Village Board Sets Tax Rate Of \$33 Per Thousand for Year

RATE UP \$1.00; WAGES OF VILLAGE EMPLOYEES SET, RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED

Regular Meeting
December 7, 1964

The Village Board of Kewaskum, Washington County, Wisconsin, met in regular monthly session with President Tassar presiding and all Board members present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as presented upon motion by Trustee Wietor, seconded by Trustee Kral and duly carried.

The first order of business was the public hearing on the proposed budget for 1965. There were no appearances at the meeting. Since there were no objections to the budget as presented and published, the budget hearing was declared closed.

Mr. Ted Meilahn and Mr. Al. Zehren met with the Board to ask questions regarding the possible annexation of certain lands owned by them.

ORDINANCE NO. 64-1
AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL AND RECREATE SECTION 11.01 (6) OF ORDINANCE NO. 54-1 RELATING TO THE REGULATION OF INTOXICATING LIQUORS AND FERMENTED MALT BEVERAGES

The Village Board of the Village of Kewaskum do ordain as follows:

That Section 11.01 (6) of Ordinance No. 54-1 is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows:

Retail Class "B" Intoxicating Liquor License Fee: A Retail Class "B" Liquor License when issued by the Village Commissioner under authority of the Village Board shall permit its holder to sell, deal and traffic in liquors to be consumed on the premises so licensed only, and in the original packages or containers, in multiples not to exceed one gallon at any one time, and to be consumed off the premises so licensed. Wine may be sold in original packages or otherwise, in any quantity to be consumed off the premises. The fee for such retail Class "B" Liquor License shall be \$125.00 per year.

Ordinance No. 64-1 introduced by Trustee Wietor and its adoption moved by Trustee Merwin and seconded by Trustee Hirsig.

Grant National Honor Society Charter to KHS

WILL ENABLE SCHOOL TO GIVE RECOGNITION TO OUTSTANDING STUDENTS

Kewaskum Community High School has been granted Charter 12048 of the National Honor Society. Becoming part of this outstanding organization will enable the faculty to give recognition to outstanding students in the school and provide it with another way to stimulate and encourage excellence.

The National Honor Society aims to stimulate scholarship and constructive, responsible work. However, scholarship is only one of the qualifications. PUBLIC HEARING DATE TO RAISE LOCAL RATES SET

A Public Service Commission of Wisconsin notice sent to the Statesman this week stated that the General Telephone Company of Wisconsin, Madison, on Dec. 9, 1964, filed an application with the commission for authority under section 196.20 of the statutes to increase rates at the General Telephone Co. exchange in the village of Kewaskum and adjacent areas after the establishment of extended-area service to the West Bend exchange of the Wisconsin Telephone Co., Milwaukee, about March 19, 1965.

The application states that a substantial majority of Kewaskum customers have agreed to the proposed rate increase with provision of the extended-area service. Kewaskum is now in the D-4 rate band and would be placed in the D-2 rate band.

The Public Service Commission will investigate such application and will hold public hearing in Room 404, Hill Farms State Office building, 4802 Sheboygan ave., Madison, on Jan. 6, 1965, at 10:00 a. m.

The notice further states that the Commission deems it necessary in order to carry out its duties herein to investigate the books, accounts, practices and activities of the General Telephone Company of Wisconsin and deems that it may be necessary to make an appraisal of the property and that the expenses incurred or to be incurred by the Commission which are reasonably attributable to such investigation and appraisal will be assessed against and collected from the General Telephone Co. of Wisconsin in accordance with the provisions of section 196.85, Wisconsin statutes, and chapter PSC 5, Wisconsin Administrative Code.

The extended-area coverage would provide toll-free service from the General Telephone Co. subscribers in the Kewaskum area to the West Bend exchange of the Wisconsin Telephone Co., Milwaukee.

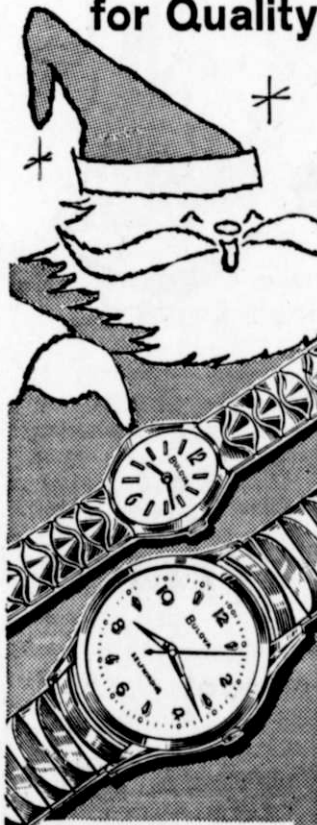

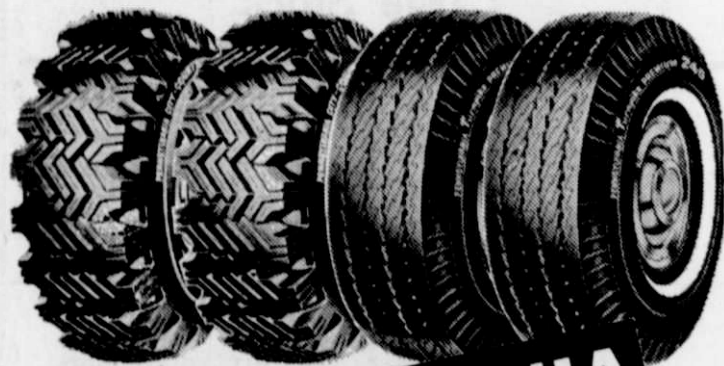
