Annual Firemen's Picnic And Parade This Weekend

The annual Kewaskum Firemen and Rescue Squad fund-raising picnic will be held in the village park this Saturday night and Sunday, July 9 and 10. Plans are all set to make this year's event bigger than ever.

On Saturday night there will be live music in the beer garden by the 50's & 60's Rock Revival, featuring Danny and the Sunliners, from 7:30 to 11:30 p. m. A 5-man beer drinking contest will be held this year for men or women 13 or older. Qualifying will be at 8:30 Saturday evening with finals at 3:30 p. m. Sunday. Entry fee is \$10 with cash and trophies to be awarded. All of the rides, games, refreshment and food stands will be in operation.

An excellent parade at 12 noon sharp will highlight the picnic and get the festivities underway Sunday. The parade will feature nine bands and drum and bugle corps, including West Bend Patriots Drum & Bugle Corps, West Allis Wranglers Drum & Bugle Corps, Racine Kiltie Kadets Drum & Bugle Corps, Continental Youth Band of Milwaukee, Cardinal Cadets of Wauwatosa, Mariners of Port Washington, Oconomowoc American Legion Band, Hartford City Band and Kewaskum High School Band.

Other units will include the Tripoli Motor Corps of Milwaukee, a drilling motorcycle unit comprised of 40 men, in 4 segments of 10 each on different kinds of bikes, beautiful floats, drill

teams, baton twirlers, majorettes, children's specialties, visiting firemen and equipment, Legionnaires, comic entries, orchestras, ancient cars, riding horses, clubs, organizations and more.

The parade will form on the high school campus and adjacent streets, from where it will proceed to the park. All participants should be present to line up no later than 11:30 a. m. Persons wishing to enter the parade should contact Bob Staehler, parade chairman, or Mike Fierke. Theme for this year's parade will be "In the Good Ol' Summertime." Businessmen, industries and organizations are urged to enter a float. Prizes will be awarded for the best floats and children's specialties.

Immediately following the parade there will be exhibitions by drum and bugle corps in the park. There will also be mini-concerts by at least two of the bands. There will be continuous music throughout the afternoon and evening from the stage and in the beer garden. In the beer garden music will be by Bob Kuetner from 2:00 - 6:00 and Don Schlies from 7:30 - 11:30. Annie & the Playboys will perform on the stage in the evening from 8:00 - 12:00.

The popular water fights will be held at 6:30 p. m. Sunday with neighboring fire departments competing. And don't forget the beer drinking contest finals at 3:30 p. m. Sunday.

Approval of Funding for New Park Received

Village residents of Kewaskum may now be able to see progress being made on the park project since approval of funding for the new park has been received.

Park Committee Chairman Dan Schmidt received word of the approval on June 30 from Tom Blotz, recreation aid specialist with the DNR.

Blotz told Schmidt approval for \$90,000 for the park had been signed June 15. Blotz estimated it would be approximately a week to get written notice of the approval from Washington.

Schmidt stated that possibly by the middle of July the bids could be awarded.

With the approval, the village is assured of receiving the money for the beginning of construction on the park.

2 Men Hurt in Farm Accident

A Kewaskum area man and his son were injured, one seriously, Monday, July 4, in a farm accident.

James Stoffel, 25, of 9562 Lake Bernice Drive, R. 2, Kewaskum, suffered skull fractures and a leg laceration when a hay elevator that he and his father, Gilbert Stoffel, of the same address were working on collapsed, hitting Jim on the head, according to the Washington County Sheriff's Department. The father was also injured in the mishap.

The accident occurred at 2:07 p. m. in the area of St. Kilian Drive when Gilbert and his son were working on the elevator.

They were both taken to St. Joseph's Community Hospital, West Bend, by the Kewaskum Rescue Squad and both ambulances were used. Jim was later transferred to Columbia Hospital in Milwaukee. He was reported Tuesday to be under intensive care there in serious condition.

Contract for New Garbage Truck Awarded at Village Board Meeting

The contract for a new truck chassis and refuse packer box for the Village of Kewaskum was awarded to Honeck Chevrolet at Tuesday night's Village Board meeting.

The contract was for Option 6 which included air brakes instead of vacuum brakes and chain lift instead of hydraulic lift for a total of \$19,942.66. The quoted price on the bid for Option 6 was \$20,092.66 but there was a \$150 deduction for eliminating the hydraulic lift.

