Krazy Daze Tuesday, Aug. 1, to Feature Bargains, Food and Fun

44 Businessmen To Participate

CHURCHES TO HAVE STANDS; 3 ORCHESTRAS TO PLAY ON STREETS; OPEN AIR DANCING

The annual Krazy Daze event sponsored by the Kewaskum Business association is all set for Tuesday, Aug. 1 from 9 a. m. to 9 p. m. and merchants, businessmen and residents throughout the village are completing plans to make this year's sale and celebration the biggest and best ever.

Forty-four merchants and businessmen are taking an active part in this year's Krazy Daze and many of them will have sidewalk displays on the streets for the convenience of shoppers and many outstanding bargains are promised by them.

Bargains will include odd lots, leftovers, white elephants and many real honest to goodness discounts on stock items. There will also be numerous crazy bargains, as well as plenty of food, refreshments, music, dancing and fun for everyone. You can save money by taking advantage of the hundreds of bargains offered.

At least five food and refreshment stands will be operating on the streets. Yoost Market will again send out the appetizing aroma of frying brats and hamburgers at the intersection and right across the street the Glacier Inn will be serving those delicious hot beef sandwiches again. Down the street a couple of blocks on Fond du Lac ave. at Ollie's Texaco and The Wigwam tasty brats and hamburgers will also be ready on the grill. The local churches will also join in this year with refreshment stands. Peace United Church of Christ will have a stand at the intersection and the Ladies' Guild will serve soda, milk and ice cream bars. Holy Trinity church will operate a stand on the church grounds and the ladies will offer corn on the cob (possibly), ham sandwiches, old fashioned ice cream cones, cake and coffee, religious and mission project items.

In the evening there will be live music on the streets by three orchestras. The Dale Matthies Combo will play at the intersection, Ed Schneider's orchestra will furnish music further east on Main st. and the Red Coats, an 8-piece youth band from West Bend, sponsored by The Wigwam and Ollie's Texaco will pour out music from 7 p. m. to 12 midnight for street dancing on The Wigwam parking lot. They will also have picnic tables outdoors.

Burglary, Larceny And Vandalism in Village Reported

Three recent misdemeanors in the village which included a burglary, larceny and vandalism were reported by Chief of Police Roland Pledl.

The burglary took place at the Fair Variety store at 135 Main st. on a Wednesday night. Sometime between the hours of 5:30 p. m. and 8 a. m. someone entered the store by forcing a rear door. Taken in the burglary was \$4.50 in cash, all in quarters, and from 8 to 12 friendship rings removed from a rack near the cash register. The rings were valued at \$1.00 each.

Police investigated two juveniles and have other leads in the case. The juveniles were reported to have had friendship rings in their possession. Both juveniles denied the burglary and having any of the rings.

Sometime during the night of Friday, July 14, and Saturday, July 15, a new spare tire was stolen from a station wagon owned by Howard Rumsey which was parked in front of his home at 1554 Fond du Lac ave. Rumsey reported the larceny to Chief Pledl.

During the night of Friday, July 14, one or a group of vandals broke eight windows on the south side of the sewage lift station at the swimming beach. Large stones were found on the inside of the building and the vandalism was reported to Chief Pledl the next morning by Marvin Schaefer, a village employee.

The next morning Chief Pledl interviewed neighbors in the area, one of whom said she heard teenagers swimming at the beach and that they were noisy and talked very loud. This was at about 10:45 p. m. Chief Pledl was of the opinion that it was a group of teenagers who had been drinking and possibly some of the youths who had been arrested at the firemen's picnic who committed the vandalism in retaliation.

Police would appreciate it if they are notified immediately when these incidents occur and are witnessed by anyone.

Re-Elect Harry Oelhafen, Zona Miske to Board

219 VOTES ARE CAST; 120 ATTEND MEETING

Electors approved a \$1,137,065.64 budget at the annual meeting of Kewaskum Community Schools, Joint District No. 2, held Monday evening. There is an increase in the school budget but the equalized tax levy decreased slightly. The equalized tax levy will be \$19.71 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation as compared with last year's \$19.82. The district school board voted to transport students living in the district to parochial or private schools within the district, which will cost an estimated \$25,000, involving the use of five or six more busses. Close to 300 students will be affected. About 120 persons attended the meeting.

