

## Indians top Campbellsport for title at Badger Creek

Congratulations are in order for the Kewaskum High golf team which captured top honors in the annual New Holstein Invitational held at the Badger Creek Golf Club last Saturday, ending Campbellsport's four-year reign as champions.

The Indians combined for a 338 total, four shots ahead of their arch rival Cougars. Manitowoc Roncalli was third at 354, followed by Howards Grove, 358; Chilton, 360; New Holstein, 369; Menasha St. Mary's Central, 369; Random Lake, 408 and Kiel, 420.

Consistency was the key to the win. All four KHS counters came in with scores under 90, led by Sam Schlosser's 8-over-par 80, good for third overall in the field. Schlosser's round was highlighted by an eagle 3 on the par 5, 10th hole.

Campbellsport's Jack Adams won the medal with a 5-over 75.

Sean Murray was tied for fifth

place with two others at 83, while Andrew Otto was tied for 10th at 86 and Trent Griesemer tied for 14th with his 89. All of the KHS counters are juniors.

"We now have some positive momentum and confidence to improve our team performance in conference competition," KHS coach Glenn Eichstedt said about going to Rock River CC in Waupun on May 4. "We have improved our finishes, individual scores and team totals from last year, now we need to overcome the tree-lined back nine at Waupun's Rock River CC, where we have not had much success in recent years."

On April 27, playing at the Quit-qui-Oc Golf Course near Elkhart Lake, the Indians tied for third place with Waupun, at 176, in the second Eastern Wisconsin Conference mini-tour meet but had to settle for fourth because Waupun's fifth man had a lower score than Kewaskum's.

Sheboygan Falls again was a

convincing winner, coming in at 160 while the host Panthers had a 166.

Matt Bachman of Sheboygan Falls fired an even par 35 for the low round of the day.

The Indians had no one in the top five, but Murray and Schlosser were among six in a logjam for eighth with 42s. The other two counters were Otto and Jim Banks, who shot 44 and 48, respectively.

After two matches, Falls is in front with 2 points, three ahead of Waupun (5) and four of Plymouth (6). Kewaskum is currently fourth with 7 points, followed by Campbellsport, 10; New Holstein, 12; Kiel, 14; and Two Rivers, 16.

Kewaskum finished fourth in the Port Invitational on May 1 with a 450 team total, with all five scores counting. Leading the way were Otto and Murray, who finished fifth and 10th, respectively, with scores of 43-38-81 and 42-40-82. Both earned medals.

## Drought hits KHS soccer team

Goal scoring had not been a problem for the Kewaskum High girls soccer team this season until this past week.

The Indians, who were coming off their championship run at the Oostburg Tournament, lost three games in a row, a 5-0 decision to St. Mary's Springs, following by a 3-0 loss to Eastern Wisconsin Conference foe Plymouth and then a heart-breaking 1-0 defeat at the hands of host Port Washington, which plays in the North Shore Conference.

"It was a 0-0 game at halftime, and Port scored their goal in the 78th minute," KHS coach Luke Piwoni said. "The ball bounded off the near post and went to a Port player who was in good position to take a shot."

"It was a fantastic soccer game," Piwoni went on. "The girls played extremely hard and left everything they had on the field. I was very proud of them. It was the most complete game we have put together on the season. Definitely a game to build on."

Piwoni cited senior Ana Gerhartz for her efforts, saying, "She played a great all-around game. She brought good energy and physicality the entire game." Also praised was newcomer Caley McClyman, who "did a nice job on defense and really helps out with her aggressiveness. She challenges everything. She has been a real nice addition to the defense this season."

Emily Koller was in the goal for the Indians, and Piwoni said, "She was much more vocal in goal and played a real nice game."

KHS had eight shots vs. Port. About the loss to Plymouth, Piwoni said, "Plymouth controlled the game in the first half and was near our goal a lot."

"In the second half, we had much more of an offensive push, and we really kicked it into high gear the last 20 minutes of the game," Piwoni said. "It was great to see the girls fight until the end. We really took control the last 20 minutes of the game. If we play 90 minutes of soccer like the last 20, we will be right where we want to be."

Praised for their efforts vs. Plymouth were Kaila Kirst and Leigh Tamayo, a sub at forward. "She's been improving every game," Piwoni said of Tamayo, reporting Kirst continues to be "the rock on defense."

