### Site for New Kewaskum Post Office Building Is Selected

#### A. G. Koch Property On Main St. Chosen For New Structure

##### TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS ON BUILDING IN NEAR FUTURE

(Special to the Statesman)

WASHINGTON, D. C., DEC. 13—Congressman John A. Race announced today in a telephone call to the Statesman from Washington, D. C. that the post office department has selected 341-347 Main st. as the new site for the Kewaskum post office.

According to Race, the preliminary plans call for 3,081 square feet of working space in the post office with a platform of 308 square feet and parking area of 4,500 square feet. The Fond du Lac Democrat says that the selection of the site advances the new building closer to the construction stage.

"This project is in accordance with post office policy of building new post offices where they are urgently needed," Race said. The post office is constantly reassessing construction programs to determine whether or not present buildings can be altered or remodeled to take care of extending mail volume. Congressman Race explained that the post office department's capital investment is limited substantially to postal equipment. The building will remain under private ownership with the owner paying local real estate taxes. Bids for the new building are expected to be advertised for in the near future.

(Editor's note — The 341-347 Main st. site is located on the A. G. Koch property, west of the Koch store. The lot occupies the building presently housing Jaeger's Sewing Machine and Vacuum Cleaner Service Center and adjoining land to the west and rear of the building. Several other sites had been considered for the new post office building.)

#### Harry Krueger Wins FFA Corn Growing Honors

Don Ganske, Beaver Dam; Kevin Fligel, Beaver Dam, and Harry Krueger, Kewaskum, made the three highest corn yields in this FFA section of the state with yields of 228.8, 182.7 and 179.1 bushels per acre.

These yields were made under the supervision of their vocational agriculture teacher at their high school. At the time the corn was weighed, shelled corn samples were also taken and a moisture test was made and the yield figured on the basis of No. 2 corn with 15% moisture.

Don made his highest yield of 228.8 bushels per acre with Pioneer 368A, Kevin made his highest yield of 182.7 bushels per acre with Pioneer 368A and Harry Krueger made his highest yield of 179.1 bushels per acre with Pioneer 381A.

This FFA section No. 5 includes the counties of Green, Dodge, Dane, Racine, Rock, Walworth, Jefferson, Washington, Waukesha, Ozaukee, Milwaukee, and Kenosha. There were 34 high schools and 545 boys entered in the corn growing contest this year in this FFA section.

All vocational agriculture students are eligible to enter this corn growing contest and free seed corn is supplied to all students who enter. Cash awards of \$25, \$15 and \$5 are given to the three students obtaining the highest yield in each FFA section of the state.

In the state there were 3,017 boys entered in the contest this year from 161 high schools. State winner also was Don Ganske at the Beaver Dam High school in Dodge county who produced 228.8 bushels per acre with Pioneer 368A. He received a fine wrist watch in addition to the \$25 cash award for highest yield in his FFA section and a beautiful golden ear trophy was awarded to the agriculture department for having the state FFA corn growing champion for 1965.

Other boys obtaining the highest corn yields in this FFA section were: 4. Thomas James, Delavan, 171.8; 5. Kent Ganske, Beaver Dam, 165.6; 6. Dick Langer, Ft. Atkinson, 160.5; 7. Dennis Duesterbeck, Delavan, 158.7; 8. Darrel Logterman, Delavan, 156.0; 9. Dean Logterman, Delavan, 151.0; 10. Robert Kellesvig, Mt. Horeb, and Ron Oesterbeck, Delavan, 149.7 and 149.4.

Here is Krueger's own story of how he produced his exceptionally high corn yield:

"The field had corn on it the year before. We fall plowed and disked in the spring.

The corn was planted on May 12 with a 22,000 plant population. We also side-dressed the corn with 250 pounds of 12-24-24.

Atrazine was applied at the rate of 1½ pounds per acre.

The samples were taken the first part of November and the corn was picked Nov. 27."

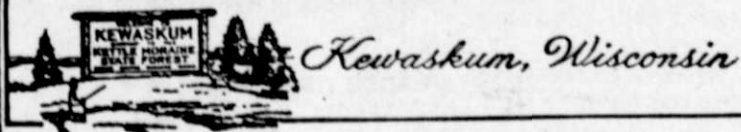

As of Dec. 9, 1965 the deer harvest state-wide was 98,786, and for the 17 counties that comprise the east central area, described as follows: from Waupaca county east to Door, south thru Ozaukee and

west thru Dodge it was 15,071 of which 3,198 were party permits. Ozaukee county killed about 30 animals, Washington 231, Dodge 800 and Fond du Lac 1,200.

