**SCHOWALTER CO-SPONSOR
OF TWO ASSEMBLY BILLS**

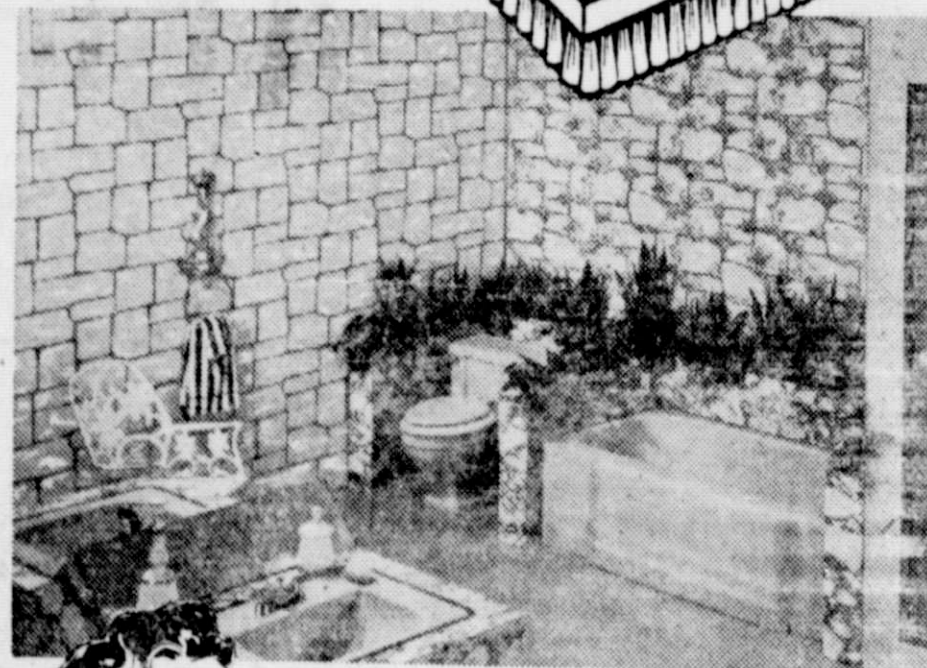

CATHOLIC CHARITIES
DRIVE ON TV, RADIO**

His Excellency, Archbishop Albert G. Meyer of Milwaukee, will make a direct and personal appeal in behalf of the poor and needy in the archdiocese and the St. Francis seminary building fund in a television address over WISN-TV (channel 12) on Saturday, Mar. 30, at 12 o'clock noon.

The archbishop's talk, which will be addressed to all Catholics in the ten counties of the Milwaukee archdiocese, will signal the opening of the annual Catholic Charities and Seminary Fund campaign to be conducted beginning Sunday, Mar. 31, and ending Apr. 14. This year's goal of the campaign is \$750,000.

The archbishop's address will be repeated on Sunday, Mar. 31, over

a number of state radio stations, including WBKV, West Bend; KFIZ, Fond du Lac; WHBL, Sheboygan, and WTKM, Hartford.

Around The Town

We can't understand why but we have had a number of requests lately from our subscribers to continue this column again. So here we go after a lapse of a few weeks. We will bring it to you whenever space and time permit to keep our vast army of readers satisfied.

Spring is here! The calendar says so, even though the weather maker didn't seem to know it a couple of times last week and this week when he covered us with snow. Last week's snowfall of five to six inches was the heaviest of the entire winter but it's all gone now and all signs indicate spring. Most of the robins have returned, flying geese and kites fill the air, roller skates go rattling past, marbles are everywhere underfoot, the ice has left the river, baseball bats are fanning the breeze, the kids are outdoors and moister than ever, most long underwear is hung away, the braves are heading north from spring training, village crews have swept and cleaned the streets, and there are many other sure signs.

They include an extra hour of daylight in the evening for sports, swimming, motoring, gardening, picnics, barbecues, etc., fewer accidents because of better visibility, less night hours for young people and reduced delinquency, lower electricity because of more sunlight, more convenient traveling, better schedule of radio and TV programs, great increase in consumption of farm products, benefit to retail outlets, and many others. Daylight saving time is good for you, your family, your health, your business, your community.

The village should also have a resolution on another question reading something like this: "Do the people of Kewaskum favor higher wash lines or a lower police chief?"

