Chevs Win First, Beat Beaver Dam Easily, 103 to 77

After four straight setbacks in the Land o' Lakes league, all of them by very close margins, the Kewaskum Chevrolets hit their peak here Saturday night with a resounding, one-sided 103-77 triumph over Beaver Dam. The defeat was the fourth in a row for the Beavers and dropped them into sole possession of the cellar. Only a couple of years ago at this time, Beaver Dam and Kewaskum were battling it out for first place. Now the same teams battled to get out of last place.

The Chevs had an easy time of it in blasting the visitors. Paced by big Don Meisenheimer with 11 points in the opening quarter, Kewaskum took a commanding 28-10 lead and remained well ahead. At the intermission they held a 53-37 advantage and led at the end of the third period by 22 points, 75-53. A 28 point splurge in the final quarter brought the final count to 103-77. This was by far the biggest point output by the Chevs this season.

Despite his team's loss, Power of Beaver Dam was the scoring star of the contest. He dropped in 15 field goals and 7 free throws to set a torrid pace and walk away with scoring honors with a total of 37 points. He scored almost half of his team's points in running up one of the highest totals of the season. Gosy chipped in 19 points and Peterson 16. Kewaskum's scoring was divided among all 10 players with Meisenheimer and Al Tennes leading the way with 21 and 20 points respectively.

The Chevs made 47 field goals to only 30 for the visitors. But Beaver Dam sank 18 free throws, while Kewaskum made only 8 out of 19. The victors lost two men on personal fouls.

This Saturday night Kewaskum entertains Mayville in another home tilt. Mayville has been coming along strong and now holds third place in the standings.

Indians Defeat North Fondy for Third Straight

Tail end North Fondy gave unbeaten Kewaskum a scare last Friday night before the Indians pulled away in the final three minutes for a 76-69 victory. The win was the third straight in the Scenic Moraine conference without a setback and gives Kewaskum an overall record of 5-1 thus far.

North Fondy, trailing 51-49 entering the fourth quarter here, tied the score with three minutes remaining only to have the Indians bolt away to a 12-point lead. The Orioles then cut the margin to five points before finally losing by seven points. Kewaskum led at the quarter, 12-9, and at halftime, 33-31.

For North Fondy, Rich Groeschel set the pace with 31 points, his best production by far this season, to cop scoring honors. He had 13 field goals and five free throws. Rod Kresal chipped in with 13 points as the Orioles played their best game of the season against Kewaskum.

For Kewaskum, Mike Coulter led with 21 points, Bob Rossow added 14 and Dan Survis had 13 points. The Indians made good on 20 free throws as compared to 13 for the visitors, who suffered their fourth straight defeat.

In other games first place Grafton made its record 4-0 with another easy triumph, beating Campbellsport, 86-60; Random Lake took over third place with a 76-57 victory over Pewaukee and Slinger moved into a tie for fourth place with Pewaukee by downing Germantown, 68-57.

The Indians are now enjoying a holiday rest before returning to action on Jan. 7 with a non-conference game at Lomira. The next conference game will be with Washington High of Germantown on Jan. 10.

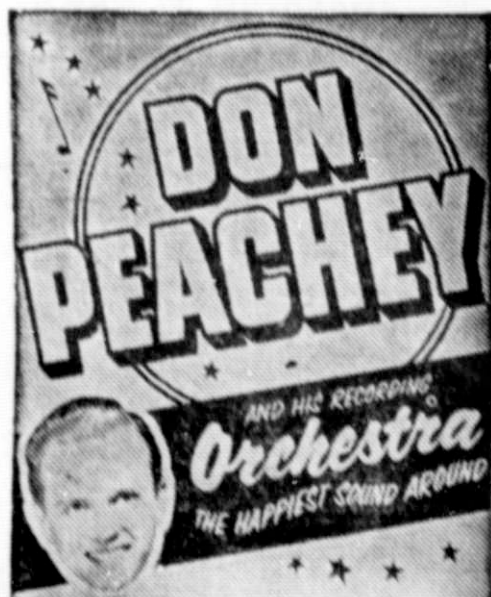
