7 Candidates Seek Three Trustee Offices in Election Here Tuesday

BOHN TO OPPOSE ROMAINE FOR COUNTY BOARD SEAT

In addition to electing three trustees, village residents will be voting for a representative on the Washington County Board and a member of the state supreme court in the Spring Election next Tuesday, April 7.

Balloting in the village will take place in the fire station of the municipal building and the polls will be open from 9 a. m. until 8 p. m.

Seven candidates are seeking the three village board seats. All three incumbents, Raynor Herrieger, Myron Perschbacher and Elmer Yoost, whose terms expire are running for re-election. Four other candidates also are seeking election to the trustee offices. They are Wallace Cudnohoske, Earl DuBois, William A. Edwards and Gregor Nigh. This seven way race should provide spirited contests in the village.

Lively contests are also in prospect for seats on the Washington County Board of Supervisors. A total of 43 candidates are seeking the 29 seats on the board with contests slated in 14 of the 29 districts in the county. Much attention is focused on the race in the Village of Kewaskum (District 9) where the veteran county board chairman, Elwyn M. Romaine, is opposed by Francis Bohn.

Local and county electors will also cast ballots for a justice of the state supreme court. Connor T. Hansen is unopposed in the state-wide balloting for the high court seat.

Barn Destroyed By Fire; Local Firemen Assist

A large barn on the David Bohn farm property on CTH D about 4½ miles southwest of Kewaskum was destroyed by fire Monday afternoon. West Bend firemen called in the Kewaskum fire department to assist in fighting the blaze and prevent the flames from spreading. Local firemen were summoned to the blaze at 3:55 p. m.

The fire also burned over approximately 15 acres of grassland and a car parked near the barn was also destroyed. Wind-driven embers also caused straw piled up against the west foundation of the farm home to catch fire momentarily and threatened the residence before the blaze was put out.

The Kewaskum department's tank truck was called to the scene earlier to help haul water to fill West Bend firemen's portable tank but when the home was threatened and the flames spread through grassland toward a wooded area, the siren was sounded to call the local firemen in for assistance.

The farm home is occupied by Donna Dennis and her children. Mrs. Dennis and three of her six children were not at home at the time of the fire. However, Patrick, 11; Michael, 5, and the youngest child, Garth, 2, were at home. The children away were Christopher, 10, Jackie, 9, and Kelley, 4. Patrick ran to the home of a neighbor, Dennis M. Pocian, and summoned the fire department.

Two West Bend area youths saw the fire shortly before firemen arrived and tried to help extinguish burning grass by beating at the flames with sweat shirts they were wearing. They were Doug Schleif, 12, of R. 3, and Steve Bandy, 13, of West Bend. They said they were camping in the area and saw smoke from the blaze.

Cause of the fire was not determined but is under investigation. The amount of loss was not determined until a complete inventory can be made. West Bend firemen were at the scene about five hours, while the Kewaskum department remained about an hour.

Facsimile Ballot Notice of Spring Election
Village of Kewaskum, Wisconsin

OFFICE OF VILLAGE CLERK

Public Notice is hereby given to the qualified electors of the Village of Kewaskum, Washington County, Wisconsin, that at an election to be held in and for the said Village of Kewaskum, on the First Tuesday in April next being the 7th day of said month, A.D. 1970 officers as follows are to be chosen.

The names of the candidates for whom nomination papers have been filed as required by law, are listed below, each opposite the proper office to which nominated.

INFORMATION TO VOTERS

The following instructions are given for the information and guidance of voters:

(a) A voter, upon entering the polling place and giving his name and residence, will receive a ballot from the ballot clerk which must have endorsed thereon the names or initials of both ballot clerks, and no other ballot can be used. Upon receiving the ballot, the voter must retire alone to a booth or compartment and prepare the same for voting. A ballot clerk may inform the voter as to the proper manner of marking a ballot, but he must not advise or indicate in any manner whom to vote for.

(b) To vote for a person whose name is printed on the ballot, make a cross (X) or mark in the square after the name of the person for whom you desire to vote. To vote for a person whose name is not printed on the ballot, write the name in the blank space provided for the purpose.

(c) The ballot should not be marked in any other manner. If the ballot be spoiled, it must be returned to the ballot clerk, who must issue another in its stead, but not more than three in all shall be issued to any one voter. Five minutes' time is allowed in booth to mark ballot. Unofficial ballots or memorandum to assist voter in marking his ballot can be taken into the booth and may be used to copy from. The ballot must not be shown so that any person can see how it has been marked by the voter.

(d) After it is marked, it should be folded so that the inside cannot be seen but so that the printed endorsement and signatures of the ballot clerks on the outside may be seen. Then the voter should pass out of the booth or compartment, give his name to the inspector in charge of the ballot box, hand him the ballot to be placed in the box, and pass out of the polling place.

(e) A voter, who declares to the presiding officer that he is unable to read, or that by reason of physical disability he is unable to mark his ballot, can have assistance of one or two election officers, not of the same political party, in marking same, to be chosen by the voter; and if he declares to be totally blind, may be assisted by any person chosen by him from among the legal voters of the village. The presiding officer may administer an oath in his direction, as to such person's disability.

(f) Any qualified elector who is absent, or expects to be absent from the village in which he is a qualified elector, or who, because of sickness or physical disability cannot appear at the polling place on election day, may vote at such election by means of an absent voter's ballot to be secured upon application to the Village Clerk, not more than sixty days and no less than three days, or by personal application, not later than the close of office hours on the day prior to such election.

(g) The following is a sample of the official ballot:

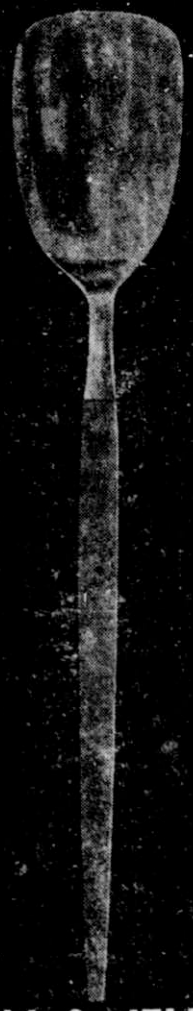
