# Chevs Win First, **Beat Beaver Dam** Easily, 103 to 77

After four straight setbacks in the Land o' Lakes league, all of them by very close margins, the Kewaskum Chevrolets hit their peak here Saturday night with a resounding, one-sided 103-77 triumph over Beaver Dam. The defeat was the fourth in a row for the Beavers and dropped them into sole possession of the cellar. Only a couple of years ago at this time, Beaver Dam and Kewaskum were battling it out for first place. Now the same teams battled to get out of last place.

The Chevs had an easy time of it in blasting the visitors. Paced by big Don Meisenheimer with 11 points in the opening quarter, Kewaskum took a commanding 28-10 lead and remained well ahead. At the intermission they held a 53-37 advantage and led at the end of the third period by 22 points, 75-53. A 28 point splurge in the final quarter brought the final count to 103-77. This was by far the biggest point output by the Chevs this season.

Despite his team's loss, Power of Beaver Dam was the scoring star of the contest. He dropped in 15 field goals and 7 free throws to set a torrid pace and walk away with scoring honors with a total of 37 points. He scored al most half of his team's points in running up one of the highest totals of the season. Gosy chipped in 19 points and Peterson 16. 


