Santa to Arrive Here Saturday for Christmas Party

COMING AT 1:30; GOODIES AND MOVIES FOR CHILDREN



Youngsters of Kewaskum and surrounding area have an exciting event awaiting them this Saturday, Dec. 21, when Santa Claus will arrive for his annual visit and children's Christmas theatre party. The affair is again being sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Kewaskum.

Santa will arrive at 1:30 p. m. sharp and after being paraded through the main streets on the fire engine with police escort, he will stop off at the Kewaskum theatre to greet and visit with all the youngsters present. Santa and his assistants will then hand out free popcorn, candy and other goodies to every child entering the theatre. Movies will follow and an A-1 rated feature movie and cartoons will be shown.

The theatre doors will open earlier and the kiddies are urged to get there on time so they won't miss Santa. All youngsters of the community are invited to come, meet Santa, and enjoy the theatre party.

\$98 Taken in Burglary at High School

A burglary at Kewaskum Community High school which occurred sometime between midnight Monday and 7 a. m. Tuesday is being investigated by local police.

According to Chief of Police Roland Pledl a total of \$98.76 was taken from an unlocked cabinet in the office of Supt. of Schools Marshall Boyd. His secretary, Miss Ann Kadinger, discovered the loss when she reported for work at 7:30 a. m. Tuesday.

The door of the superintendent's offices was forced open and a door leading to the boiler room in the basement was also forced. Pledl reported that nothing was taken from the boiler room. Both doors were damaged considerably.

At first Chief Pledl believed that someone either hid in the building or set the door latch so that entrance could be gained after the night janitor left at midnight. Later it was discovered that an outer door leading to the wrestling room on the north side of the building had been forced to gain entrance.

Woman, Children Escape When Fire Destroys Trailer

FAMILY'S BELONGINGS ALSO LOST IN BLAZE

A woman and two of her children from Campbellsport had a narrow escape from death or serious injury Tuesday morning when a flash fire and explosion destroyed their trailer home in Campbellsport. The blaze broke out about 10:45 a. m.

Two other children in the family were reported in school at the time and the woman's husband was at work at Kewaskum. The woman, Mrs. William Shulka, and the two children escaped with only the clothes they were wearing. Shulka is employed at the Wimmer Lumber Co., R. 2, Kewaskum. The family was reported to have obtained at least temporary living quarters with Shulka's father, who resides at the Johnson Trailer Court in Kewaskum.

Mrs. Shulka and the two children managed to flee from the trailer home on Railroad st. on the west side of the village when the flash fire occurred. She was unable to save any of the family's possessions due to the intensity of the blaze.

The entire trailer and all the family's possessions, clothing and personal belongings were destroyed in the fire. Neighbors and friends in the Campbellsport, Kewaskum and West Bend areas are now conducting an appeal to aid the family by donating clothing and furniture and securing a place for them to rent.

While the fire is still under investigation, it was attributed to either a malfunction of the heating unit or a flaw in it.

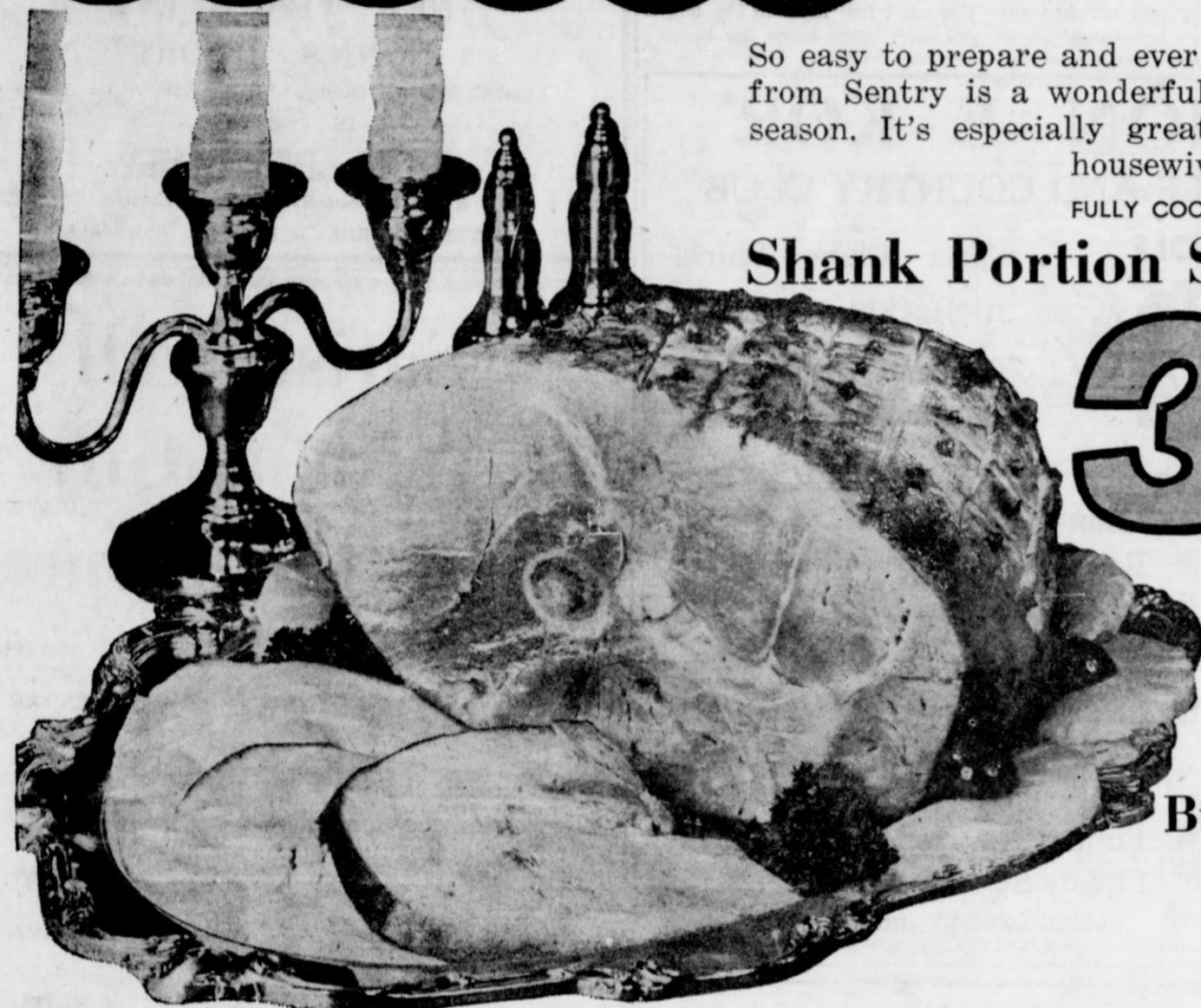

The School Board of Kewaskum Community Schools, Jt. School District No. 2, met in special session on Monday, November 11, 1968, at 8:00 p. m. with all members in attendance. Also in attendance were Mr. C. E. Mitchell, Mr. Richard Zarling and Mrs. Mildred Gausman.

Mr. James D. Reigle moved that the minutes of the October 28th meeting be accepted as printed. Mrs. Anne Panzer seconded. Motion unanimously carried.

Mrs. Gausman, the math consultant from the University of Wisconsin on the Kewaskum Community Schools staff for the first semester of the 1968-69 school year, reported on the staff study and recommendations for a new mathematics series in grades K thru 8.
