Homecoming festivities will begin with a parade Thursday evening at 7:30 p. m. through the streets. The parade will wend its way to the high school grounds where a pep rally and bonfire will be held. Activities will be in charge of the pep club.

The king and queen will reign over festivities at the pep rally Thursday and also the homecoming dance Friday. Music for the dance will be furnished by the "Shades of Blue" orchestra from Milwaukee. Admission will be \$1.00 per couple and 60¢ for single admission.

Mrs. Herman Belger, 69, nee Laura L. Schnurr, of 4107 N. 46th st., Milwaukee, a resident of Kewaskum until 12 years ago, passed away on Sunday, Oct. 6.

A daughter of the late Henry and Catherine Schnurr, she was born in Kewaskum on April 14, 1898. She was reared here and attended the Kewaskum public schools. Her marriage to Mr. Belger took place on Jan. 28, 1911 in Kewaskum and the couple resided here until moving to Milwaukee about 12 years ago.

Surviving are her husband, a sister, Louella E. Schnurr of Kewaskum, an aunt, Mrs. Eda Colvin of West Bend and a wide circle of relatives and friends. An only son, Russell, preceded her in death two years ago, on Oct. 6, 1955.

Mrs. Belger was a member of the Immanuel Reformed church.

Funeral services were conducted on Wednesday, Oct. 9, at 3 p. m. from the Harder Funeral home, 4217 W. Fond du Lac ave., Milwaukee, the Rev. Henry Heimbuch officiating. Burial was in Pinelawn cemetery there.

Mrs. Elizabeth Schaefer, 93, widow of John W. Schaefer, a resident of Kewaskum most of her life, and one of the oldest residents of the community, died at the home of her son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Martin Knickel, at Campbellsport on Thursday, Oct. 3, following an illness of several weeks. She had made her home with the Knickels for the past 1 1/2 years.

Born July 7, 1864 in the town of Barton, her marriage to Mr. Schaefer took place on Dec. 22, 1883, at West Bend. Her husband predeceased her on Sept. 8, 1919. Mrs. Schaefer was the mother of five children, three of whom preceded her in death, namely Nettie (Mrs. Frank Strube), John F. and Arthur Schaefer. Surviving are a son and daughter, Albert of Milwaukee and Lazetta (Mrs. Knickel). 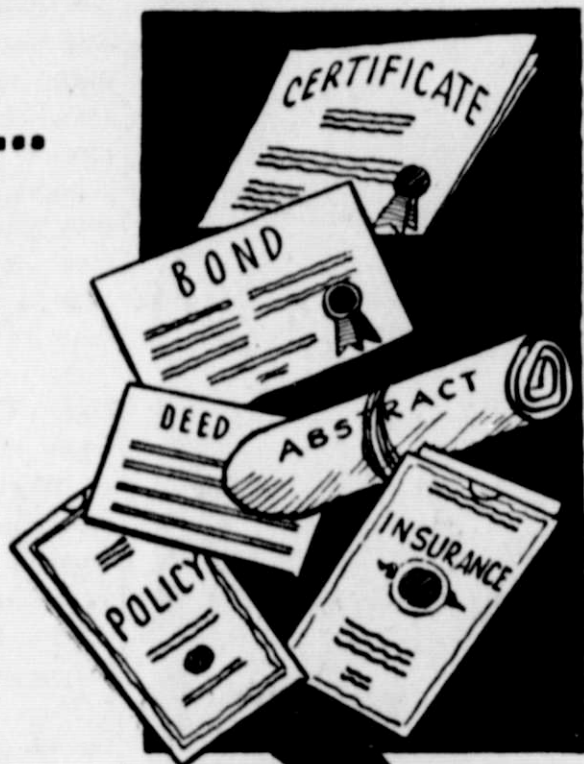

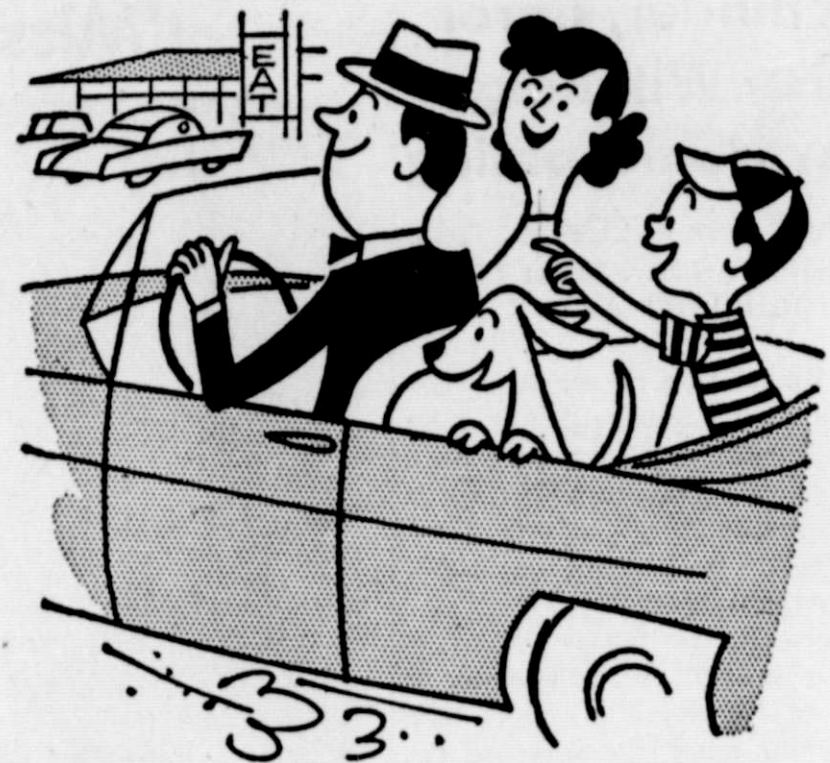

Indians Hand Oakfield 1st Loss in 26-0 Upset

PLAY FIRST 11-MAN GAME IN HOMECOMING TILT WITH BELLS FRIDAY NIGHT

The Kewaskum High school football team, which has shown improvement with every game to date, upset the previously unbeaten Oakfield squad here last Friday night by an impressive 26-0 score. The victory moved the Indians into a tie for second place with the Oaks in the Tri-County standings.

At the same time Brandon and North Fond du Lac, which teams were undefeated and tied for the lead, played a 6-6 tie to shuffle the loop standings. In another upset Lo-

mira shaded Campbellsport.

In handing the Oaks their first loss the Indians scored in the first quarter with Quarterback Jerry Opgenorth going over on a sneaker to make the score 6-0. The Indians missed the conversion attempt.

In the third period Kewaskum scored the first time from scrimmage when Halfback Mark Rodenkirch broke away on a spectacular 45 yard touchdown run. Again the Indians missed the extra point and the score stood at 12-0. A few minutes later Halfback Dan Binder scored on an end sweep and Opgenorth passed to End Tom Smith for the extra point to make the count 19-0.

Binder again scored in the fourth period on a 10-yard run, and Opgenorth passed to End Jerry Nigh for the conversion to make it 26-0.

Binder, Opgenorth and Rodenkirch were outstanding on offense for the victors. Linebackers Ervin Coulter and Butch Rodenkirch took honors for their defensive play.

This Friday night Kewaskum hosts Campbellsport in their homecoming game. This will be the first 11-man game for the two teams. The league, for the benefit of the smaller schools, plays 8-man football but the Indians, Bells and North Fondy will play 11-man ball when they meet each other. Campbellsport has won one and lost two so far.
