Kewaskum proudly sent forth 161 graduating seniors from the field house Saturday morning, ready to take on the world.

Kewaskum's Class of 2013 boasted two valedictorians, Casey Krakowski and April Stern, Salutatorian Jenny Reicher. Distinguished Student Program Members included Brittany Duarte, Hailey Jonas, Angela Pamperin, Krakowski, Stern and Reicher.

Also included in the class were 23 high honor students and 21 National Honor Society members. Three members of the class will enter the United States Military; Alex Chilson, the Marine Corps and Leah Stoffel and Tyler Voge will serve the U.S. Army.

Class President Kierra Kuehl welcomed the audience and introduced the KHS Concert Choir who sang, "Wherever I Go," by Miley Cyrus arranged by Pamperin. Later the KHS Band who performed "The Symphonic Beatles," a mix from the famous 60's rock band.

Kuehl also introduced Shannon Miller and Reicher who addressed the class.

Miller, who will be remembered for her sports contributions at KHS, gave her classmates a final pep talk, "Each of our lives are about to change. Change can be an intimidating thing. Approach the changes in your life with enthusiasm and confidence. Have the goal to make a difference, no matter how big or small."

Using the words of Dr. Seuss, Miller said, "Be who you are and say what you feel, because those who mind don't matter and those who matter don't mind." She was also the class's vice president.

Reicher, the class's secretary, spoke about the bond the class has shared some of them 12 years or more. "We share many mixed emotions about our departure today, but one thing is for certain; no one here finished this alone. The relationships we have created and the support we have gotten from friends, family, teachers, and coaches, have gotten us to this milestone in our lives."

Those in attendance also shared some laughs while watching the a video of the class's photos throughout the years. The video was produced by Duarte, Liz Schultz and Mikayla VanOoyen.

One of Kewaskum High School's longest serving educators was chosen to give farewell remarks to the class. Biology teacher Bill Lickel encouraged the students to be humble, using the example of George Washington Carver.

Lickel shared the following quote from Carver, "How far you go in life depends on your being tender with the young, compassionate with the aged, sympathetic with the striving and tolerant of the weak and strong. Because someday in your life you will have been all of these."

"All of this respecting and tolerating might seem like quite a chore, but Carver tells us a secret about the reason for doing it. Each of you, like it or not, will be all of the people he mentions. You have been young, and you are striving. Live a life of striving not just to be your best, but to be the best for others. Glory in your strong years but be gentle. In your times of weakness, be brave enough to reach for help, knowing that weakness is not a crime, but the common home of honest people. And when you are old,

may you look back on a life filled with good times and good will to others, knowing that Kewaskum High School watched you always, with love and fond remembrances," Lickel concluded.

Principal Kris Dreher accepted the class gift of additional cameras to improve security in the building along with new interior building signage for hallways and the main entrance.

When asked to describe the class of 2013 Dreher explained, "The class of 2013 has a lot to offer the world. I know they will make Kewaskum proud with their future accomplishments."

Superintendent Jim Smasal addressed the audience and began by asking the staff of the Kewaskum School District to stand and be recognized. "These people have dedicated their lives to helping our children, let's give them a round of applause."

Smasal instructed the graduates to ask themselves, "What would I do if I weren't afraid? And then go do it. After the graduation photo," he concluded with a smile.

The entire Board of Education was present for the ceremony and President Tim Ramthun also addressed students. It was a special moment for Clerk Mary Miller who gave her daughter Shannon her diploma. Treasurer Troy Hansen proudly awarded his son Jordan his diploma and Grace Mueller awarded her granddaughter Mallorie Kreis her diploma.

The graduation ceremony will be televised on Charter Communications Channel 98 regular/986 digital at 3 p.m. on Sat., June 15; 6 p.m. Sun., June 16; 7 p.m. on Tue., June 18 and noon on Sat., June 22.

Mascot committee will hold off on new mural at KHS

The image of Kewaskum's Native American mascot may have been erased from the high school's gymnasium wall, but it still isn't far from the memory of the class that gifted the mural to the school.

Kewaskum Board of Education Member and Mascot Committee Chairperson Grace Mueller passed out compilations of surveys sent to the Class of 1975 that asked about bringing back the Native American image that was covered when the gym was repainted in 2010.

All 29 surveys that were returned by the class that donated the mural supported bringing back the likeness, with 22 votes for reproducing the same image either in the original spot or on a removable surface. Another choice, to produce a mural of Chief Kewaskum from an original photograph garnered four votes.

