## Gene Roeder Dies



Eugene Roeder, age 62 years, a resident of 203 Forest Ave., Kewaskum, for the past six years, formerly of Chicago, passed away at his home late Monday evening, Dec. 1, after a lingering illness.

He was born Aug. 22, 1913, at St. Joseph, Minn., a son of the late Mathias and Rose Schever Roeder. He married Mary Mahoney on May 24, 1941, in Chicago.

He was a graduate of St. John's University of Minnesota and was a director of Tax and Insurance Services at Regal Ware, Inc., Kewaskum. He was formerly with the Roeder-Burline Accounting Firm of Chicago.

Mr. Roeder was a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, a veteran of World War II, a member of Robert G. Romaine Post of the American Legion in Kewaskum, a member and former treasurer of the Kiwanis Club of Kewaskum.

Survivors include his wife; one son and daughter-in-law, Michael (Denise) Roeder of Madison; a daughter, Kath-

erine of Minneapolis, a daughter and son-in-law, Margaret (John) LaMarche of Madison; three brothers, Albert, Leo and Clarence, all of St. Cloud, Minn.; four sisters, Sr. Immacula, O.S.B. of St. Cloud, Minn., Mrs. Sophia Lodermeier of St. Joseph, Minn., Mrs. L. S. Lacher of Oombard, Ill. and Miss Theresa Roeder of Glenview, Ill., and other relatives and friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents, two brothers and one sister.

Visitation was at Miller's Funeral Home after 3 p. m. Wednesday and a prayer vigil was held at 8:30 p. m. Funeral services were held at 10 a. m. Thursday at the funeral home and at 10:30 a. m. at Holy Trinity Church. Rev. John T. Budde officiated, assisted by Father Jerome Ziegler. Burial was in the new Holy Trinity Cemetery. The Robert G. Romaine Post conducted military services at the graveside.

## Village Tax Rate Set at \$35.90 Per \$1000; Up \$2.00

The budget for 1976, set at \$1,167,422.21 for the Village of Kewaskum, was adopted unanimously by the Kewaskum Village Board at a special meeting on Tuesday.

This means that the total gross tax levy will be \$848,251.22, and the mill rate will be \$40.98 per \$1000 of assessed property value, as compared to \$39.67 per \$1000 last year, or an increase in the gross rate of \$1.31.

The biggest surprise in calculating the budget was in the value of manufacturing personal property, which dropped from approximately

\$5.25 million to \$4.9 million, a difference of \$350,000. This loss far outweighs an increase in village personal property, and real estate of \$282,000.

State tax credits will also decrease from \$5.77 per \$1000 to \$5.08, or a loss of \$9,000 in expected state aid. The figure dropped to \$79,707, as total valuations in the village decreased \$136,525 to \$20,705,300.

The net tax rate will be \$40.98 minus the state tax credit of \$5.08, or \$35.90 per \$1000 of valuation, an actual increase of \$2.00 per \$1,000 over 1975.

## Bids Opened for Reassessing Of Village at Board Meeting

Bids were opened for the reassessing of the Village of Kewaskum at the December meeting of the Kewaskum Village Board Monday night.

The bids ranged from a low of \$7,828 by Roger C. Wold, Co. of Eau Claire to \$18,800. Two other bids were received which were less than the \$10,000 original cost prediction, while three others indicated they could not meet the deadline.

After the bids had been opened and read, the board unanimously agreed to table the bids for further consideration. When asked if money was available for the project, President Charles Miller replied that "there is nothing in the budget for next year, we'll have to work something out."

With no opposition at the public hearing, the board was scheduled to approve the 1976 tax levy and budget, but the matter was held over until a special meeting on Tuesday, Dec. 2, to allow the Commissioner time to recheck the amounts in each category.

Sealed bids were also opened on the purchase of a garden tractor and mower, with the low bid submitted by Random Lake Co-Op Association for a 1976 Simplicity, at a cost of \$2,005. All of the bids received were referred to the equipment committee for their recommendations.

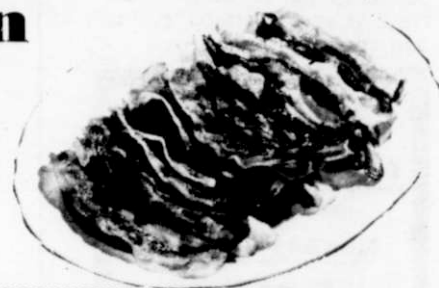

## West Bend East Press in 2nd Half Routs Indians; Cougars Trimmed

After holding a strong, veteran West Bend East team to a tie at halftime, the crippled Kewaskum Indians lost their poise and folded to a strong full court defensive press after the intermission to be routed by the Suns, 80-46, here last Tuesday night in their non-conference debut in the new field house. The game was broadcast over radio station WBKV, West Bend.

The Indians are big but the Suns were bigger and their experience and depth made the difference. West Bend had a battle on their hands in the first half, which was extremely close, with the Indians leading by as much as three points at one time. The two teams settled for a 31-31 tie at intermission but it was all Suns in the second half, in which Kewaskum literally fell apart. Putting on their full court press, West Bend scored 12 quick points and took control the rest of the way as the Indians hit a dry spell in the third quarter like they did at Plymouth. They failed to score for 4:48 minutes, while the Suns did not miss a shot until the 4:36 mark.

Leon Laatsch then hit on a free throw and 3 baskets to bring the score to 46-39 but then East scored 6 straight and dominated the rest of the way. The Suns, who brought their record to 3-0, showed a tremendous defense in the second half, holding the Indians to 15 points. East's hustle and experience was a big factor. Four of their starters played together all of last year, such as 6-6 John Kluever, 6-4 Joe Gindt, 6-2 Jed Holfeltz and 6-1 Jeff Nonhof. On the other hand, Kewaskum's only starter from last season, Jim Bilgo, is still out with an injury and 6-5 Tom Edwards is playing part time with a limp. They are not at full strength and lost their depth, causing some of the players to tire after a good first half.

Laatsch had 14 points and 9 rebounds. Tom Rohlinger, who had 27 against Plymouth, was held to 11 and Jack Kern to only 6, but he had 12 rebounds. For East, big John Kluever led with 16 and Holfeltz had 10. East shot over 50 per cent while the Indians hit on only 32 per cent.

In the sophomore tilt, East also picked up its 3rd straight, 49-36, paced by 6-5 center Ed Duehning, who scored 25 points. For the Indians Wayne Endlich was high with 12.
