Forty-four merchants and businessmen are taking an active part in this year's Krazy Daze and many of them will have sidewalk displays on the streets for the convenience of shoppers and many outstanding bargains are promised by them.

Bargains will include odd lots, leftovers, white elephants and many real honest to goodness discounts on stock items. There will also be numerous crazy bargains, as well as plenty of food, refreshments, music, dancing and fun for everyone. You can save money by taking advanage of the hundreds of bargains offered.