KHS had seven shots on goal in this game.

Springs scored in the first five minutes, according to Piwoni, who said, "We never recovered from that early goal."

## Watzig, Hanson, Thull, Brock, Debelak top finishers in latest meets

Competing in two invitationals in a three-day period can be a challenge, but many of the Kewaskum High track athletes were up to the task, finishing among the leaders in the annual Alzheimer Invitational and the Washington County Track and Field Meet last week.

At Pewaukee, the host Pirates were easy winners of the boys' title, piling up 143 points, 36 more than runner-up New Berlin Eisenhower. KHS finished a respectable fourth with 83.5 on the strength of three first places and a pair of seconds.

For the girls, it was two schools with rich track traditions, Plymouth and Mayville going 1-2 with 138 and 106.5 points. The Indians, suffering from a lack of depth, placed fifth with 57.50 points.

"Another solid performance by everyone. It was a great week of competing," KHS coach Jason Meinen said. "The weather cooperated again, and it was good to see times continue to drop, and field event distances continue to improve."

Winners on the boys' side included Brandon Thull in the

long jump, Ben Watzig in the shot put and Jason Hanson in the high jump. All are juniors.

Thull leaped a season-best 20 feet, 2 inches (20-02) to take the jump, also placing in two others events. He anchored the 4x100 relay, which turned in a time of 46.10 for second place. (The other runners were Steve Nurkala, Tony Steger and Gavin Schreier), and he added a sixth place in a strong field in the 100-meter dash (11.60 seconds).

Watzig tossed the shot 44-11, which is over a foot better than his previous best, and he finished second in the discus (138-01), contributing 18 points to the team's total. Eric Doll took third in the discus with a toss of 113-01.

Hanson cleared 6-2 for a win in the high jump, and he had an outstanding effort in the 800 where he was second with a 2:05.59, a very good time considering he hasn't run the event outdoors this year. Pewaukee's Robert Wagner won the race with a sizzling 1:58.67.

Hanson also anchored the 4x400 relay (Cade Peterson, Jake Hrica, and Derek Brock) to a fourth place in 3:39.34, but no one could touch Pewaukee,

which won in 3:24.51.

While he didn't win either event, Derrek Brock won in both hurdle races, with a third in the 110 highs (16.16) and fourth in the 300s (43.59).

Ellie Debelak had another excellent outing for the KHS girls, placing second in the 100 (13.11), third in the 200 (26.83) and second in the long jump (15-09.5).

The high jump was a good event for the Indians, with Krystina Lepp and Megan Ackatz taking third and fourth with jumps of 4-08 and 4-06.

Another highlight came in the pole vault where Sarah Kosterman went a foot higher than her previous best, clearing 8-0 for fourth place, and the 4x200 relay comprised of Kosterman, Haley Kleinhans, Ackatz and Lepp, taking fourth with a 1:57.24.

The competition was tougher for the Kewaskum High track teams in the annual Washington County test held April 28.

D-1 teams from Germantown and Hartford dueled for the boys' title, with Germantown taking the top spot 154-143, while the girls' competi-

tion had more drama than three horses going neck and neck to the finish line in the Kentucky Derby. Germantown got the nod in a photo finish, scoring 127.5 points, one point more than Slinger's 126.5 and 2.5 ahead of West Bend West's 125.

Kewaskum's boys had three first places toward its seventh place with 79 points, while the girls, struggling in the field events, distance races and hurdles, scoring just 40 points, also good for seventh place.

Brock continued his dominance in the two hurdle events. He was a double winner, skimming over the 110-meter high hurdles in 15 and .89 (15:89) seconds, a personal best for him, and coming in with a very

respectable 42.64 in the 300 intermediates to win by .08 of a second.

Top weight man Watzig provided another highlight for the Indians, winning the discus with an impressive toss of 141 feet, 8 inches (141-08).

Hanson provided a second in the high jump after clearing 6-0.

Thull had a good outing, with a second in the 100, third in the long jump (19-09.75) and a fourth in the 200 (23.79)

Debelak was a standout for the KHS girls, finishing second in the 100 (13.15), second in the long jump with a season-best 16-06.25, losing second place by .5 of an inch. She also placed fourth in the 200 (26.74).
