## West Bend Savings & Loan Gets Approval for Kewaskum Branch

Approval has been given to West Bend Savings and Loan to establish a new branch in Kewaskum. R. J. McMahon, Wisconsin savings and loan commissioner, on Monday announced the decision approving the third office of the financial institution in Washington County.

The new branch office in Kewaskum will be a full service extension of present operations and is scheduled to be staffed by three people. A new manager is also expected to be announced shortly.

President Richard A. Larson said the branch would be housed in the building on Main St. that once was the headquarters of the Kewaskum Mutual Insurance Co. More recently it was used as one of the offices for Regal Ware, Inc. before moving into their newly completed Administrative Center on Reigle Dr.

The building will be remodeled, and other tenants will also be leased space there.

The new branch here will be comparable to the other branch in Germantown, an operation that has surpassed projections in its first year of operation.

Larson said the savings and loan has had a large number of mortgage and savings customers in the Kewaskum and Campbellsport area and added that his move would offer greater convenience to them.

Also market studies showed that Campbellsport people are oriented to either Kewaskum or Fond du Lac, and that is the reason Campbellsport was included in the service area in the application to the state, Larson said.

## John J. Felix Dies Suddenly, Others Pass On

John J. Felix, 69, passed away suddenly at about 4:30 p. m. Saturday, Dec. 18, at his home, 329 Parkfield Dr., West Bend, of an apparent heart attack.

He was born Feb. 4, 1902 in the Town of Ashford, near St. Kilian, a son of the late Jacob and Anna Peter Felix. His marriage to Verona Klein took place at St. Matthias Catholic Church in the Town of Auburn Jan. 17, 1934.

The couple farmed near St. Kilian, later purchasing the large Felix homestead farm, which was in the family possession for three generations. They farmed there until 1965 when Mr. Felix was severely injured in a farm machinery accident while working on his farm. After this they sold the farm and moved to their present home. Mr. Felix was also a former employee of the Barton Mfg. Co.

He was a member of the West Bend Council 1964 of the Knights of Columbus, Holy Name Society and Immaculate Conception Catholic Church, West Bend.

Survivors include his widow, two sons, Robert K. (Sandra) Felix of Ft. Lauderdale, Fla. and Kenneth A. (Janice) Felix of Chicago; a daughter, Carol Felix of Hartford; two daughters-in-law; a grandson, Kenneth John Felix. One daughter, Dorothy, died in infancy. Surviving further are four sisters, Mary (Mrs. Norbert Heiting) of Port Washington, Rose Felix of St. Kilian, Catherine (Mrs. Edward Hawig) of Wayne and Anne (Mrs. Gilbert Reindl) of R. 2, Kewaskum; three brothers, Frank of Kewaskum, Leo of St. Kilian and Alphons of West Bend; many other relatives and friends. One sister, Elizabeth, and one brother, Kilian, preceded him in death.

Visitation was at Miller's Funeral Home, Kewaskum, after 3 p. m. Tuesday. Funeral services were held Wednesday at 10:30 a. m. from the funeral home and at 11 o'clock at Immaculate Conception Church, West Bend. Rev. George Schumann, pastor, and Rev. ## 80 KHS Girls Will Participate in 48-Hour Benefit Cage Ball Marathon

Eighty energetic junior and senior girls from Kewaskum High School will battle in a 48-hour cage ball marathon starting Monday morning in the high school gym.

Proceeds from the exhibition will be donated to St. Joseph's Community Hospital and the Journalism Departments at Kewaskum High School. The hospital is currently in a fund drive for expansion purposes and the Journalism Department would like to construct a photo-lab for use by the newspaper and annual staffs.

The marathon will begin at 8 a. m. Monday, Dec. 27, when two eight-girl teams take the floor and play will continue (hopefully) until 8 a. m. Wednesday, Dec. 29.

In the interim teams will change every four hours. Officials will be junior and senior boys, while over a dozen teachers have volunteered to chaperone during the marathon.

Game rules will be very similar to volley ball in which points are earned when a team is unable to return the ball successfully. The only difference in cage ball is the ball is ten times larger than in volley ball—or three feet in diameter—thus the chore to score becomes greater and is much more tiring.

Funds for the marathon will be raised through a sponsor solicitation, similar to the Hunger Hike, held last fall. Contestants will get sponsors to contribute a certain amount for team or total game points.

