Blood Bank Slated Mar. 28 At Kewaskum High School

**NEW DONORS ARE NEEDED;
SPEEDY ACTION REQUIRED**

Kewaskum and Washington county residents will have their opportunity in 1968 to support the Community Blood Donor club, Thursday, March 28.

A Milwaukee Blood Center mobile unit, assisted by the West Bend Community Blood Donor club, will take donations of blood at the Kewaskum High school between 12 noon and 5:30 p. m.

Because of the short notice, Mrs. Robert Zarling, local chairman, urges all donors to call 626-2264 to reserve a donor time. Even if you are unable to select a specific time, please call so that your donor record will be at the clinic.

All residents of Washington county except those who live in Polk, Erin, Hartford and Richfield townships are eligible to contribute blood at the center. Residents between the ages of 18 and 21 must have their parents' written consent.

Donating a pint of blood requires only a few minutes time—just enough time to save a life—maybe yours!

Girl Scout Cookie Sale Starts Today

It's Girl Scout cookie time; would you like to place an order with me?"

Girl Scouts of the Wau-Bun Council, dressed in their green uniforms and green berets, equipped with order forms and pencils, will begin ringing doorbells after school on Friday, March 8, to take orders for the annual Girl Scout Cookie Sale. Proceeds from the sale are used for improvement and maintenance of the area campsites and the development and expansion of the camping program. "Great camps from little cookies grow" is the slogan for this year's sale.

Cookies will be delivered the week of April 22, by the Girl Scout with whom the order was placed. Girls taking orders are in the junior, cadette and senior troops of scouting. Brownie scouts are not permitted to sell cookies. As a safety precaution, girls are urged to sell in pairs, using the "buddy" system and to make calls in their own neighborhoods.

Mrs. Walter Kroes, Fond du Lac, is general chairman of the sales in the Wau-Bun Council. In a letter to parents she says, "If your daughter has sold cookies before, you know what a rewarding experience it is. If she has not, her participation will give her the opportunity to contribute to the support of the overall council program, to earn money for her troop, and gain experience in accepting responsibility and meeting the public."

The goal for the sale is 67,000 boxes. For each box of cookies sold, 22 cents is used for the camping program, and 5 cents is retained by the Girl Scout troop to which the girl belongs. Cookies sell for 50 cents per box.

March Comes in Like a Lamb; Area Enjoys Spring Weather

March came in like a lamb last Friday, Mar. 1, with temperatures in the low 40's, sunny skies, brisk winds and thawing, drying weather.

Jump ropes, baseballs and bats, roller skates, footballs, neighborhood basketball on backyard courts and spring fever appeared in Kewaskum as the mercury reached the warmest readings of the year. Residents who returned from the South reported warmer, better weather here and running into snow, sleet, ice and cold in some southern states. Drivers, Students Hurt As School Bus, Car Collide

A car driven by Joseph Stehr, 56, of Milwaukee collided with a school bus at the intersection of Hwy. 41 and CTH D in the town of Wayne, about nine miles west of Kewaskum at 7:45 a. m. last Thursday. The bus was conveying Kewaskum High school students to school at the time.

Washington county authorities said that Stehr sustained fractured ribs, bumps, bruises and cuts and was taken by ambulance to St. Joseph's Community hospital, West Bend. His 1966 auto was reported a total wreck.

Two students on the bus were injured. Steve Schaefer incurred a bruised arm and Robert Ney a cut lip and a chipped tooth. One youth apparently cut his hand in giving assistance to the injured car driver, it was reported.

The mishap occurred as the Baumann Bus Service vehicle of Campbellport, eastbound on CTH D, was crossing Hwy. 41. Allen Krause, 47, of R. 3, West Bend, the bus driver, said he did not see the approaching car, which was northbound on Hwy. 41, as he stopped and then crossed the intersection. Krause suffered a laceration of the forehead.

Heart Fund Drive Opens Here; Mrs. Tessar Chairman

Wisconsin Heart association's 1968 Heart Fund campaign officially opened on Monday, Mar. 4, in Kewaskum, according to Mrs. Jack Tessar, who heads the campaign here.

Mrs. Tessar urges Kewaskum residents to support the Heart Fund drive again this year. "Your gifts and your neighbor's have already won dramatic victories, but diseases of the heart and blood vessels are still America's biggest killer."

"In the past year, more than a million Americans died from heart diseases. Almost 250,000 of those were persons under 65—fathers in their prime of life, mothers and school children and young adults were among the victims," she said.

"Your gift will help the Heart association researchers in their efforts to discover the answers to this problem," Mrs. Tessar said. "It will support educational programs and help provide additional community service projects."

The business division of the 1968 Heart Fund campaign will conduct its solicitation during this same time.

Jack Tessar will head the division and will canvass business firms.

Pointing out the businessman's responsibility to support the campaign, Tessar said, "Heart and blood vessel diseases are a constant threat to business and industry, afflicting skilled workers and executives in their most productive years. Years of training and investment can be destroyed by these diseases."

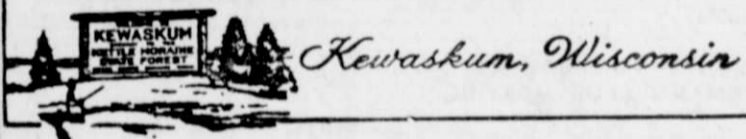
