## Robyn Bindrich Receives Herb Kohl Fellowship Award

After Robyn Bindrich was nominated for the Herb Kohl Fellowship Award last fall, she tried to not get her hopes up.

Receiving the award was something she had dreamed of for as long as she could remember. She tried to not think about the possibility because it was going to be a long wait. She was told that would find out in March if she had been selected.

So starting March 1, she started asking her family each day, "Did anybody get the mail today?"

Finally, on Monday, March 19, her son came into the house and said, "Mom, you got a letter from Herb Kohl."

When she read the letter, Bindrich was overwhelmed. She had been chosen as a recipient of the Herb Kohl Fellowship Award.

"This award has always been something I hoped I could one day be nominated for. I just admire Herb Kohl so much and every-

thing he has done for education in our state," Bindrich said.

Recipients each receive \$6,000, and an additional \$6,000 goes to their school district. In total, 100 teachers across the state receive the Fellowship Award.

"This is probably the highest award that a teacher in our school district can get, and one that we all the teachers aspire to get at some point in their career," Kewaskum School Superintendent James Smasal said.

Bindrich was selected for her superior ability to inspire a love of learning in their students, her ability to motivate others, and her leadership and service within and outside the classroom.

For the past four years, Bindrich has worked as a literacy coach for the Kewaskum School District. In that position, she works with teachers to help strengthen literacy practices in the district.

"I send out a survey at the beginning of the year,

to see which teachers want to work with me. I tell the teachers why I feel everyone deserves a coach. It's not like they need a coach, they deserve a coach," Bindrich said.

Once teachers sign up to work with Bindrich, they develop a plan to decide how they would like their students to improve. Sometimes it is in reading, sometimes it is in writing.

Bindrich currently is working with teachers at Farmington Elementary School, Kewaskum Elementary School and Kewaskum Middle School.

"I feel lucky that every day I get to walk into schools and lift teachers up. That's my job," Bindrich said. "I mean, how lucky am I to be able to do that every day?"

Bindrich was nominated for the Kohl Fellowship Award by Mark Bazata, curriculum director for the school district. He also wrote her a letter of recommendation, as did Stephanie Rinzel, a first-grade teacher at

Kewaskum Elementary School, and Paul Walter, who used to teach with Bindrich in Slinger.

## School Board Approves Funds For Athletic Fields

The Kewaskum School District is getting closer to having an upgraded Doc Mitchel Athletic Complex and new baseball and softball fields.

At Monday night's School Board meeting, the board unanimously approved using general fund balance for the athletic field projects while maintaining a fund equity of at least 15 percent of the preceding year's expenditures.

"Specifically, that allows us, in this school year, to start pulling fund balance money [for the athletic field projects], so it can go over two years rather than one year in the long run," Superintendent James Smasal told the board Monday night.

"We are saying that at this point in time, we feel that borrowing that money out of fund balance for these field projects is more cost effective to do it over two school years versus

one year. Even though you might have to borrow a little more in short-term borrowing, interest will be less," Smasal said.

At this time, the district has about \$1 million in fund balance available for the athletic field projects, while still maintaining 15 percent in its fund balance, Smasal said.

Improvements to the athletic fields is not part of the capital project that voters approved in the 2016 referendum.

At Monday night's meeting, Smasal said that what does not come from fund balance to cover the \$2.6 million bill would be covered by short-term borrowing.

School Board Member Tim Ramthun asked if the district should be concerned with any wetland issues.

Smasal replied that administration would not have asked for the project if it couldn't be done.

# Income Tax Filing Deadline Is This Week

The income tax filing deadline is this week, and the Wisconsin Department of Revenue is reminding taxpayers to file their income tax returns by the deadline. Returns must be received or postmarked by midnight on Tuesday, April 17.

The deadline is extended this year because April 15 is a Sunday, and Monday, April 16, is Emancipation Day, a holiday in Washington, D.C.

The Department of Revenue is sharing the following tips to make the filing process easier:

- Use our self-service options. Use links to locate income tax forms and instructions or find answers to common questions about preparing your tax return, tax credits and much more.
- Pay your taxes online. The department offers easy online payment of your taxes on its website. Watch this short one minute video to find out

how to make your payment online.