Three prizes will be awarded to those people who purchase raffle tickets and come closest to the final score. Admission to the marathon is 25c.

## Steel I Beam Falls on Man, Killing Him

A West Bend man, Arthur R. Bailey, 63, of 705A Third Ave., was killed Tuesday in the Town of Farmington when a 120-foot steel construction I beam broke loose from its position and fell on him.

He was an employe of Hidden Valley Nursery and had gone across the road to watch at a new building for Johnson Tool and Engineering Co., according to County Coroner Robert Boltz. Owner of the new building is Carl Johnson, formerly of Kewaskum, who is also owner of the Johnson Tool and Engineering Co. plant in Kewaskum.

Another employe of Hidden Valley Nursery, Gordon Kruse, 47, of R. 4, West Bend, was also injured in the accident. He was treated and released from St. Joseph's Community Hospital, West Bend, the same morning. The owner, Carl Johnson, was also reported injured but the extent of his injuries was not learned.

The mishap occurred at 8:45 a. m. at the plant on Indian Lore Rd., south of CTH H, southeast of Kewaskum.

According to Boltz, Bailey died of internal injuries when the I beam fell on him.

Initial investigation showed that the beam had been placed and the cables from the lifting truck had been removed. Guys were also in place. The concrete blocks holding the beam reportedly gave way and the beam twisted loose.

