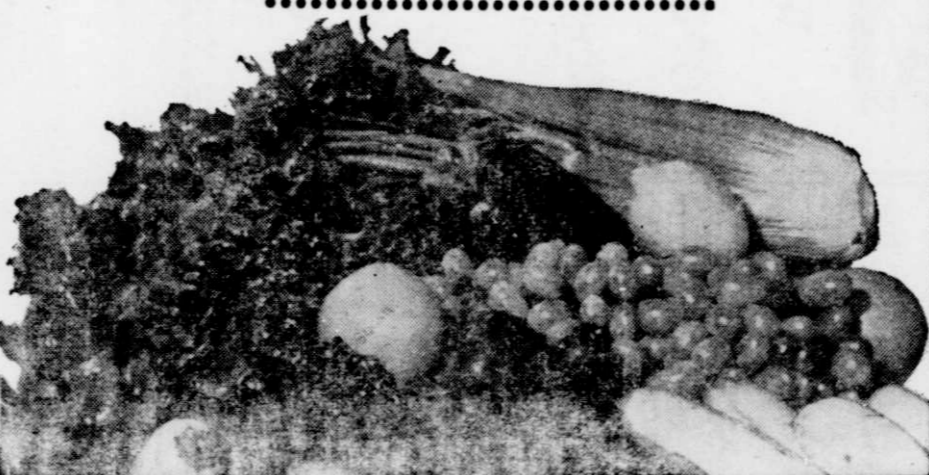

honors with Horicon's Steve Kaiser. In three matches the Indians have now totaled 162, 166 and 160.

The JV team, led by Scott Koth's 45 and Tom Timblin's 46, also won its 3rd straight, 239-261, using the best 5 of 6 scores. Four of the JV's, all of them sophomores, were in the 40's.

Two meets scheduled this week were postponed by rain, Monday and Wednesday against Slinger and Mayville. Friday a meet is scheduled with Campbellsport.