In the election held on the day of the annual meeting, from 1 to 8 p. m., incumbents Mrs. Zona Miske and Harry Oelhafen of the township of Wayne were re-elected to the positions on the board of education, each for a three year term. Of the 219 votes cast in a field of five candidates, the results were as follows:

The budget figures, with last year's corresponding actual expenses in parenthesis, are as follows:

Administrative expenses, \$40,670 (\$39,947.92); instructional costs, \$633,846.84 (\$501,208.06); pupil transportation, \$123,400 (\$88,684.95); operation of plant, \$87,099.75 (\$82,322.78); maintenance, \$15,175 (\$12,840.71); fixed charges, \$36,722 (\$32,102.34); food services, \$5,800 (\$5,510.61); student body activities, \$8,000 (\$6,630.74); outgoing transfer accounts, \$1,000 (none last year); debt services, \$123,202.05 (\$177,731.21); capital outlay, \$60,850 (\$64,354.62); and community services, \$1,300 (\$400).

Receipts are estimated at \$292,392.83, with levy for operating expenses set for \$721,470.76, representing a mill rate of .001971 compared to .001982 last year.

A resolution was passed setting the school year at 192 days. School will open Aug. 25. Some electors expressed objection to opening school before Labor Day. A motion advising the board to consider starting school after Labor Day in the 1968-69 school year was rejected by a vote of 78 to 24.

A proposal to provide all children, kindergarten through sixth grade, with a free half-pint of milk at the morning milk break was rejected 74 to 21. Milk is now provided at a cost to the student of one cent per day.

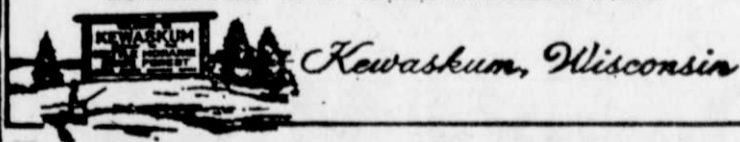

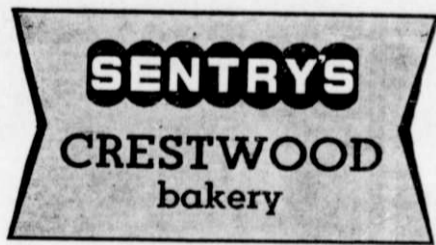

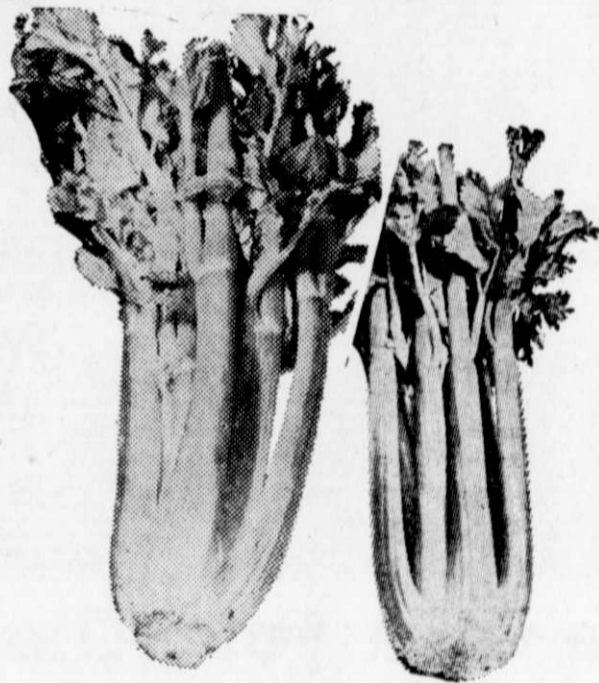