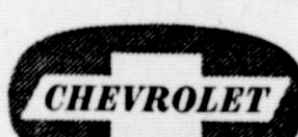

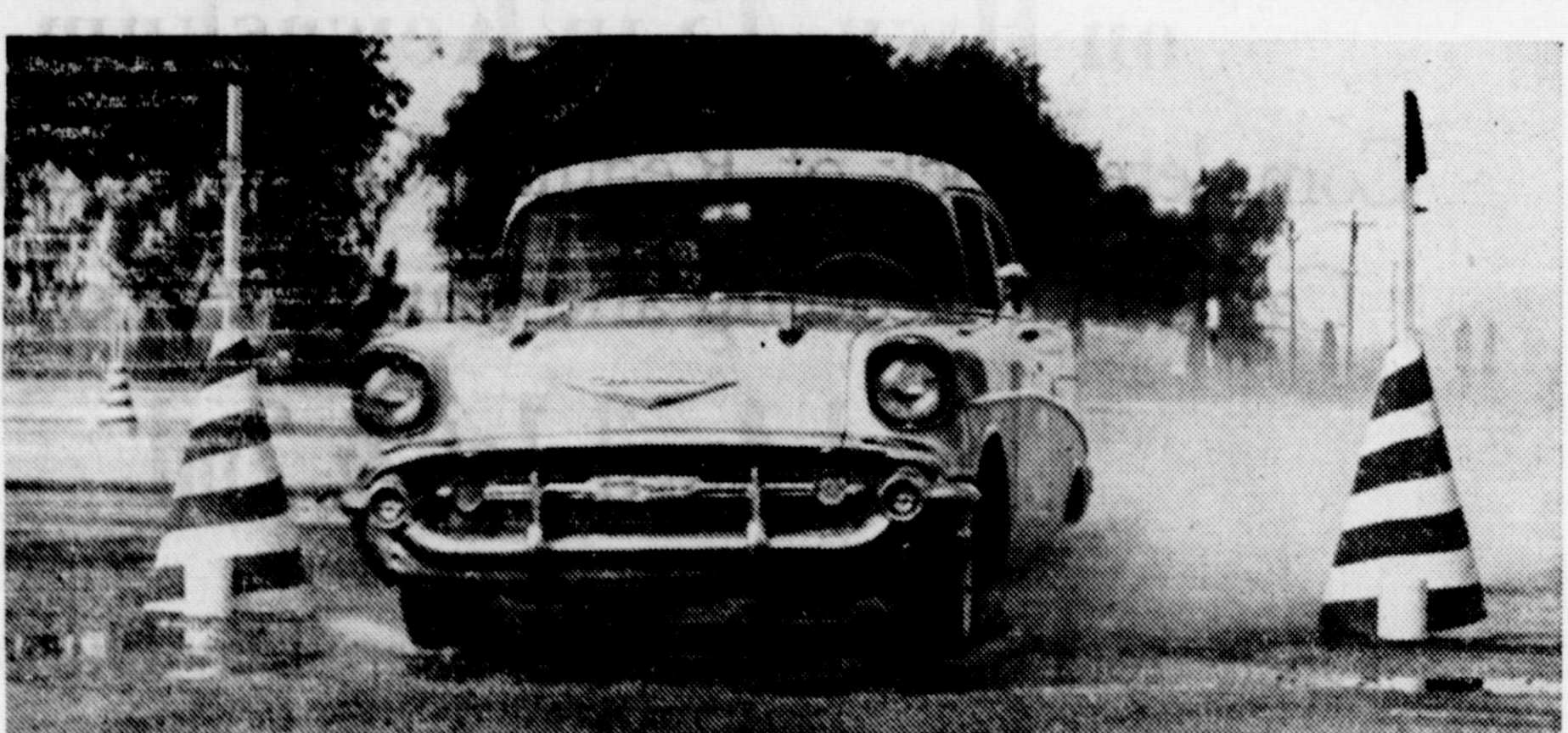

The tradition of buying chicks in early spring is falling by the wayside. Barry Hayes, University of Wisconsin poultry specialist, says advances in shipping and brooding techniques make it possible to get healthy chicks any time of the year.

Fertilize pastures this spring to lower feed costs and get higher net returns on beef and dairy cattle.

Nearly every lawn will profit by at least one application of fertilizer a year, says George Ziegler, University of Wisconsin landscape specialist. Apply fertilizer in Wisconsin before the lawn gets green this spring—in late March or early April. This prevents burning.
