgets, on Sunday, March 4.

At Holy Trinity parish the sum of \$1,787.00 was collected, putting the congregation well over the top again in the drive. The quota for the parish was \$1,500.00. At St. Bridget's the sum of \$463.00 was collected. This is a bit less than the actual quota of \$500.00.

In both parishes there were still a number of cards out which were expected to add to the totals when they were turned in with their amounts. Lakes Stars Lose to Beavers, 74-68

JOHN TESSAR, AUGIE BILGO OF KEWASKUM SCORE 8 AND 4 POINTS RESPECTIVELY

In an exhibition game at Beaver Dam Sunday afternoon, the Land o' Lakes northern division all-stars lost to Beaver Dam, 74-68. The game was to be a benefit for the league treasury (trophies and insurance fund) but was a 'bust' financially.

The Beavers, who ended up in a tie for second place with Mayville in the league standings, were outscored from the field by the all-stars by three goals but defeated them from the free throw line. The Beavers swished in 22 free tosses while the star squad connected on a mere 10. The losers sank 29 field goals compared to 26 for Beaver Dam. Manager "Cisco" Backhaus of the league champion Kewaskum Chevrolets managed the star team in the exhibition.

The all-stars from only five of the seven teams besides Beaver Dam in the loop showed up for the contest. Campbellsport's Fred Bleck and Dave Wondra and Hartford's Del Renzaglia, Howie Hagen and Jim Stracka failed to play. Kewaskum's title team was represented by John Tessar, league leading scorer, who scored 8 points, and Augie Bilgo, who chipped in 4. Other stars in the game and points scored included Genzmer, Mayville, 2; Herman, Mayville, 6; Frank, West Bend, 8; Behling, Rosendale, 8; Wild, Mayville, 6; Tennes, West Bend, 8, and Wrucke, Horicon, 18, who copped scoring honors for the losers. None of the all-stars played the full game.

Top point makers for the Beavers were their scoring aces, Freddie Miller and Paul Cloyd, both of whom are members of the all-star squad in other games. Miller was high with 23 and Cloyd added 17.

In another all-star contest earlier in the season, Kewaskum was defeated by the stars of the other teams. This game was played here.

FRIDAY DEADLINE TO FILE NOMINATION PAPERS HERE

This Friday, March 16, at 5 p. m. is the deadline for candidates to file nomination papers for the three village trustee offices to be elected on April 3. Nomination papers are available at the office of the village commissioner.

Three trustees will be elected to succeed Arvin Merwin, Carl F. Schaefer and Marvin Schaefer. The three other trustees hold over in office another year, as do the remainder of the village officers.

Girl, 14, Dies of Injuries in Kohlsville Crash

Sandra Ginochio, 14, of West Bend, died Tuesday in St. Joseph's hospital, West Bend, of injuries suffered Sunday night when a car in which she was a passenger left Washington County Trunk D, plunged through a ditch and hit two trees about a half mile east of Kohlsville.

Three other teen-agers in the auto were hurt—William Berres, 19, of Port Washington, the driver, multiple lacerations of the face; Ralph Kuechler, 18, of Waukesha, cuts and bruises, and Jan Pfister, 15, of West Bend, bumps and bruises. The top of the car was flattened when it came to a halt against the second tree hit.

All of the injured were taken to St. Joseph's hospital, where the Ginochio girl died Tuesday. The driver of the car is facing a reckless driving charge. He apparently lost control of the vehicle.

Kuechler, one of the passengers in Berres' car, had also been involved in another accident earlier Sunday when a car driven by him and one driven by Erich Erdman, 55, R. 2, Kewaskum, collided shortly before noon at the intersection of Hwys. D and W. Erdman was traveling east on D and Kuechler on W. Kuechler was unable to stop for a stop sign at the intersection and his car slid into the one driven by Erdman as the Kuechler machine slid through the intersection. Kuechler escaped injury in the first crash.

An auto owned by James Falk, R. 2, Kewaskum, and driven by Richard Dreher, 18, of Kewaskum collided with one driven by Cyril H. Wiator, 33, of Kewaskum, at 1 p. m. last Friday at the intersection of Railroad and 2nd streets in front of the Regal Ware, Inc. Wiator was northbound on Railroad st. when his car struck the left rear fender of the auto driven by Dreher, which was westbound on 2nd st. and was turning south on Railroad st. The vehicles collided at the center of the intersection, according to Chief of Police Roland Pledt.
