Mrs. Wallace Geidel, 70, nee Agnes Schmidt, of 1603 Fond du Lac ave., Kewaskum, passed away unexpectedly of a heart attack at her home on Wednesday, Dec. 6. Mrs. Geidel was well known in the area.

She was born on April 13, 1891, in the town of Wayne, a daughter of the late Henry and Caroline Schmidt, and resided in that township until her marriage to Wallace Geidel on June 3, 1925, at Wayne. They made their home in Kewaskum for the past 35 years.

Surviving are her husband, one son, John Geidel, of Kewaskum; her daughter-in-law, Lavern; three sisters, Mrs. Martha Schroeder of Lomira and the Misses Lucy and Alice Schmidt of West Bend, and one brother, Henry Schmidt, of Milwaukee. Four sisters and one brother predeceased her.

The body was in state at Miller's Funeral home from 2 p. m. Thursday until 11 a. m. Friday and at Peace United Church of Christ from 12 o'clock noon until the time of services at 2 p. m. The Rev. C. F. Hammen officiated and interment was in the church cemetery.

## Ground Broken for New Telephone Co. Building



Ground was broken last week for the General Telephone Company of Wisconsin's new central office building in Kewaskum. The building will be located between Main and First sts. on land purchased from Mrs. Minnie Mertes.

In announcing details of the new building, Burger stated that construction is scheduled for completion in March. The \$11,000 building will be of brick and masonry construction. Modern in design, the new construction will measure twenty-seven feet by thirty-six feet, with an overhanging roof.

Installation of the dial equipment will begin immediately upon completion of the building. The new telephone center, when complete, will provide nearly 800 Kewaskum residents with dial service, according to Burger.

## Apprehend Young Man And 2 Juveniles for Assault on Local Youth

A young man from Sussex, 23, and his two juvenile companions from Milwaukee, both 17, were apprehended this week by Chief of Police Roland Pledl for a recent assault on an 18-year-old Kewaskum youth.

The assault took place at 7:50 p. m. on the night of Friday, Nov. 24, at the intersection of Main and Park View dr. in the village. The assault was committed on Robert Butzke, 18, of 1245 Rose-land dr., Kewaskum.

According to Chief Pledl, Butzke was driving his car north on Park View dr. when he halted for the stop sign at the intersection with Main st. As he did so a strange black convertible auto pulled to a stop directly in front of him, blocking his progress. The young man and his two companions in the convertible leaped out, pulled Butzke out of his car, forced him over the hood of the car and demanded his money while giving him a "going over." At the same time one of the juveniles broke a rear tail light on Butzke's auto with beer bottles before the trio apparently was scared off by other approaching motorists. As the incident occurred right on the main street, early on a Friday night, a busy one in the village, there were many people on the street at the time. The three, all of whom admitted they were intoxicated, then drove south out of the village on Hwy. 45.

Butzke said he did not recognize any of his assailants nor did he get the license number of the car, being in a state of shock. When questioned by Chief Pledl he said the only other demand made by the trio was to ask him where a certain baby sitter worked. The police then traced this baby sitter and through her got a lead as to the identity of the assailants.

A suspect, 17, of Milwaukee, was ordered to appear with the others who were with him at the municipal building here on Friday, Dec. 1, at 8 p. m. They failed to appear.

On Monday evening, Chief Pledl and Officer Marriner Frank went to Milwaukee and with the cooperation of police from that city, arrested the juvenile located and picked up his companions. One of them was another youth from Milwaukee, 17, and the other was John P. Andrews, 23, of R. 1, Sussex. They were arrested for battery on a state warrant issued by District Attorney Richard Becker of Washington county. Andrews will face trial next week and his two juvenile companions were referred to county juvenile authorities.

Hostesses for the afternoon will be Mrs. E. LaMarche, Mrs. H. L. Rumsey and Mrs. J. R. Tessar.

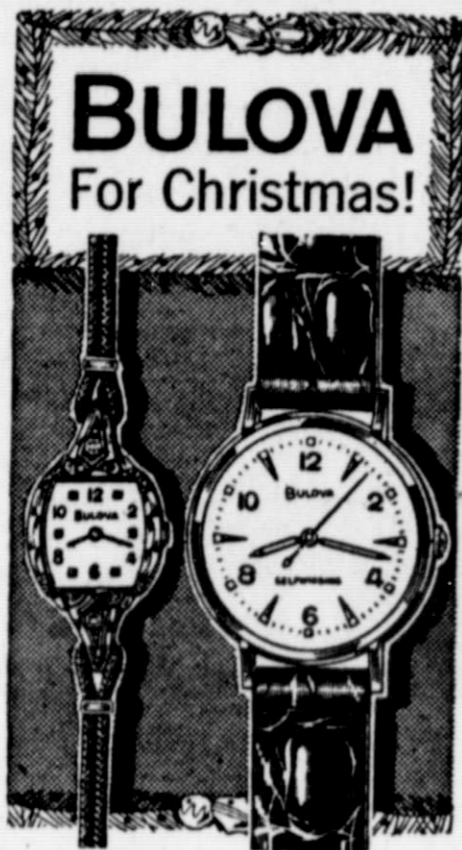

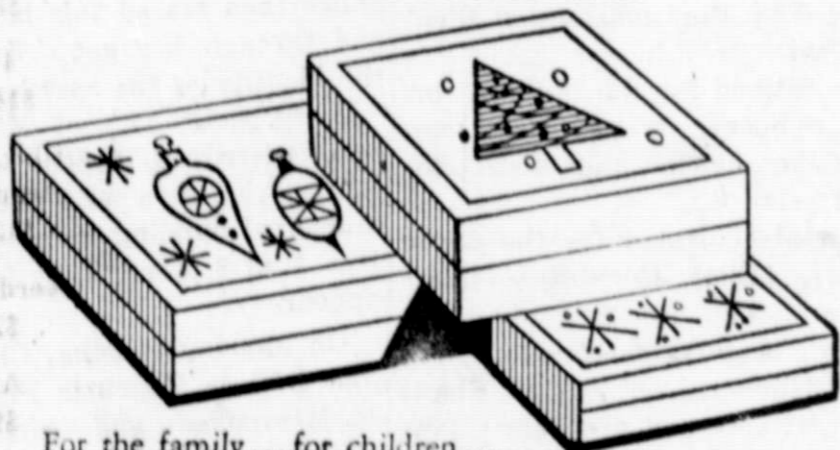

Horicon outscored the Chevs, 15-10 in the third quarter to narrow the gap to 52-47. In a close final stanza Kewaskum gained two points back to win by seven, 67-60.

Top scorer was Tom Larson of the winners with 21 points scored on 8 baskets and 5 charity tosses. Next in line for the Chevs were Don Meisenheimer with 13 points and Al Tennes with 11. High point men for Horicon were J. Wrucke with 15 and F. Marks with 14. The losers outpointed Ke-

waskum from the free throw line, 20-17.

This Saturday night Manager Leroy Bier will take his team on the road for the first time, traveling to Mayville in quest of their third straight win. Mayville lost the first two games, both by close margins, but is represented by a good team which can be troublesome to any club.