- File an extension request with the IRS if you won't make the April 17 deadline. You must request an extension from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) by April 17 to avoid late filing penalties. Go to the IRS website at [www.irs.gov](http://www.irs.gov) and search "extension" for more information. Taxpayers who file an extension request with the IRS automatically receive an extension from the state. Keep a copy of the IRS federal extension application (Form 4868) for your records. Please keep in mind that even if you have an extension of time to file your return, you will owe interest on any tax not paid by April 17. You can avoid interest charges during the extension period by paying any estimated amount owed by April 17, using a 2017 Wisconsin Estimated Tax Voucher.
- Call customer service

during off-peak hours at 608-266-2772. Our customer service hours are 7:45 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.

- \*Customer service is \*available between: 7:45 a.m.-9 a.m. and 11 a.m.-1 p.m.
- \*The best days to call are Thursday and Friday
- \*The best times to call are 9 a.m.-11 a.m. and 1 p.m.-4 p.m.
- \*Download the WI Revenue mobile app (available in the Apple and Android app stores) and watch tax assistance videos, check the status of your return or refund, find VITA sites, take action if you received an ID Verification letter, and more.
- \*Remember DOR will not contact you by telephone or email regarding your income tax return. If the Department needs more information to verify items on your return, it will contact you by letter.

## WASHINGTON COUNTY SHERIFF'S REPORT

### Fatal Motor Vehicle Crash

On April 3, at approximately 12:04 p.m., the West Bend Police Department was notified of a single vehicle crash on State Highway 33 at Aerial Drive. Personnel from the West Bend police and fire departments were dispatched to the scene. Upon their arrival, first responders found the operator and sole occupant of the vehicle to be deceased. It was also determined that the crash occurred in the Town of Trenton, and the scene was turned over to the Washington County Sheriff's Office for further investigation.

A preliminary on-scene investigation revealed the following: A passenger car, operated by a 26 year-old City of Milwaukee man, was eastbound on State Highway 33 in the area of Aerial Drive. The vehicle crossed over the west-bound lane of travel, left the roadway and struck a large tree located north side of State Highway 33. The operator and sole occupant was not wearing his seatbelt and was ejected from the vehicle. He was pronounced deceased at the scene by the Washington County medical examiner. This was Washington County's second traffic fatality of 2018.

The crash remains under investigation by the Sheriff's Accident Reconstruction Unit. State Highway 33 between Trenton Road and North Oak Road was closed for approximately four hours to facilitate investigative and clean-up efforts. The Wisconsin State Patrol,

West Bend Police Department and Washington County Highway Department assisted with the closure/detour.

### National Telecommunicator Week

The week of April 8 through April 14 is National Telecommunicator Week. This week is a time to recognize public safety dispatchers for the important work they do.

Communications officers at the Sheriff's Office are a key component of the public safety agencies in Washington County. They are integrated into all the Sheriff's Office operations. They dispatch and monitor patrol deputies. They monitor Court security deputies and courthouse alarms. And they coordinate with jail staff during emergencies and new arrests. They also coordinate with administrative staff on warrants, civil process and non-emergency public communications. They are a key part of a complete team that carries out the duties of the sheriff.

Communications officers also provide emergency and non-emergency dispatch duties for the operations of the

Jackson, Slinger, Kewaskum, Trenton and Newburg Police Departments. They also coordinate with the communications officers at the Germantown, West Bend and Hartford PSAP's (Public Safety Answering Point) as well as the surrounding counties' PSAP's.

Washington County Fire and EMS agencies are also served by the communications officers at the Sheriff's Office. They dispatch these agencies to calls for service, and monitor and assist with their activities at scenes. The Communications Center also serves as the MABAS (Mutual Aid Box Alarm System) dispatch center for Washington County fire departments.

Finally, and most importantly, public safety dispatchers are the people who receive the citizen requests for public safety services. They are the first ones to respond to a person's need for fire, EMS or law enforcement services.

## Severe Weather Spotter Training

On Monday, April 16, a meteorologist from the National Weather Service (NWS) will conduct Severe Weather Safety & Spotter Training at the Jack Russell Memorial Library located at 100 Park Ave. in Hartford, Wisconsin. Two identical sessions will be held - an afternoon session from 1-3 p.m. and an evening session from 6-8 p.m.

This training is free, open to the public and does not require any pre-registration.

