## Atty. Schloemer Cites Need for Planning Park Areas Here Due to Rapid Growth of Community

SPEAKS AT KIWANIS MEETING ON MONDAY

Atty Clyde Schloemer of West Bend addressed members of the Kewaskum Kiwanis club at their dinner meeting Monday night at Hon-E-Kor. Members of the village board, West Bend and Kewaskum press, two West Bend Kiwanians, area land owners and a prospective member were among the guests present.

Atty Schloemer, former mayor of West Bend for eight years, spoke on parks and our growing little city. He stressed the rapid growth of the Kewaskum community and the ever-increasing need for recreation and play ground areas as the population increases. He recommended advance planning to provide adequate park areas for the future here.

The speaker said, "Some old timers still regard Kewaskum as a small community—a hamlet. This is no longer true. The village is big and has enjoyed tremendous growth. You have wonderful industry and people want to live here. Unless we recognize the change in society we're going to be caught short. We just don't understand the problems we're facing."

Schloemer pointed out the advance planning of the late Henry Regner, B. C. Ziegler and other prominent West Bend residents as well as the West Bend Woman's club in planning recreation areas for future generations. He told of present West Bend ordinances which require the dedication of a portion of new subdivisions for park purposes and adequate recreation areas.

He stated, "Let's save a place to walk. In cities people don't have a place to walk anymore because of the rapid development. We must try to point out that we must face this problem or be left behind." He pointed out that farming is disappearing and the many abandoned farms in the county as urban areas develop and spread out and advised laying out parks in developing a community to enhance, sell lots and promote the community.

Atty. Schloemer added, "Kewaskum has beautiful areas for park development and we should save these grounds for parks and playgrounds." He said there are ways of getting assistance in these projects by obtaining federal and state funds through the South Eastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission. There is also available a handbook of Federal Aid to Communities which outlines how to obtain funds and what funds are available.

Schloemer stated, "Local service clubs should take on these projects. I believe it is a great challenge to take an interest in maintaining and rebuilding these resources. We're going to have to do something for the people who need recreation—a place to go."

He related that the Kewaskum Kiwanis club has done an excellent job and the Kiwanis Foundation has achieved much. He said, "but village officials can't do things unless they get the support

KEWASKUM WINNER LAST YEAR WON STATE TITLE

From the 240 original entries, 14 will be chosen at district contests to compete in the "Alice" finals June 13-15 at Burlington. The contest for District 5, which includes Washington county, will be held at Sheboygan on Saturday, May 18.

Last year's District 5 contest was held in Kewaskum with Kristin Williams of Colgate (Washington county) being selected as the winner. Miss Williams went on to win the state Alice in Dairyland title.

## Airman 1C David Backhaus Killed In Arizona Crash

Airman First Class David H. Backhaus, 20, son of Mr. and Mrs. Harold A. Backhaus of R. 2, Kewaskum, was killed in an auto accident Sunday, April 28, near Mt. Lemon, Ariz. Airman Backhaus was stationed at nearby Davis Monthan Air Force Base, Tucson, Ariz. Details on the mishap were not available.

The young man was born July 24, 1947, at St. Joseph's Community hospital, West Bend. He attended St. Michael's Catholic school, St. Michaels, and after graduating there he attended St. Francis Brothers' school at Mt. Calvary for three years. He then enrolled in the Kewaskum High school where he graduated with the class of 1965. He took employment at the Gehl Bros. Mfg. Co. in West Bend and on May 26, 1966, enlisted in the air force.

Airman Backhaus is survived by his parents; four brothers, James, 19, Gary, 18, Ronald, 16, and John, 14; three sisters, Gerylyn, 15, Darlene, 13, and Linda, 10; his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Ted Schneider and Herbert Cash; aunts, uncles, cousins and other relatives.

He was a member of the Holy Name society of St. Michael's church.

Funeral services will be held this (Friday) morning at 10 o'clock at Miller's Funeral home, Kewaskum, and at 10:30 a. m. a concelebrated Mass will be offered at St. Michael's Catholic church by three Capuchin Fathers, Edgar Uoultich, Justin Schleisf and Valary Pearce, former teachers of Airman Backhaus at Mt. ## Five Persons Hurt in 3-Car Accident Here

FOUR ARE N. FOND DU LAC HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

Five persons, including four North Fond du Lac High school students, were injured in a three-vehicle crash on Hwy. 45 just south of the intersection with Hwy. 28 at the north village limits of Kewaskum at 3:40 p. m. Tuesday.

