## SPECIAL! Site for New Kewaskum Post Office Building Is Selected

## A. G. Koch Property Dr. Wesenberg **On Main St. Chosen** For New Structure

#### TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS ON BUILDING IN NEAR FUTURE

(Special to the Statesman) WASHINGTON, D. C., DEC. 13-Congressman John A. Race announced today in a telephone call to the Statesman from Washington, D. C. that the post office department has selected 341-347 Main st. as the new site for the

Kewaskum post office. According to Race, the prelimintary plans call for 3.081 square feet of working space in the post office with a platform of 308 square feet and parking area of 4,500 square feet. The Fond du Lac Democrat says that the selection of the site advances the new building closer to the construction stage.

"This project is in accordance with post office policy of building new post offices where they are urgently needed," Race said. The post office is constantly reassessing construction programs to determine whether or not present buildings can be altered or remodeled to take care of extending mail volume. Congressman Race explained that the post office department's capital investment is limited substantially to postal equipment. The building will remain under private ownership with the owner paying local real estate taxes. Bids for the new building are expected to be advertised for in the near future.

(Editor's note - The 341-347 Main st. site is located on the A. G. Koch property, west of the Koch store. The lot occupies the building presently housing Jae ger's Sewing Machine and Vacuum Cleaner Service Center and adjoining land to the west and rear of the building. Several other sites had been considered for the new post office building).
