Mrs. Jennie Miller, Home Decorations Irvin Schulz, Mrs. For Holidays to Conrad Bier Dead Be Judged Monday

Mrs. Jennie Miller, 75, nee Hoenig, widow of the late Edward C. Miller, Kewaskum businessman, and a resident of the village for the past 50 years, passed away on Friday morning, Dec. 20, at St. Joseph's hospital, West Bend, following an illness of four weeks.

A daughter of the late Francis and Margaret Hoenig, she was born on April 12, 1882 at Menomonee Falls and moved to Shawano at an early age. Her marriage to Edward C. Miller took place on Nov. 26, 1907 in Kewaskum. He predeceased her in August of 1937.

Surviving are two sons, Charles F. Miller of Kewaskum, who operates Miller Studio and Electric, formerly operated by his late father, and Dr. E. Allen Miller of Watertown; four grandchildren, two daughters-in-law, one sister, Mrs. Elizabeth Bauerfeind of Shawano, and a brother, Frank Hoenig of Milwaukee.

The body was in state at Miller's funeral home after 3 p. m. Saturday. Funeral services were held at the funeral home at 1:30 o'clock Sunday afternoon and at the Valhalla cemetery chapel, Milwaukee, at 3:30 p. m. The Rev. C. F. Hammen, pastor of Peace E and R church, officiated.

IRVIN SCHULZ

Irvin Schulz, 57, town of Kewaskum farmer residing 1 1/4 miles southwest of the village, died at 3:30 a. m. Monday, Dec. 25, at St. Agnes hospital, Fond du Lac, following an illness of several years with a heart condition.

Mr. Schulz was vice-president of the Peace E and R church in Kewaskum for a number of years and was very active in church affairs. He was a school board member of the Schnurr School District for 15 years.

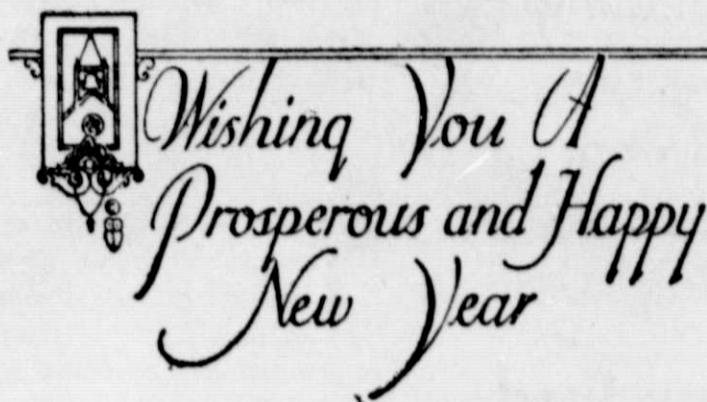

Indians Upset League Leading Bells, 52-38, Gain First Place Tie

The Kewaskum Indians pulled the upset of the young season in the Tri-County conference when they trounced previously unbeaten, league leading Campbellsport here Friday night by a decisive 52-38 margin. The surprise victory gained a first place tie for the Indians with the Bells and allowed two other teams, Oakfield and Rosendale, to slip into a four-way tie for the lead. Each has won 3 games and lost 1.

Kewaskum's win threw the conference race into a mad scramble and one of the hottest title races in years appears to be shaping up as the teams discontinued action until after the holidays. Loop play will be resumed on Jan. 10. In the meantime the Indians will play a non-conference game against Horicon of the Little Ten conference here on Jan. 7.

Going into Friday night's game up and coming Kewaskum was deadlocked for second place with four other teams while the Bells were at the top with a 3-0 slate. However, the Indians grabbed the lead from the start and owned a 12-5 advantage at the end of the quarter. The Bells outscored Kewaskum 12-9 in the second period to narrow the margin to 21-17 at halftime. In the second half the Indians outscored the Bells by a 31-21 margin, 16-9 in the third stanza and 15-12 in the final quarter, to win by 14 points.

The red hot Indians displayed a well balanced scoring attack. Jerry Oppenorth, the conference's top scorer, was good for 20 points, making 5 baskets and 10 free throws. Mark Rodenkirch was runnerup with 11 tallies, followed by Norm Rodenkirch with 9. Big scoring gun for the losers was Joe Dreikosen, who took top game honors with a 22-point outburst, more than half of his team's total. Pieper added 7 points as little scoring was done by Dreikosen's teammates.

Chevs Edge Hartford With Late Rally, 65-62; Take Undisputed Lead

WEST BEND TO PRESENT BIG
HURDLE IN GAME HERE
SUNDAY NIGHT

The Kewaskum Chevrolets had to come from behind with a rally in the closing minutes again here Sunday night to nose out Hartford, 65-62, in a close battle. In other contests Beaver Dam upset Horicon and Mayville dumped Cedarburg to give Kewaskum undisputed first place with a 4-1 record.

In every one of these four wins to date the Chevs trailed most of the game and had to roar back from behind in the final quarter to pull out a victory. Only once, at Horicon, it didn't work and they were defeated. Pulling a win out of the fire in the closing minutes provides a big thrill for the fans but is bound to backfire once in a while. Fans would feel a lot more at ease if the Chevs would turn on the steam earlier in the game.

Led by their lanky scoring ace, Del Renzaglia, Hartford led by 1 point, 10-9, at the quarter and by 2 points, 29-27, at halftime. They gained 1 more point and were on top by 3, 47-43, going into the final stanza. The visitors stayed ahead until the clock showed only a couple of minutes left when the Chevs staged their customary outburst to go ahead and cop by 3 points. It was a tight game all the way and pleased a good sized crowd.

Renzaglia took scoring honors in the game with 25 points, just 2 more than Kewaskum's John Tessar who paced his team with 23. Don Meisenheimer, who also played a fine rebounding game, took second honors for the winners with 14 points, while Frank Krueger and Augie Bligo each chipped in 11. Lorenzen shoved in 9 points for Hartford and Talaikowski and Fredrich added 8 apiece.

George Hanrahan, home on leave from the army, and Tom Peterson, Ohio State university student home for the holidays, donned uniforms for the Chevs and played part of the game. They will be available for 2 or 3 of the team's games.

Kewaskum has another big hurdle to clear this Sunday night in the first half race when it entertains the West Bend Lithias here. The Lithias are eliminated from the first half race but always prove troublesome, especially for the Chevs.