No survey returned opted for leaving this as they are.

Comments reflected support for bringing back the image or offered disparaging observations about former Superintendent Michael Krumm.

"I have always felt that because our village is named after an Indian that our schools positively reflect that," wrote one survey-taker. "Mr. Krumm really overstepped his bounds on this situation."

Some stated that the former superintendent should be asked to donate toward, or pay the cost of replacing the mural.

But one alumnus suggested it might be time to move on.

"As a graduate of 1975, I personally hope that individuals from the class of 1975 will have contributed more to Kewaskum, this country or society than some mural."

Complaints at both New Berlin and Mukwonago schools led the state's Department of Public Instruction officials to order the nicknames to be dropped by 2014.

At Mukwonago High School, parents sued and won, overturning the order in county circuit court, but that ruling was negated by a Wisconsin appeals court earlier this year and the matter is likely headed to the Supreme Court.

The committee put the matter on hold for now.

The Kewaskum School District Board briefly discussed its contract for school resource officer at its Monday meeting.

A former contract for a Police School Liaison Officer (PLSO) expired in June.

District Superintendent James Smasal said the new contract gives the board more of a say in how the position is managed.

The contract will be examined further at the board's next meeting, which was moved from its regular time of June 25 to 6 p.m. Monday, June 24.

According to a draft of the new two-year SRO (School Re-

source Officer) contract, the district will reimburse the village \$27,000 annually.

While the SRO is an employee of the Police Department, a joint committee composed of representatives of the police department and school district can make recommendations to the chief. If the high school principal is dissatisfied with the SRO he can request the chief assign another officer.

The PLSO program started in late 1990s and was originally a part time position. In the early 2000s, it expanded to full time.

On April 3 this year, Kewaskum Police Officer Kevin Kohn took over the position.



Letter to the Editor

Dear Editor,

In the May 30 edition of The Statesman, there was an article regarding the Kewaskum School District's School Board's special meeting from May 28. In the article, it was stated that I, Angela Pamperin addressed the board. It is true that I addressed the board. However, how the article paraphrased me is inaccurate. To clarify, I said that the atmosphere in the high school has changed from the encouraging and positive environment I experienced in my first three years in the high school to a much more negative and stressful environment this year.

I understand that the school endured a schedule change from block scheduling to seven period days and a principal change half way through the year. However, I do attribute the high stress levels and disorganization fully to those two things. These stress levels and disorganization were more caused by the little unnecessary changes that occurred within the school. For example, midway through

the year, Extended Learning Time (ELT), originally designed to give students a way to get the help they need with the burden of seven classes changed from four or five in previous years, was restricted so that students could only move ELTs two days per week to one location per day. This has not been enough time for students who are struggling to catch up because outside of ELT (and even with-in ELT), teachers do not have enough time to aid their students as necessary.


It has been a great struggle this year for everyone - students and teachers alike - to keep up. The transitions were many and too quickly. I strongly believe that change is a good thing, when approached properly. In this case, the change was put on too quickly causing disorganization and unhealthy stress levels. I hope that the school board and all who are involved can change to help the change become a more positive one.

Celebrate Boltonville Pond June 23

Celebrating Boltonville Pond's past, present and future. In 1975, the *Milwaukee Journal* quoted 84 year old Ben Wierman's reflections of the pond in Boltonville as, "This is the community's pride and joy. I try to spend a little time here every day because it is so peaceful and a man has a chance to reflect on things a bit." Since 1975, much has come and gone, but the Boltonville Pond remains.

Enjoy a Sunday afternoon of story-telling, pictures, memories, fun and food with the Farmington Historical Society, Inc. and the Boltonville Sportsmen Club. Bring a dish to pass, a memory and a lawn chair. Burgers, brats and beverages will be available. In the event of rain, the program and picnic will be held at the Boltonville Fire Department on Sunday, June 23 at 1 pm.

History of Boltonville Mill Pond

The idea for a pond began as far back as 1835 when government surveyors were working in this area of Wisconsin. They noted this land looked like a promising location for water power, a dam and a mill. In the following year these same surveyors purchased the land from

the government as an investment.

Twenty-one years later, a Yankee entrepreneur by the name of Harlow Bolton bought the dream from the surveyors. Like the surveyors, Bolton thought it would be a good place to set up a grist mill business. William Willis, a local carpenter, joined him as a partner and they soon built the mill. Stony Creek was dammed up to power the mill.