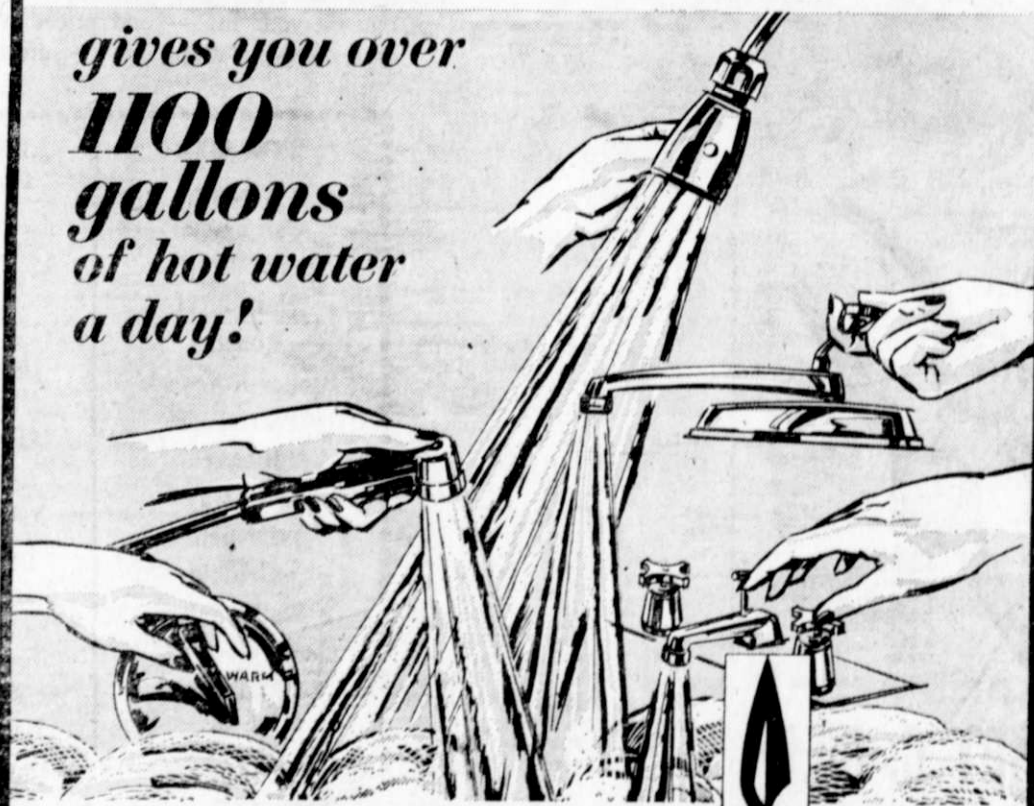

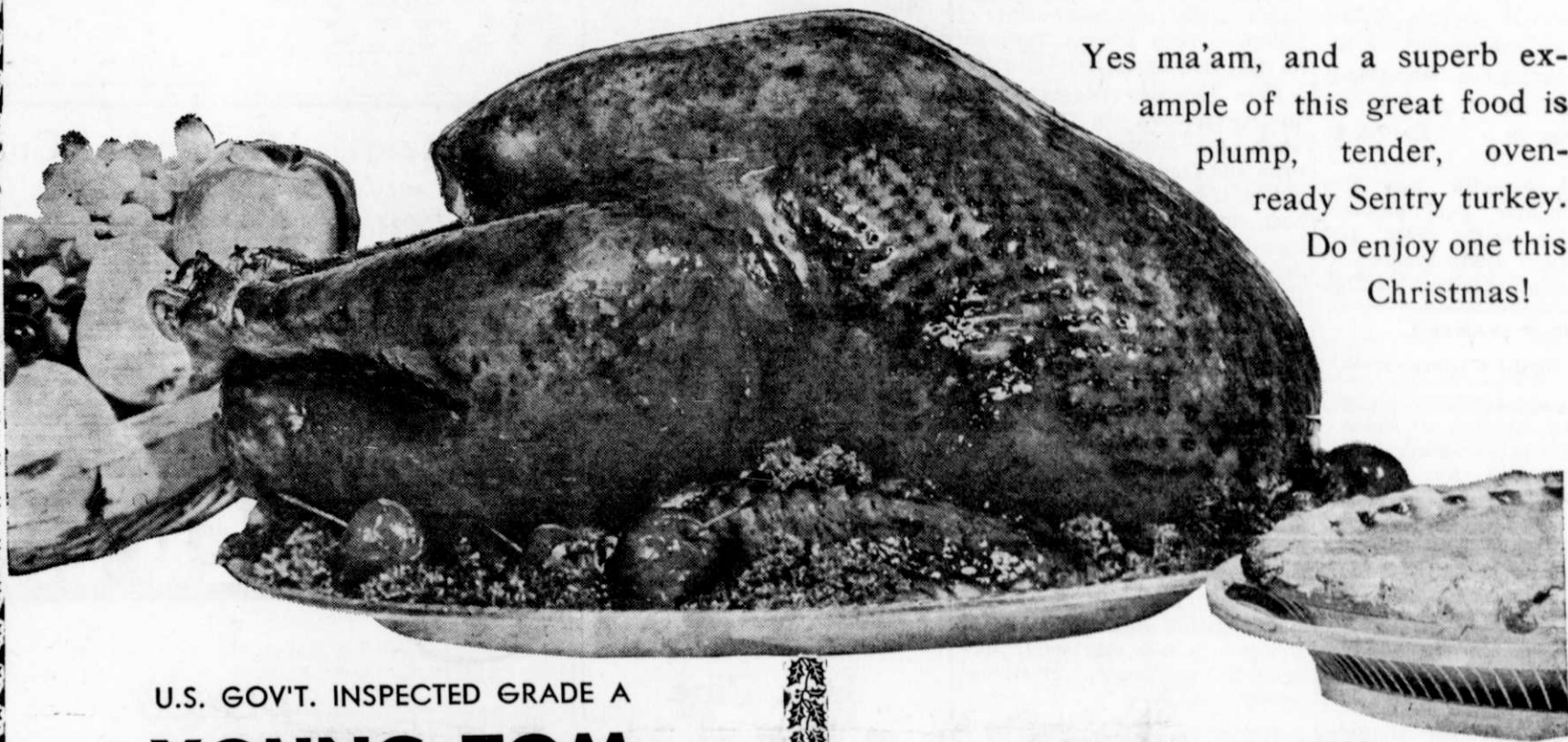

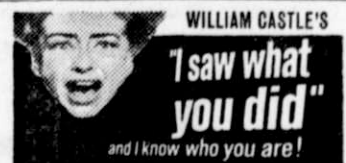

### Indians Tip North Fondy, Germantown

**RUN STREAK TO 3 IN ROW, MOVE INTO 1ST PLACE TIE**

Now there are only two! Kewaskum and Grafton remained the only undefeated teams in the Scenic Moraine conference after Tuesday night play. The Indians knocked off previously unbeaten Germantown there, 85-76, pushing them out of a first place tie. Last Friday at home, Kewaskum shaded a good North Fondy team, 71-67, which was also the Orioles' first defeat. Grafton and Kewaskum share the lead with 3-0 records.

The North Fondy-Kewaskum battle was a real barn-burner Friday, as the Indians cut short a determined threat by the invading Orioles. North Fondy missed connections on 11 of 20 free throw attempts and this erased a 29-28 edge from the field, with Kewaskum enjoying the edge at the foul lines, 15-9.

The Orioles trailed by a single point, 17-16, at the quarter but outpointed the home team in the second stanza, 21-18, to take a 37-35 halftime advantage. The Indians came back strong in the

third period with an 18-13 advantage to regain the lead at 53-50 and added one more to their lead in the final quarter to win by four points. North Fondy closed to within a point of the Indians in the last quarter before the margin opened up again.