The class will be deliv-

ered in two parts. The first hour will address aspects of severe weather safety including high winds/tornados, flooding and lightning. The second hour will cover recognition training on weather features that are indicators of severe weather potential. The causes and dynamics of differing forms of severe weather will be discussed and video/photos of past weather events will be presented to illustrate some of the concepts.

This training is recommended for members of

local police, fire and EMS departments as well as amateur radio operators and anyone else with an interest in weather. There will be ample time allowed for questions.

This training is sponsored through the cooperation of: City of Hartford Emergency Management, Washington County Office of Emergency Management, Wisconsin Emergency Management and the National Weather Service.

then donated to the Burn Center or Children's Hospital.



Little August Koch was very severely burned on one of his legs last week Friday when he got into a pail of boiling water which was being used for scrubbing the store building. The little fellow is getting along very nicely according to late reports.

Since the automobile has taken so prominent a place in the business world it will be of interest to our readers to know when the first automobile appeared on the streets of Kewaskum. The article explaining the event is taken from the *Statesman* issue of August 10, 1899 and is as follows:

"The first automobile seen on the streets of Kewaskum rolled in here Thursday noon from Milwaukee, in charge of

Philip Odenbrett and son George, the well-known piano tuners of that city. They made the run from the Cream City to West Bend in 2 1/2 hours, but it took them 3/4 of an hour to come from the latter place to Kewaskum owing to the sandy Hills on the road. The rig was stored in Perschbacher's carriage repository, where it attracted a great deal of attention until yesterday, when the owners left for Fond du Lac. The vehicle can be guided through crowded city streets or run over a country road at the rate of from three to 21 miles an hour, and in coming in here it was pleasing to note that the carriage was not noisy and frightened no horses. The power used is called a hydrocarbon motor. The motor is six horsepower, and with a charge of three gallons of gasoline it will run 75 miles over fair country roads. The carriage costs \$1,000, weighs 1,600 pounds and carries three persons if necessary. It is provided with pneumatic tires and has an alarm gong to announce its approach. It is guided by means of a pair of levers at the right of the seat, and the speed can be regulated by pressing a button at the left foot of the driver, who can also put on the brakes in like manner. The running gearing is of steel tubing an has ball bearings throughout. The "locomotor" also has acetylene lamps which light up the road nicely." From that article it is plainly seen that in those days the automobile was a curiosity. This is only nineteen years ago, and yet during that time the automobile has become an essential in carrying on the world's business. It is estimated that in the United States at the present time there is one automobile for every twenty persons, and its demand is still growing.

# Kewaskum Snowboards Take On Copper Mountain

Kewaskum's trio of high-flying snowboards. Ayrton Lehmann, John Lochen and Lilly Schlosser, did well in the annual USASA (United States of American Snowboard Association) National Championships held at Copper Mountain, Colorado the week of April 7-13.

After years of moving up the ladder in a variety of events, Lehmann, a senior at Kewaskum High School, reached the podium in one of them. He finished third in a field of 44 in the Rail Jam with a score of 1,430 points. The winner of the event was Cole Solner of Apple Valley, Minnesota, who scored a 1,660.

Lehmann competed in one other event, the Slopestyle competition where he finished 35th.

Lochen and Schlosser were "rookies" in the competition but still performed at a high level in one or two of their events.

Lochen, a seventh grader at Kewaskum Middle School, placed 23rd in the Slalom and Giant Slalom and 41st out of 92 Breaker Boys (ages 12-13) boarders in the Slopestyle competition, which includes jumps and rails. He received 44.5 points in the competition.

Lochen said he has been snowboarding since he was eight years old, competing in the Mid West Best league, which includes competitions at Sunburst, Little

Switzerland in Slinger, Tyrol Basin in Mount Horeb, Alpine Valley near East Troy and The Rock in Milwaukee.

Snowboarders who earn enough points from those competitions advance to the Nationals at Copper Mountain which is at 12,313 feet elevation. When asked if he had trouble adjusting to the air at the higher altitude, Lochen said, "It was a little different, but I got used to it very quickly."

What was more difficult was getting in enough practice time early in the season when there wasn't much natural snow in Wisconsin and at Nationals when there were just a couple hours allotted for the snowboarders at practice on Copper

Mountain.

"It was tricky because we didn't have that much practice," Lochen said.