Removed to St. Agnes hospital, Fond du Lac, in the firemen's ambulance were Miss Chris Choewers, 14, of 3712 N. Lakeshore dr., Miss Jane Livieri, 15, of 133 Chapleau st., Miss Gloria Cudmundsen, 17, of 4611 Lakeshore dr., and Miss Jackie Hess, 17, of 323 Wisconsin ave., all of North Fond du Lac.

Local police reported that the youths were passengers in a northbound station wagon owned by Horace Mann High school, North Fond du Lac, and driven by John N. Dresden, 28, of 513 W. Marquette, N. Fond du Lac. Officers said the students were homeward bound from a field trip.

The station wagon reportedly was struck headon by a southbound station wagon being driven on the wrong side of the road by Fred W. Koehler, 75, of R. 1, Fredonia, who was alone in his vehicle. The impact of the crash pushed the N. Fond du Lac station wagon into a car behind it, driven by James J. Galligan, 24, of R. 2, Campbellsport. Galligan was alone in his car and was not injured. When Dresden and Galligan saw Koehler approaching on the wrong side of the highway they stopped their vehicles, believing he was going to make a left turn onto a side street. Instead he accelerated his vehicle and ran into the Dresden wagon.

Koehler, after being treated for facial cuts and rib fracture by a local physician, was then removed to St. Joseph's Community hospital, West Bend. He was charged with driving while intoxicated and was released on \$215 bond.

Escaping injury were Dresden and two other passengers, Mark Vandenburg, 18, of 919 Michigan ave., and Hilda Spellman, 65, of 937 Michigan ave., both of North Fond du Lac.

Police estimate damage to the front of the Koehler wagon at \$325 to the front of Galligan's car at \$225, and the front and back of the Dresden wagon at \$750.

A Milwaukee young lady was injured early Saturday when a car driven by Michael H. Fierke, 20, of Kewaskum left CTH V about 700 feet south of the Fond du Lac-Washington county line and struck a guard post. Injured was Sharyle J. Seeger, 19, a passenger in Fierke's car, who incurred a bump on the head.

from the community to help foster these projects." He encouraged the club to support park undertakings and said the county now has an active park board which is embarked on plans to have county parks.

Schloemer added "Kewaskum ought to be proud of the fact that it is drawing important business here and of its achievements and business and it is fantastic to have a plant like Regal Ware. You have started to mushroom. The village must be as progressive and successful as they are."

Schloemer jokingly remarked, "Kewaskum might grow so fast we may have to consolidate you

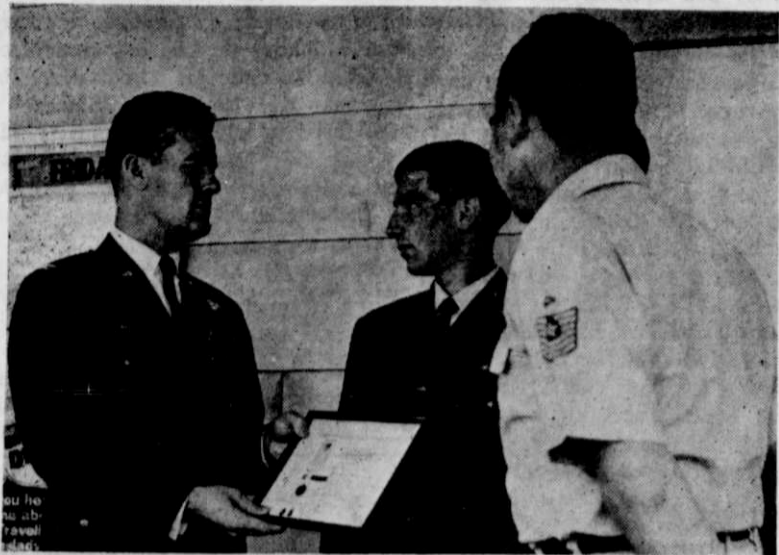