Larry Coulter scored 17 points for the winners, Ed Czaja sniped away for 15, Dick Wietor and Mike Miller contributed 12 apiece and Bob Coulter added 11. Steve Groeschel topped the Orioles with 16, trailed by Dumbaskas with 15. Groeschel, who bombed home 36 points a week before against Slinger, was fairly well boxed by the Indians and eventually fouled out of the game.

Playing its first Scenic contest away Tuesday, Kewaskum gave Germantown a taste of defeat for the first time with a 9-point 85-76 victory. A good first half paved the way for the Indians win. Kewaskum outscored the Warhawks by a big margin, 21-13, in the first period and 24-21 in the second quarter to take a comfortable 45-34 lead. Germantown had the best of it in the third stanza, 20-18, but the Indians still held a 63-54 margin and then counter-attacked with a rash of free throws that trimmed the margin to four points at one time. The Indians

converted 29 of 41 tosses at the charity stripe to salt away their third victory.

Larry Coulter, who has been coming along fast as a scoring threat in the last two games, again led Coach Lindy DeNamur's squad with 21 points, 13 of them coming on free throws. All five Kewaskum starters scored 13 points or better. Wietor made 13, Bob Coulter 19, Bill Backhaus 15 and Czaja 13. Germantown's one-two punch of Don Youse and Gordy Swinehart accounted for 24 and 23 points respectively.

This Friday night the Indians host Pewaukee in the last game until after the holidays. Pewaukee has a 2-1 record and is strong with its two ace scorers, Klewein and Schaefer.
