Chief Harry Schaefer New Vice President Of Badger Firemen

KEWASKUM AWARDED NEXT
ANNUAL MEETING OF
ASSOCIATION

Chiefs and delegates of 19 fire departments from Ozaukee, Washington, Waukesha, Milwaukee and Sheboygan counties attended the annual meeting of the Badger Firemen's association at Newburg on Sunday. There were 59 chiefs and delegates in attendance. Chief Harry J. Schaefer and Delegates Arnold Martin and Joe Schwind represented the Kewaskum department.

Chief Erwin Arndt of Random Lake was elected president of the association to succeed Chief Carl Peters of West Bend. Other officers elected include Chief Harry Schaefer of Kewaskum, vice-president, and Allen F. Bruederle of Cedarburg, re-elected secretary-treasurer.

A new constitution and by-laws, adopted at Sunday's meeting, limits the term of office of the president to two one year terms. Chief Peters, who completed his second term of office, was one of the advocates of the limitation on the terms for the president.

The Barton fire department was awarded the annual summer tournament in June, the Kewaskum fire department was awarded the next annual meeting next October, and the officers will decide the place of the spring meeting and banquet. Firemen of Slinger will be host to the annual bowling tournament of the association in January. The spring meeting of officers and delegates has tentatively been set for Grafton.

William Clark of Madison, supervisor of the Fire Service Training Department of the Wisconsin State Board of Vocational and Adult Education, talked on the Firemen's Training Program which is now available to all fire departments in the state.

Other subjects discussed were a uniform numbering system for rural areas, revision of the constitution and by-laws, and several other matters pertaining to fire fighting.

President Peters talked on Civil Defense and the part counties surrounding Milwaukee county will take in Civil Defense plans.

The meeting opened at 10 a. m. and adjourned at 3:30 p. m. A noon dinner was enjoyed at Holy Trinity church's fall festival.

Interest Mounting, See Heavy Vote at Election Tuesday

With candidates working hard in winding up their campaigns this week and the date for casting ballots approaching, interest in the general election next Tuesday, Nov. 4, is increasing as the time draws closer. As a result a large turnout at the polls is expected.

With an entire slate of officers up for election as well as a state senator and assemblyman, a U. S. senator and member of congress from the 6th district, plus an entire slate of county officers, voters are encouraged to go to the polls Tuesday in much greater numbers than at the primary election when a poor showing was made. Absentee ballots may be obtained up until the day prior to the election. Locally they can be obtained from the village commissioner at the municipal building.

Election polls in Kewaskum will be open from 9 a. m. to 6 p. m. and voting will be done in the municipal building. Town of Kewaskum voters will cast their ballots at the Labor Center in the village and polls will open at 9 a. m. and close at 5:30 p. m.

Indians Tip Bells 2nd Time, Can Share Title By Defeating Slinger

SPOIL CAMPBELLSPORT'S
HOMECOMING WITH 13-7
VICTORY IN RAIN

The Kewaskum Indians spoiled Campbellsport's homecoming Friday afternoon by besting the Bells for the second time this season, 13-7, in the rain and mud on a dark windy day. The Mitchellmen shaded the Bells, 7-6, in the first meeting here.

The victory kept Kewaskum's title hopes alive. With a 4-1 record on the season, they have clinched second place and can gain a tie for the championship by upsetting unbeaten, loop leading Slinger here in the season's finale Friday night. The Owls have won 5 straight and the Indians will have to play their best game of the season to upset them in this all-important, very crucial battle. In these two teams' first tangle at Slinger the Owls squeezed out a 14-6 win in a rugged battle. This is the big one fans have been looking forward to.

An early score in the first quarter gave Campbellsport's short-lived 7-0 lead in Kewaskum's only afternoon game of the campaign Friday. Scheid passed to Dick Kleinhans for a three-yard touchdown and Dick Thoma ran over the extra point.

Kewaskum countered in the second stanza as Glen Remmel rammed over from one yard out and Kon Sadownikow booted the placement to knot the score at 7-7. The tie remained until there were only two minutes in the contest left when Kewaskum intercepted a Campbellsport pass and the ball was carried to the five-yard line. Norm Rodenkireh tromped over from the one on the second play to make it 13-7. The try for extra point was missed.

