Town Kewaskum Named to Gehl Tax Rate Set at \$17.46 Per \$1,000

The tax bills for the Town of Kewaskum residents will net \$17.46 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation, compared to the 1973 net tax rate of \$25.31. As a result of the town's revaluation by Arrow Appraisal Company in 1974, the assessed value jumped from \$7,965,732 in 1973 to the present \$14,629,385.

The 1974 tax rate is .000183 for state taxes, .002794 for county taxes, .001000 for town taxes, and .014487 for Kewaskum schools, handicapped tuition and the technical school, less .000996 for state credit, giving the net rate of 17.468. The state credit for personal property livestock and merchants' stock amounts to 80% this year.

Exempt from the tax roll this year is \$256,100 for manufacturing machinery and equipment.

Tax bills may arrive later this year than in the past because of late delivery of the tax credit and state manufacturing assessment roll.

Firemen Hold Bus Rescue Training

Campbellsport Fire Department was the host to a bus rescue seminar sponsored by the Western District of the Badger Firemen's Association, Thursday, Dec. 5. Attending the seminar were 12 members of the Kewaskum Fire Department, with procedures to gain entry into an overturned bus and the extraction of victims from the bus.

The principal speaker was Asst. Chief Ralph Mueller of the Brown Deer Fire Department. Chief Mueller had been the coordinator of many such training sessions using actual buses and simulated victims. From these sessions Ralph has collaborated many films and slides which were used in this seminar.

Forty-seven members, firemen from Allenton, Campbellsport, Fillmore, Kewaskum, Kohlsville and Jackson attended.

Badger Firemen's Association holds many of these various seminars throughout the year. Also each fall the association has held expos in conjunction with Fire Prevention Week.

Plan on Moving Into Elementary School Addition Over Holidays

It was announced at the Kewaskum School Board meeting Tuesday evening that plans call now for moving into the Kewaskum Elementary addition over the Christmas vacation period. When this is accomplished, it will leave only the high school addition to be completed. The Board approved the removal of the present exterior wall in the agriculture shop as part of the remodeling project. This will be done when the time is appropriate.

The budget was revised for the present year based on final aid figures. Some funds were transferred, with the instruction category decreasing and capital outlay increasing. The levy and proposed carryover funds remain the same as given at the annual meeting. Because of increasing building costs, it appears that some additions needed in the program may run slightly over original estimates. Included in this category would be a fire hydrant addition, the additional of some mezzanine area at the Middle School, drain pipes, etc. Additional building fund interest monies were allocated for this purpose in the revised budget.

Clark Pearson reported on the progress of the North Central evaluation. The only apparent serious citation by North Central this year is the requirement of a half-

time assistant principal. The Board expressed its intention to hire a person for 1975-76 school year.

Clark Pearson reported on the possible realignment proposal put out by the WIAA. He commented to the effect that at the present time we are not dissatisfied with the Scenic Moraine Conference but are concerned about the increasing enrollments of some of the schools in the conference. The Board indicated that they would not be opposed to the WIAA proposed new conference.

High School Principal, Clark Pearson, reported that the high school was not planning on any major curriculum changes for the 1975-76 school year. Because of the State's 13 Standards requirements the high school will be adding a general Music Appreciation course and Physical Education will be required for a full year at the 11th grade level.

The School Board would like to commend Coach George Allmann and the Kewaskum Community High School "Who Knows Team" for winning the championship of Channel 6's popular TV "Who Knows" show. The Board would also like to commend the Wayne teachers and students for a fine Christmas program.

The Board adjourned to an executive session following the regular board meeting.

WISN-TV 12, Milwaukee has generously promoted the "Carnival for Dystrophy" program since it began in 1962. Howard and Rosemary Gernette, TV 12's personalities were again responsible for engendering enthusiasm that raised the fourth largest amount in the nation.

Joy Polaski, Milwaukee Carnivals Coordinator, announced that 1974 was the fifth consecutive year that over \$40,000 was raised. This year's total of \$70,900 was the largest amount raised for dystrophy during the past 13 years. The grand total for this period is \$355,408.

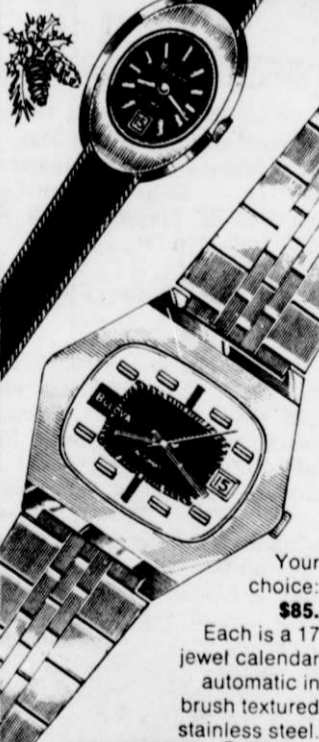

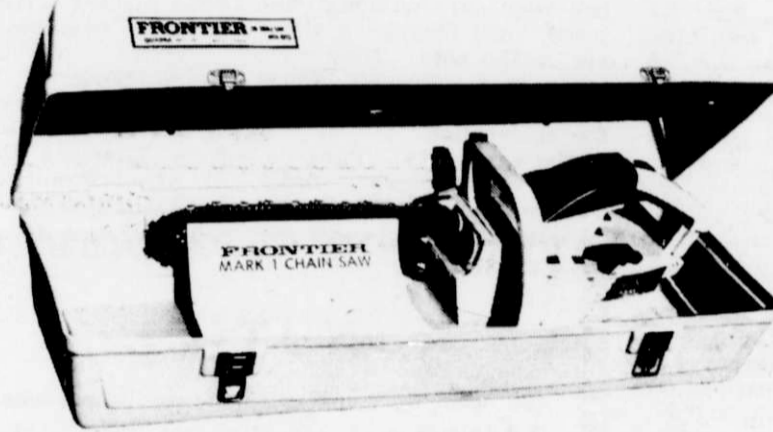

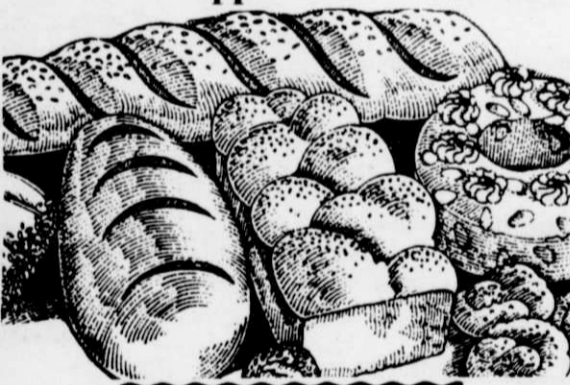

The Falcons are now 1-3 overall.

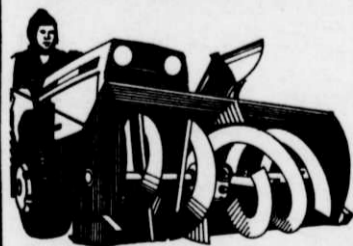
329 DEER TAKEN IN COUNTY; KILL DOWN
