## Zimmel, Theusch, Mrs. Miske Elected To School Board; 540 Votes Cast

### Electors Hear Long-Range Building Plan

MEETING ATTENDED BY 200; APPROVE \$1,022,892 BUDGET

A budget totaling \$1,022,892.85 for the 1970-71 school year was approved by the electors of the Kewaskum Community Schools district at the annual meeting Monday night. About 200 persons attended.

The budget calls for a tax rate of \$20.73 per \$1,000 equalized valuation, compared with \$19.94 last year.

The meeting was called to order by board chairman Richard L. Edwards but in the election of a temporary chairman, Norbert Dettmann of the Town of Farmington won over Edwards by a vote of 105 to 68.

In a seven-way race to fill three vacancies on the school board, 540 voters, more than twice as many as last year, turned out for the election held between 1:00 and 8:00 p. m. to elect Gerald H. Zimmel and Richard S. Theusch, both first-time candidates, to three-year terms and incumbent Mrs. Zona Miske to the one-year unexpired term that was held by Mrs. June Berg.

The vote was as follows: Zimmel 339; Theusch 302; Mrs. Miske 224; Mrs. Berg 177; Myron P. Belger 139; Ernest Howell 132, and Mrs. Janet Panzer 126. Theusch was a leading opponent of the swimming pool project that was defeated almost two to one in a referendum last December.

A proposed long-range building program that would involve about \$3 million got a cool reception from the electorate. The building program was presented for discussion and information only.

The plan calls for borrowing all of the money in a lump sum, using what is needed in a step-by-step building program, meanwhile investing the unused portion. The interest earned would be used to buy equipment as well as to offset the expected rising building costs in the next few years, it was pointed out.

The plan calls for an \$155,219 addition to the Farmington School; a \$186,247 addition to the Wayne School and a \$2,384,717 addition to the present high school which includes a swimming pool alternate plan of \$280,000. The present high school would then house grades 7-12.

Several electors suggested the board consider holding school on a 12-month basis, thereby using the school facilities to the utmost. That possibility has been discussed, board members pointed out, but added that the answer to that plan has not yet been found. "If you want it, force the issue; don't make the board do it," the electors were told.

At a reorganizational meeting of the board that followed the annual meeting, Richard L. Edwards was retained as chairman; John Jadro, clerk, and Mrs. Miske

The AFS student will also be a senior.

Ivan is only the second male student among the nine who have preceded him here. He has two brothers, Wilson, 19, and John, 11. His father is a linotypist.

Ivan has studied English six hours per week for 10 years, and he has attended Colegio "La Salle" in Quito, according to information received.

The South American youth says he is most interested in physics, math and chemistry and that he has played basketball, soccer and tennis, with basketball being his favorite sport. He is preparing to be a pilot-engineer.

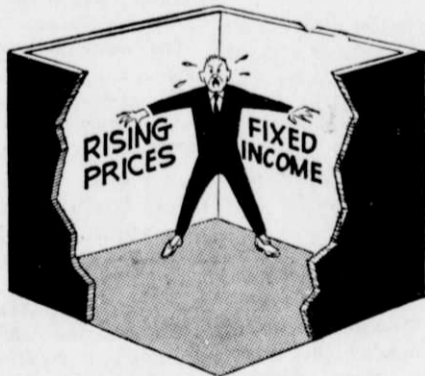