In the other game played Friday Slinger downed North Fondy 27-6 to keep its clean record intact. Kewaskum will go all out to hand the Owls their first loss Friday night and gain a title tie. The boys should be up for this one. Campbellsport plays at North Fondy Friday.

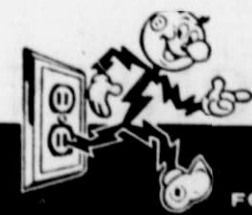

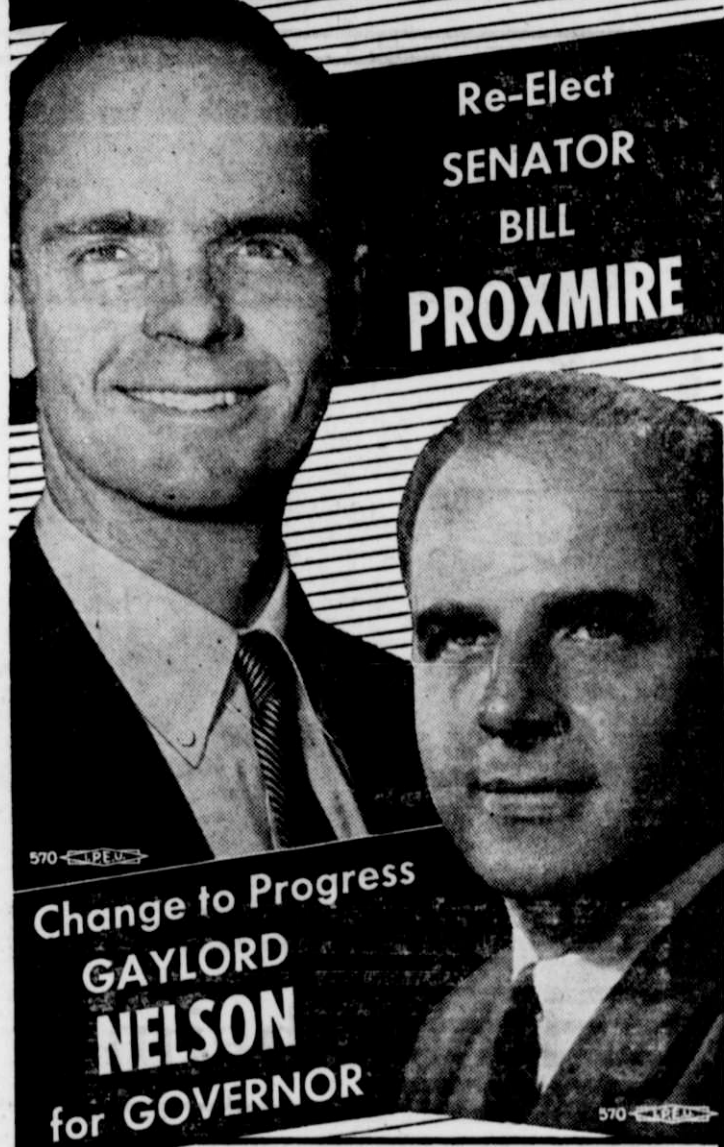

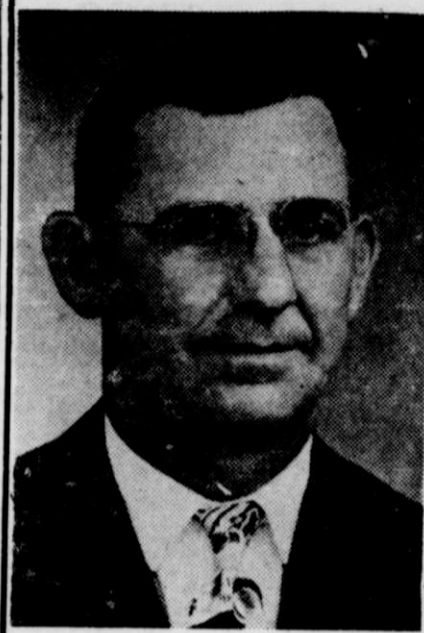