## Regal Rink for Tots Open to Ice Skaters

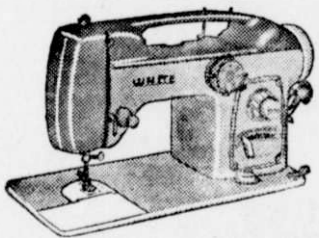

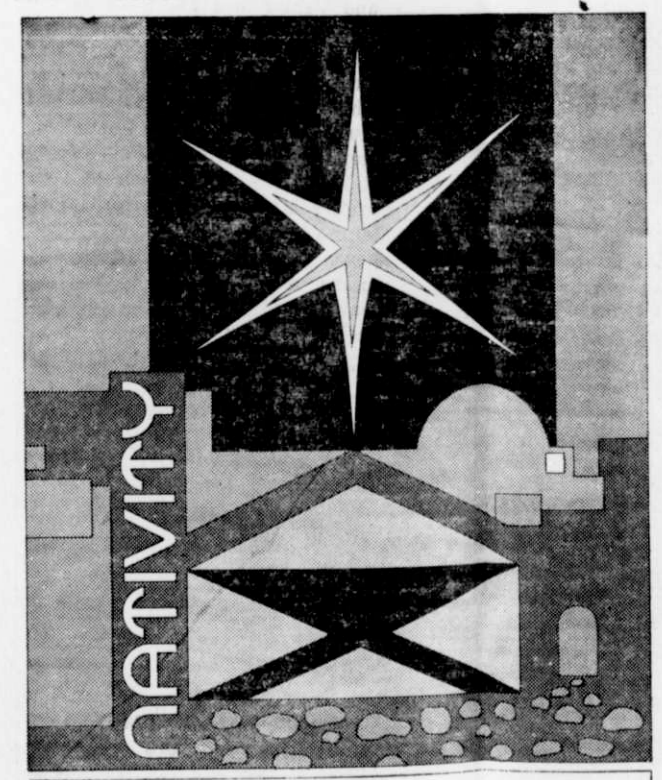

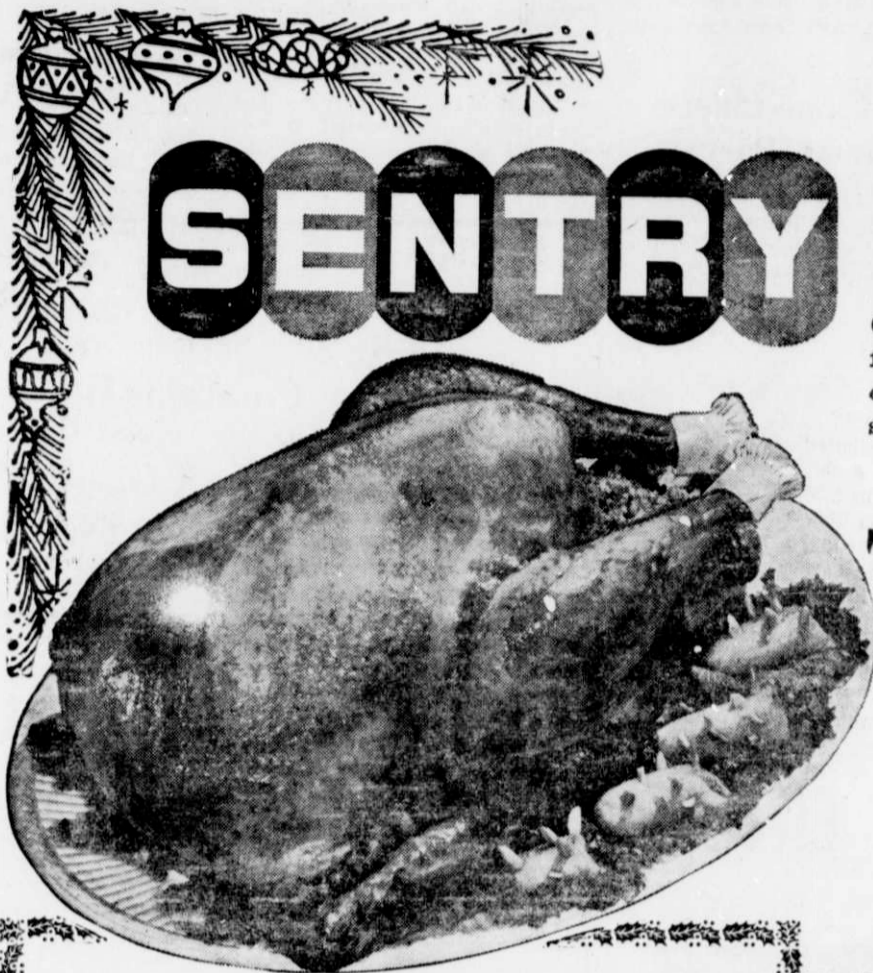

## Indians Nipped By Germantown By 1 Point, 76-75

Starting out with a 5-game winning streak, the Kewaskum Indians now have a 2-game losing streak going as the result of being nudged by Germantown here Friday by one point in a real close one 76-75, before a howling crowd. A late rally by the Indians just fell short and a shot at the basket in the last couple of seconds that was just missed cost them a victory.

Fate smiled on both of the Scenic Moraine leaders Friday but turned a cold cheek on Kewaskum. Both Mayville and Germantown squeezed out wins by one point. Mayville nipped Kettle Moraine, 67-66, on a basket in the closing seconds by Todd Zangl from 16 feet out. Kettle Moraine, which the Indians beat handily by 12 points, 72-60, the week before gave Mayville a surprising battle. Mayville and Germantown are now 4-0 while Kewaskum, with their loss to the Cardinals last Tuesday, dropped to 2-2.

The Warhawk-Indian contest was a well played game with the lead alternating. Germantown got off to a 19-13 advantage in the first quarter but Kewaskum came back strong in the second period to outscore them, 21-11 and take a four point halftime lead, 44-40.

Then it was the Warhawks' turn again and they erased Kewaskum's lead by scoring 27 points to the Indians' 18 in the third stanza to go ahead 67-62. Germantown continued to add to its lead in the final quarter and had an 11-point margin with less than 5 minutes to go. The Indians still trailed by 9 points with 2½ minutes to go and then put on a sensational drive to all but pull the game out of the fire. Led by Glen Eichstedt with 2 buckets, Kewaskum came within one point, 76-75, with seconds remaining when Jim Gaffke let fly with a shot that hit the rim and bounced out just before the buzzer. The Warhawks almost let their lead and victory slip away. Gaffke had made 2 clutch free throws in the closing minute to bring it to 76-73 and Mitch Misko connected on a shot that made it 76-75 with 10 seconds left.

Germantown shot 64 per cent, an average that is hard to beat. They were led by Mike O'Connell with 23 points and the Henry brothers, Mike and Wilbur, with 21 and 15 respectively. Tom Theusch's 22 points were tops for the losers, followed by Eichstedt with 19.

The Indians return to action with a non-conference game against Lomira here Jan. 4 and then follow at Pewaukee Jan. 7.

In the two other Scenic contests Friday, Hartland edged Grafton 57-55, and Slinger handled Pewaukee, 59-44.