In addition to the events already mentioned, Lochen finished 23rd in Slalom, where he had identical 24-second runs, and 23rd in the Giant Slalom with times of 24 and 25 seconds.

Lochen finished near the top half of Bordercross, placing 49th out of 85 competitors. with a time of 60.9 seconds. (In this event, four boarders race down the hill at the same time.)

Wisconsin snowboards are at a disadvantage because there are no half-pipes in the state. So it is impossible to practice for this event, which figures into the all-around standings. Still, Lochen was 18th out of 20 in his age group in the all around.

What did Lochen enjoy best about the week in Colorado?

"Meeting new friends and competing with other people," he said.

Schlosser, a freshman at Kewaskum High School, also enjoyed her first trip to Nationals and is already looking forward to the 2019 competition.

"I've been snowboarding since the third grade. I started at Sunburst," Schlosser said Sunday night, indicating she works at the Kewaskum hill so she is able to practice most days when she isn't working and after hours when she is scheduled to work.

Schlosser competed in the Mid West Best meets, but when she qualified for the Nationals, she

switched to the G Team from Minnesota, which offers different ski hills and higher level coaching.

Concerning the competition, Schlosser said, "I did the best in Rail Jams which kind of surprised me because I competed against some 20-year olds ... I took ninth place."

Schlosser described Rail Jams as an event where the competitors have a certain amount of time, like 20 to 25 minutes to complete tricks, spins and jumps on rails, release boots from the board and then go back up the hill to do some more stunts.

"I want to say I had about eight to 10 hits [during the time allotted]," she said.

Schlosser also finished 15th in Bordercross, 18th in Giant Slalom and 24th

in Slopestyle.

Concerning how she will continue to train for next year, Schlosser said her family has a trampoline in the back yard, and during the off-season, she puts on her boots and jumps on it, working on "spinning in midair" to improve on her jumps.

"I also long board a lot," she went on, explaining long board is a kind of skate board.

After returning home, Schlosser rejoined the KHS varsity soccer team which is hoping to get into action this week..

# KHS Softball Team Will Be Good Again

Opposing softball teams may shudder when they see Kewaskum High coming up on their schedule during the 2018 season. The Indians have their pitching ace, junior Kennedy Lehn, and eight other letter winners back from a season that ended in the finals of the WIAA Division 2 state tournament.

KHS fell short in the title game in Madison, losing a heart-breaking 11-10, extra inning decision to Rice Lake, a loss which has haunted the Indians for the past nine months and prompted them to focus on "Redemption and Unfinished Business" for this spring.

"That's the motto," KHS coach Jeff Gosse said last week awaiting the first game of his 18th season. Gosse said the Indians are determined to have an even better season than the 25-4 they had a year ago, and they believe they can win the East Central Conference, get back to state and this time, bring home the gold.

While he is happy with the energized attitude he sees, Gosse said, "At the same time, I have to bring them down to earth," and focus on a one-game-at-a-time philosophy.

Understandably, Gosse is so happy to have Lehn, a first team all-ECC pick, back. She went 23-4 in her sophomore campaign, and she's looking even better this year. During the off-season, "She's picked up a new pitch," Gosse

said, adding, "She's also improved her velocity," averaging about 66 miles per hour with her fast ball.

What will be nice this spring is the Indians have added a second pitcher, junior Kaitlyn Miller. "She was with us as a freshman, then went out for track last year. Now she's back," Gosse said, indicating Miller, a right-handed pitcher who bats from the left side, is a great asset for the team.

"We're blessed," the coach said, reporting Miller is "a great pitcher," who can also play first base and help the team with her bat.

Another plus for KHS is Leah Theusch, a second-team all ECC pick, is back behind the plate after having an excellent sophomore year.

"I believe your pitcher is only as good as your catcher," Gosse said, explaining the catcher runs the defense and must have a good arm, something Theusch has already exhibited. "They (Theusch and Lehn) work so well together," he said.

Other returning starters are: junior Ashley Trapp at shortstop (second team all ECC), senior Skylar Donath at third, outfielders Maddy Geidel, an all-East Central first-team player, Kaitlyn Leitheiser and Abigail Baumann, and designated hitter Megan Marx. Marx and Donath are the only seniors on the team, while Geidel is a junior and the other two are sophomores.

