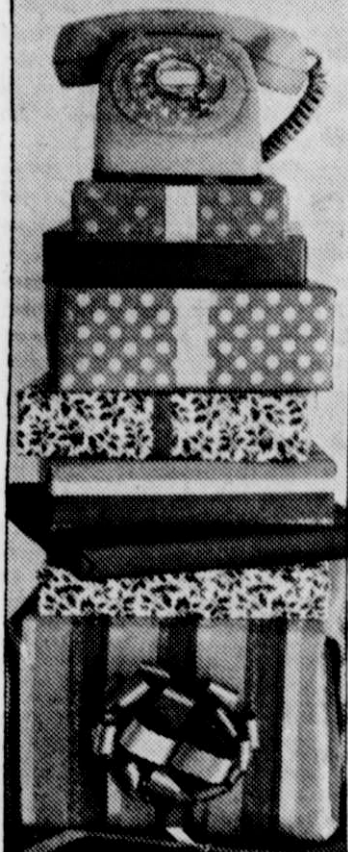

He tossed in 17 points for Coach Lindy DeNamur's Indians, while teammates Mike Smith and Marv Tancke contributed 15 and 13 respectively. Top scorer in the game, however, was the Rams' Lied, who swished in 20 points,

while Stevens added 16.

The Indians led throughout the contest, 15-10, at the quarter, 30-27 at halftime, and 46-35 at the third period's end. The Rams bested Kewaskum from the free throw line, 19-15, but fell behind in field goals, 27-19.

In other games Friday North Fondy knocked Pewaukee out of a first place tie, 67-54, Germantown downed winless Campbell-sport, 71-59, and Slinger blasted Random Lake, 102-57. In other games Tuesday North Fondy ran its streak to 4 straight by edging Grafton, 68-65. Slinger beat Campbell-sport, 82-72, and Pewaukee breezed past Germantown, 71-46.

The Indians will now be idle until after the holidays. The next tilt will be a non-conference one with Lomira here on Jan. 3 before resuming loop action here Jan. 5 with Slinger.

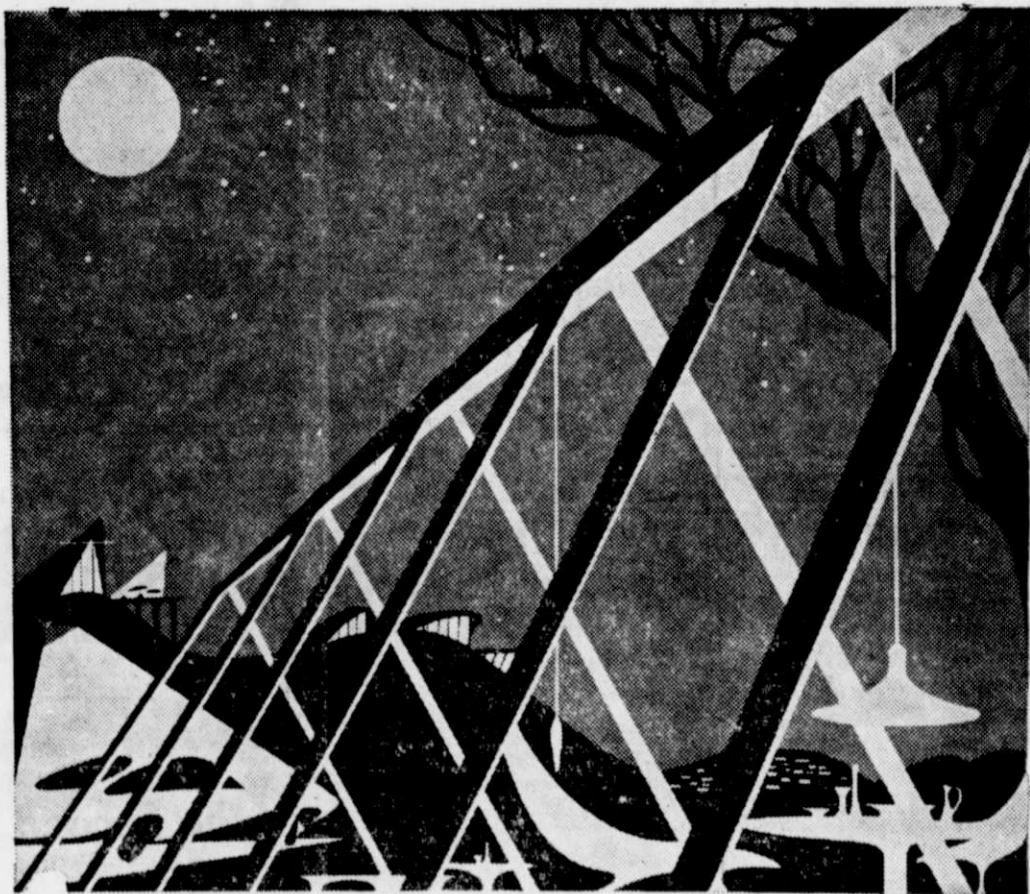
