Four veteran members of the Kewaskum Fire Department have retired as active members within the past year after many years of faithful service to the department. Their places on the 45-man active roster have been taken by younger men who have been accepted into the department.

The retiring firemen are Ollie

Staehler, Harry Koch, Willard Manthei and Byron Bunkelman. The combined services to the department of these four men total 112 years. Staehler was a member 25 years, Koch 30 years, Manthei 27 years and Bunkelman 30 years.

Staehler, who joined the department in 1946, was promoted

to lieutenant in 1963, to captain in 1966, and assistant chief in 1969, serving in this capacity until 1971.

Koch joined the department in 1941 and served as treasurer from 1954 to 1969.

Manthei joined the department in 1944 and had also served as a

member of the rescue squad on ambulance duty since 1950.

Bunkelman joined the department in 1941.

All four retiring firemen were awarded plaques for their many years of service to the department and have been placed on the department's honorary list.

150 Educators Attend District Conference Here

Approximately 150 educators from district 10 held their Fall Conference at Kewaskum High School Wednesday, Nov. 15. The district comprises schools from the Southeastern section of the state.

The opening sessions began with a combined orientation meeting conducted by Clark Pearson, Kewaskum High School principal. Following the opening session conferences were scheduled for teachers in vocational agriculture, home economics and industrial education.

The agriculture conference began with the Wisconsin Association of Vocational Agricultural Instruction (WAVAI) business meeting conducted by Pat Zimmer, vice-president of Whitewater. Other business included initiation of the FFA Alumni Association, Wisconsin Veterinary School and an evaluation of the WAVAI record and plan book.

Following the business meeting vocational agriculture teachers took part in a discussion articulating secondary and post-secondary agriculture programs, symposium education experience concluded with the current status of vocational agriculture in Wisconsin.

The home economics program included sessions of FHA leadership as well as an articulation with vocational schools.

The industrial education program had an informative presentation on the Status of Industrial Education in Wisconsin schools and certification of vocational teachers.

In addition educators discussed what role education should assume in the career education content.

Following the individual sessions teachers met at the Wigwam for dinner.

The program was coordinated through Clark Pearson, principal of Kewaskum High School and the following of the department of Public Instruction: Ruel F. Falk, director of the Bureau for Career and Manpower Development; Mrs. Margaret M. Apel, consultant of Home Economics Education; F. J. Doering, head consultant of Agriculture Education, and Richard H. Kitzmann, consultant of Industrial Education.

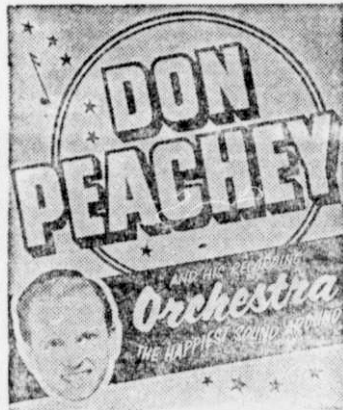

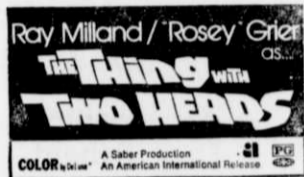

FIREMEN CALLED TO OSCAR BACKUS HOME

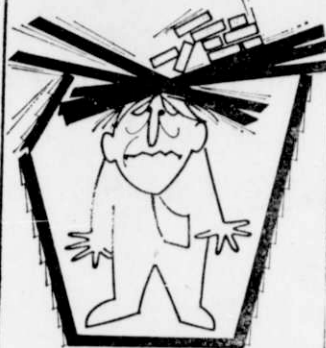
