Aliota Placed on Four Years Probation for Store Break-in Here

Frank Aliota, 28, members of a three-man Milwaukee gang who broke into the L. Rosenheimer department store in February of 1957 in an attempted burglary, was placed on probation for four years to the state welfare department in circuit court at West Bend last Friday morning. Aliota was the last member of the gang to face sentence.

The defendant was sentenced to four years in Waupun state prison by Circuit Judge William C. O'Connell, then, on the plea of the defense attorney and the agreement of Dist. Atty. Lee Gonring, he was placed on probation for four years.

Aliota was given the probation sentence after George Hartman, Sr. of Juneau, attorney for the defense, pointed out that his client has made every effort to avoid trouble by moving out of the downtown Milwaukee area and engaging in a fruit and vegetable business.

After imposing sentence, Judge O'Connell commended police officials and members of the sheriff's department and the district attorney for their splendid work in conjunction with the case and like offenses in Washington county.

West Bend Couple Hurt in Crash Here

Two persons were injured in a traffic accident Tuesday morning at the intersection of County Trunks G and S (Bauman's corner), 1½ miles northeast of Kewaskum and were removed by Kewaskum firemen's ambulance to St. Joseph's hospital, West Bend. They are Mr. and Mrs. Hubert R. Bielinski, R. 2, West Bend.

Traffic Officer Arthur J. Ambrosio of the Fond du Lac county police reported that Bielinski, driving a station wagon, turned from S onto G and collided with a tank-truck operated by Lawrence Mueller, 33, R. 4, Fond du Lac. Both vehicles came to a stop off the road east of the intersection.

Bielinski, 38, sustained five fractured ribs and possible other injuries and expected to be hospitalized several days. Mrs. Bielinski suffered a skull fracture and will be hospitalized indefinitely. She was in fair condition at the hospital Tuesday.

When questioned at the hospital, Bielinski told Officer Ambrosio he remembered nothing of the crash. He said he did not see any other vehicle when he made the turn. Mueller reported that Bielinski had driven the station wagon into the path of his truck and he was unable to stop to avert a collision. The left side of Bielinski's vehicle and the front section of the truck were damaged extensively.