The Equipment Committee and Supt. of Public Works, Augie Bilgo, recommended taking the Pak-Mor unit after seeing it in action versus the Leech unit which they also tried. The board authorized the purchase of the truck from Honeck Chevrolet.

Village President, Charles Miller, gave each board member an updated version of the Flood-Plain ordinance which will have to be passed in order to receive insurance. Miller stated that the Plan Commission had approved the ordinance but a public hearing will be in order.

Motion passed to hold the public hearing on July 18 at 7:30 p. m. at the Municipal Building.

Also on the 18th of July, James Arthur of Arthur & Associates will go over the bids on the park, since federal funding has been approved and it is hoped that official word will be received by that time.

Consideration of an ordinance for deferred improvements was deferred until the July 18 meeting. Miller stated that several residents in the village had paid for improvements and this ordinance would mean that when additional people are hooked up to this existing improvement, they would pay the cost of the hookup to the original party who paid for the improvement. The board authorized the petitioning of the DNR for permission to straighten the bend in Kewaskum Creek bed. At a previously called meeting, several residents had appeared to complain of water back-up in their homes after a heavy rainfall. It was felt that straightening of the creek bed would help eliminate some of this problem. Forms have been obtained from Scott Hausmann of the DNR for the petition and the people involved above and below the bend will be notified. This is in the area between Hwy. 45 and the railroad tracks.

The subject of enforcement of zoning ordinance with reference to the painting of cars

in private garages in residential areas again came up. This subject had come up previously last year and Miller stated he had been getting phone calls from various residents complaining. Trustee Raynor Herriges stated that another letter should be sent informing the party of violating the ordinance.

After reading the ordinance, the board authorized Miller to contact the village attorney to proceed with issuing a letter to proceed with compliance of the ordinance.

Dave Nigh requested an explanation on the reason for an upsurge in the amount of delinquent personal property tax from the previous year. He stated he had been studying the audit for the year ending December 31, 1976 which the board recently received. He said the amount was \$1,000 higher this year than last and was questioning why.

Commissioner William Martin explained that there was a carryover amount from previous years that had not been collected. When questioned, he stated that it was from a five year period. Dan Schmidt asked what happened to these uncollected taxes previous to the five year time. Martin stated they were written off at the authorization of the board.

Schmidt requested that Martin compile a list, then the board would decide what action should be taken. He stated that "we have to get this money one way or another."

Martin stated that the municipal office had sent out letters to try to collect the money. Dave Nigh stated that the letters probably should come from the village attorney and would carry more weight.

The list will be compiled for the July 18 meeting.

Board of Education To Meet July 11

The regular July meeting of the Kewaskum Board of Education will be held Monday, July 11, at 8 p. m. in the district administrative offices at 1450 School Street.

Agenda items will include acceptance of a resignation from Chris Stark, vocal music teacher, and consideration of contracts for new teaching staff. Milk and oil bids will be considered, possible cancellation of the second July meeting and payroll and vouchers payable. The board will also consider blacktopping alternatives and any items necessary to prepare for the annual meeting. A closed session will be held to discuss teacher negotiations and wages of classified staff.

Ted Schneider Called in Death

Theodore "Teddy" Schneider, 76, of St. Michaels was pronounced dead shortly after arrival at St. Joseph's Community Hospital, West Bend, Friday, July 1.

He was born Jan. 4, 1901 in the Town of Farmington, Washington County. He was a retired farmer, having farmed in the St. Michaels area. He married Loretta Theisen, who preceded him in death. On June 18, 1966 he married Frances Staehler Backhaus in St. Michaels. Schneider was the son of the late Nicholas and Mary Klunke Schneider.

Survivors include his wife; four step-children, Harold (Frieda) Backhaus, Gerald (Shirley) Backhaus, Joanne (James) Zautner, all of R. 2, Kewaskum, and Marlene (Charles) Schaefer of Cedarburg; 23 grandchildren; four great-grandchildren; one sister-in-law, Mrs. Mary Schneider; many nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.

All his brothers and sisters and two grandchildren preceded him in death.

Mr. Schneider was a great sportsman. He was a member of West Bend Council No. 1964, Knights of Columbus, St. Vincent de Paul, Apostolate of Suffering, and an honorary member of the Boltonville Fire Department.

Visitation at Miller's Funeral Home, Kewaskum, was after 3 p. m. Monday, with rosary vigil at 8 p. m. Services were held Tuesday at 10:30 a. m. from Miller's and at 11 a. m. at St. Michael's Church, St. Michaels, with

Rev. Wm. Bonesho officiating. Burial was in the church cemetery.