The pond became a source of ice for the community in it's early years. Ice was "made" by cutting chunks in the winter months, and stored for later use in the grocery store and taverns.

In 1917 the Boltonville Fire Department was organized, using water from the Boltonville Pond to fight local fires.

At the end of the 1950s the dam gave way and all that remained was Stony Creek winding its way through a swampy area. Several years later a group of men from the community met and decided to restore the mill pond for recreational purposes. They became the Boltonville Sportsmen Club.

There are many stories of life on the pond including ice skating, swimming, fishing,

picnics, catching crayfish and frogs, and a lot of fun.

The Boltonville Pond continues to be an important part of the community. It continues to provide life and property-saving waters when there is a fire and it remains a source of pride and recreation for the community.

To keep the life of the pond going, the Spotsmen Club will hopefully have the pond dredged in the fall.





The loss puts the Indians at 2-2 in the Eastern Wisconsin Conference and 2-6 overall.

"We're hitting .158 as a team. We're not going to win a lot of games hitting like that," KHS coach Doug Gonring said afterward, obviously disappointed the bats have been so silent, especially when the Indians have runners aboard.

What made this loss especially hard to swallow was the fact Kewaskum led 2-0 with just six outs to go.

New Holstein rallied in the bottom of the sixth, however, batting around and scoring all its runs.

"They found every little hole," Gonring said, reporting one Husky hit came on a swinging bunt. Walks and an outfield error also factored into the New Holstein scoring, which started after two outs.

Mike Holt tossed five innings of shutout ball, then ran into trouble in the sixth. Holt gave up four hits and three runs, all earned.

"He was really cruising" until the sixth," Gonring said.

Dean Schlice came on in relief and managed to get two outs but not before giving up a hit and two runs. Boegel came in and got the final out.

"We turned three double plays," Gonring said, once again praising the defensive effort.

The offense is another story. In addition to Boegel's hits, Nick Banks singled in the first, and Jake Hardy got a pinch hit single in the seventh.

Kewaskum scored its first run on a strikeout, and the run in the sixth came home when the New Holstein catcher tried to pick off a runner and threw the ball into right field.

On June 7th, the Indians rode the arm of Zach Hedlund and used some late-inning heroics to defeat arch rival Campbellsport by a score of 5-2.

Hedlund survived a shaky start to give Gonring a solid six-inning effort and earn the win.

"Zach pitched a very good ball game" Gonring said, reporting the big senior right-hander threw just 69 pitches and 68 percent of them were strikes.

After giving up single runs in the first and third innings, Hedlund "got very comfortable" in the fourth, fifth and sixth innings. "He had two 1-2-3 innings," Gonring said, and the six innings was "the longest any of our pitchers have gone this year."

Hedlund gave up four hits, struck out four and walked one.

Brett Boegel came on in

relief in the seventh and was aided by a sparkling defensive play.

"We got a double play to end the game. Freshman Sam Schlosser turned a double play," Gonring said, indicating currently he is depending on strong defense until the Indians' hitting comes around.

KHS did get some clutch hitting in the late innings, starting with Bryce Thull's 2-run single in the sixth, which was followed by Chad Ray's pinch hit single that drove in the final run.

Combined girls golf team will start in fall

Beginning in August, the Kewaskum girls' golf team will be the combined Kewaskum/Campbellsport golf team.

A dip in the number of participants in recent years prompted coach Amy Uhlig to explore this as an option with KHS Athletic Director Jason Piittmann. "I've got a list of girls from Campbellsport, who are interested," Uhlig said. "I hope we can get some good numbers."

Uhlig sees the combined team as a way to continue the sport in the WLT, which has five Division 1 teams competing, including Hartford, Oconomowoc, Beaver Dam, Watertown, and the combined West Bend East/West team.

"It just makes things more competitive," Uhlig said. "I'm looking forward to the fall."

"We are excited about the opportunity to add girls to our golf program, which will allow us to field a full varsity and full JV squad for meets," Piittmann said. "Coaches Pivoni and (Kate) Korth were very willing to look at this as an opportunity to help our program numbers, which should only help advance the game of golf."

Piittmann went on that Lance Beyer, the AD at Campbellsport who passed away earlier this year, "was a great help in getting things going at Campbellsport."

The girls' season begins on August 12. Kewaskum's first match will be at the Watertown Invitational on August 16.
