## Rudolf Hirsig, Arnold Jaeckels Called in Death

Rudolf Hirsig, 88, who resided with his son Felix at R. 3, Beaver Dam for the past four years, a retired cheesemaker and former resident of the Town of Auburn, passed away Monday, Dec. 31. He was pronounced dead on arrival at Hillside Hospital, Beaver Dam.

He was born April 26, 1885 at Amsoldingen, Switzerland, a son of the late Christian and Magdalena Bachman Hirsig. He came to the United States in 1900 and lived near Campbellsport for several years, and then moved to the Town of Auburn, Fond du Lac County, several miles north of Kewaskum, in 1907. He was a cheesemaker all his adult life until his retirement from Fairmont Foods in Kewaskum in 1953. His marriage to Theresa Wittmann took place at Leroy, Wis. on March 21, 1905. She predeceased him on June 21, 1965.

Surviving are four children, Felix of R. 3, Beaver Dam, Oscar and Laura (Mrs. Joseph M.) Miller of Kewaskum and Beulah (Mrs. Floyd) Grosklaus of Grafton; one daughter-in-law, three sons-in-law, seven grandchildren, seven great-grandchildren, and one sister, Lena (Mrs. Earl) Bixby of North Fond du Lac. He was preceded in death by one daughter, Verma (Mrs. Edward) Dobke of Kewaskum.

Visitation will be at Miller's Funeral Home, Kewaskum, after 3 p. m. Friday. Funeral services will be held at 1:30 p. m. Saturday, Jan. 5, at the funeral home. Rev. John Budde will officiate and burial will take place in the new Holy Trinity Church cemetery.

## 41 Graduate From Moraine Park Farm Training Program

A total of 41 persons graduated from the Moraine Park VTAE District Farm Training program during 1973, according to an announcement from Wayne G. Koene, agriculture coordinator. Graduation banquets honoring the graduates and their families were held at West Bend, Ripon, and Beaver Dam this fall.

Graduates were from the Hartford, Kewaskum, Brandon, Pickett, Ripon, Beaver Dam, Allenton, Burnett, Reeseville, Horicon, West Bend, Fox Lake, Jackson, Cedarburg and Waupun areas.

"They received five years of intensive and personalized instruction related specifically to their farming operations", said Koene. "They are to be congratulated for recognizing the value this program has to their success as a farm business operator," he said.

Young farmers who enroll in the program receive formal classroom instruction on all phases of modern agriculture during the winter months and individual on-farm instruction throughout the year.

Farm training classes are currently being held at twenty different locations throughout the Moraine Park VTAE District. A total of 430 persons are enrolled this past

year. Five full-time instructors are employed by the VTAE District to provide these educational benefits.

Koene said that 14 persons from the Washington County area graduated from the program in 1972, bringing the total number of Farm Training program graduates to 55 so far.

The Farm Training program in the Moraine Park VTAE District began in the fall of 1967. Roger Christy of West Bend was the first instructor. Other former farm training instructors who taught in the program during the early years were Don Jaworski, now of Green Bay, and Don Walters of Ripon. The present instructors are Don Wagner of Ripon, Ralph Van Dixhorn of West Bend, Barney Madigan of Rosendale, Irv Kelly of Horicon and Clarence Grundahl of Beaver Dam.

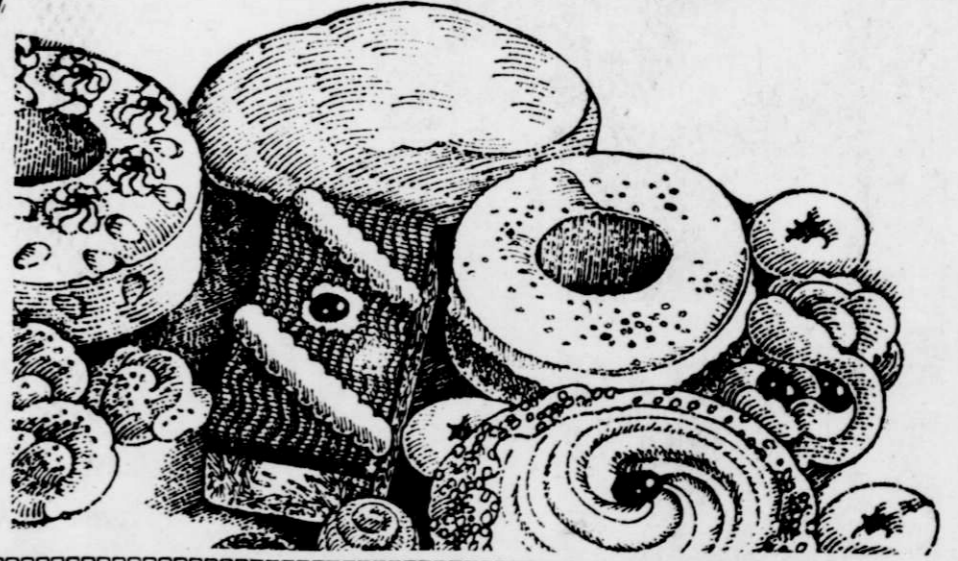

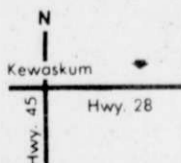
