Electors Hear Long-Range Building Plan

MEETING ATTENDED BY 200; APPROVE \$1,022,892 BUDGET

A budget totaling \$1,022,892.85 for the 1970-71 school year was approved by the electors of the Ketrict at the annual meeting Monday night. About 200 persons attended.

The budget calls for a tax rate of \$20.73 per \$1,000 equalized valuation, compared with \$19.94 last

The meeting was called to order by board chairman Richard L. Edwards but in the election of a temporary chairman, Norbert Dettmann of the Town of Farmington won over Edwards by a vote of 105 to 68.

In a seven-way race to fill three vacancies on the school board, 540 voters, more than twice as many as last year, turned out for the election held between 1:00 and 8:00 p. m. to elect Gerald H. Zimmel and Richard S. Theusch, both first-time candidates, to three-year terms and incumbent Mrs. Zona Miske to the one-year unexpired term that was held by Mrs. June

The vote was as follows: Zimmel 339; Theusch 302; Mrs. Miske 224; Mrs. Berg 177; Myron P. Belger 139; Ernest Howell 132, and Mrs. Janet Panzer 126. Theusch was a leading opponent of the swimming pool project that was defeated almost two to one in a referendum last December.

Woman Held In Slaying Of Area Man

WM. SHULKA, 29, VICTIM IN FATAL SHOOTING

A woman identified as Judith Marie Deveraux, 26, by Sheboygan authorities, was being held under \$25,000 bond on a second degree murder charge in Sheboygan waskum Community Schools dis County jail this week following the fatal shooting of William A. Shulka, 29, in the rural home on County Trunk A just south of Beechwood, located at R. 1, Kewaskum, about 1:30 a. m. Monday.

Shulka was employed as head sawer at the Wimmer Lumber Co. on State Hwy. 28 about 11/2 miles east of Kewaskum. His father, Emil Shulka, is a partner in the firm.

An autopsy performed by Dr. that Shulka was struck by three shots from a 22 calibre pistol. July 1. One shot penetrated his heart, another lodged next to the heart neck, sheriff's department officials stated.