Geidel provides the power for KHS after batting .550 with 32 runs batted in and blasting six home runs a year ago. "She's getting stronger and stronger," Gosse said, noting Geidel has improved her patience on off-speed pitches, which will "make her even more dangerous," at the plate.

Gosse said Marx will start at first base this spring, while newcomer Tara Elizabeth Theusch will get the nod at second, a spot the coach was a little worried about after Kenzie Lehn, "my best second baseman ever, graduated. Nice she

(Theusch) showed up at our doorstep," the coach said.

"I feel like we have everything covered," Gosse said, even considering the team lost Lehn, outfielder Brittany Williams and four-year starter Bre Trepes to graduation and Sydney Kertscher, a sophomore letter winner, because of a knee injury she suffered in basketball.

Sophomore Morgan Goeden has earned a spot on the 11-player varsity team, and Gosse plans to bring up two or three sophomores from the JV team each game to give them experience for the future.

When it comes to the EC Conference title race, the "Redemption and Unfinished Business" theme comes to the forefront because arch rival Waupun edged out the Indians in 2017, 13-1 to 12-2. Gosse likes his team's chance of claiming the title, adding, "Waupun will be good. Campbellsport will be good," he said, noting Kettle Moraine Lutheran and Winneconne are other possible challengers.

The Indians' game against Campbellsport had to be cancelled because of snow and will be made up on May 14 as part of a double header. A scheduled game with Winneconne was also postponed.

The weather has not been cooperative thus far, according to Gosse, who said, "We've only been outside three or four days," and practicing indoors isn't ideal. "Easter came at a good time for us," he said on, reporting the girls had several very good practices recently.

The Indians are scheduled to host Waupun today (April 12) at Kiwanis Park at 4:45, weather permitting.

# Talented Seniors Are Primed And Ready To Lead Track Team

Will the losses from graduation outweigh the gains of new candidates or visa versa? That is the big question regarding the 2018 Kewaskum High boys track team and how it will fare this spring ... if spring ever comes.

"We got cancelled last Friday (Oostburg Invitational), and we are cancelled for tomorrow (an East Central quad meet at Campbellsport)," KHS co-head coach Kris Evans said on April 9, reporting, "So we won't have a meet until Tuesday of next week (April 17th, quad meet at Kettle Moraine Lutheran."

Evans, starting his third season, is understandably anxious to get outdoors to see what the Indians can do. He is confident he has a trio of senior leaders, plus a good supporting cast, to have a good season but is unsure if the Indians will have enough firepower to battle the likes of Berlin and Plymouth.

The three seniors leading the way in their final seasons are: Cade Peterson, sprinter, discus thrower relay runner; Tony Steger, relays and high jump and Riley Donovan, weights. The entire senior class is "a great group ... A lot of talent in that group," he said.

Evans said Peterson is an athlete "who can do anything. We can put him in any events, and he will score points in them." Peterson will run the open 200-meter dash, an event he finished seventh in at the WIAA Division state meet last spring. He may also run the 400 in certain meets this year and "more than likely be in the 4x100," according to his coach.

Steger can run in all the

sprints, relays and high jump. "Anything 400 meters and down, he's a killer at," Evans said of one of his two returnees from the 4x100 that finished second (42.90 seconds) in Division 2 in La Crosse a year ago. What Evans likes especially about Steger is his resilience. After competing in one race, "Twenty minutes later, he's ready to go in another."

Donovan's specialty is the discus, where he placed 11th at state with a toss of 136 feet and 6 inches (136-6). "Discus is his love, but he will also be in the shot put ... He's bigger and stronger than ever," Evans said, adding he likes the added focus Donovan has shown this year.

Other seniors and their anticipated events are as follows:

Gabe Christenson — long jump and triple jump and possible the 4x200 relay.

Adam Bruss — had been a sprinter but is likely to move to the 400 and 800 events.

Logan Goettl — "Mr. 110 percent," as he has been tabbed by the coaches, will try the 200 and 400.

Blake Miller — did not run track as a sophomore or junior but is back this season, will run the distance races, brining experience he gained running on the cross country team.

Shawn O'Keefe — a runner "who is good for team morale" might try the 200, 400 or a relay.

Cole Surprenant — did not come out for the sport last spring but, "He's quick and strong" and perhaps can help the 4x100 or 4x200 get to state in June.

Faton Elmazi - weights. Evans is also excited about junior Cameron

Dodge, who will be in the 100 and 4x100. He also has a silver medal from the second-place relay finish last season. "The kid loves this sport," Evans said, and is already running in the 11s (seconds) in the 100s during workouts.

Two promising candidates include sophomore Sam Melzer, who cleared nine feet on his first try at the pole vault, and another sophomore, Dylan Maechtle, who could develop into a good middle distance runner.

Sophomore Trevor Degnitz was expected to help with sprints and relays but is currently out with a hip injury, according to Evans.

Evans shares head coaching duties with Jason Last, who concentrates on the weights, while T.J. Schlice returns as vaulting coach and Jim Brock as hurdle coach. Jessica Schlice left the program to focus on her new assignment as "mom." She has been replaced by science teacher Eugene Peterson, who will take sprints and relays.

Another newcomer is former KHS high jumper Jason Hanson, who was competing for UW-Milwaukee a year ago but is no longer in school.

The biggest challenges the coaches face this year is replacing Derrek Brock, who excelled in the hurdles and compete in relays and Brady Hanson, who finished second in the high jump and was on the silver medal 4x100 relay team.

After the meet in Jackson on April 17, the Indians will compete in the Washington County Invitational at West Bend on Friday, April 20.



# Continued From... Robyn Bindrich Receives Herb Kohl Award

After being nominated, Bindrich had to write six essays as part of her application.

"The hardest part was condensing all of them into meaningful essays. They each had to be 500 words or less, and I have a lot more words," Bindrich said.

Bindrich is passionate about education, and that came through in her essays.

"I am a fierce believer in the promise of public education- that every child no matter their circumstance, has the right to a learning experience that equips them to participate in the world. I believe that every child will learn and grow; it is our responsibility as educators to provide the best instruction, resources and environment at the right time," Bindrich wrote.

Bindrich said one of the

things she sees as a positive thing in education now is that people are talking about culturally responsive practices.

"This is really having honest conversations about race and socioeconomic disadvantages, something that I think we really need to talk about in Kewaskum. We are having those conversations already, and we are going to be doing some book clubs next year to strengthen that," Bindrich said.

In addition to staying active as a teacher, Bindrich is involved in the community. That is something she hopes to instill in students.

"Every one of us can make a difference in the world. I live this belief by getting involved locally, by stepping up and taking action," Bindrich wrote in

one of her essays.

She also hopes to see changes be made to state policies.

"Along with restoring school funding, I believe the biggest current threat is the expansion of private, for-profit charter schools and voucher programs. These schools are not held to the same rigorous standards as public schools, and often take their profits out of state. Wisconsin students deserve better," Bindrich wrote in another essay.

Bindrich hopes the Kewaskum School District will put the funds it is receiving from the award toward a summer reading program. Because of the district's building project, Kewaskum students will have over three months off from school this summer.

"One thing I'm really concerned about is sum-

mer reading loss, especially this coming summer with how long it's going to be," Bindrich said.

Bindrich will be honored at a luncheon on April 15 in Fond du Lac.

"I am so excited to meet Herb Kohl," Bindrich said.

### About The Award

Herb Kohl Educational Foundation Scholarship, Fellowship, and Leadership Program provides awards for students, teachers, and principals. Awards in the amount of \$6,000 are being made to 100 teachers, 16 principals, and their schools, and \$10,000 scholarships will be given to 191 graduating high school students.

Excellence Scholarship, Fellowship, and Leadership Award recipients are selected by a statewide committee composed of civic leaders, and

# Continued From... School Board Approves Funds For Athletic Fields

"In the past we have gotten approval and the go-ahead from the DNR and the village," Smasal said. Smasal said that if the village ever takes out the dam from the Milwaukee River, any flood issues would be resolved. Board Member Jim Leister added that the baseball field is higher than the land on the east side of the river.

"The baseball field is six feet over the river, and Highway S is four feet. So Highway S would be fully flooded before you have to worry about my baseball diamond," Leister said.

The district is still waiting for pricing before the baseball and softball fields can be built, Smasal said.

Because of financing, new bleachers are not currently planned for the Doc Mitchell Athletic Complex.

The baseball and softball fields will require retaining walls and higher mesh fencing because they will be next to a parking lot, according to Smasal.

Last month, the board approved purchasing turf for both projects for a combined total of \$589,000.

At the January 22 meeting, the board approved up to \$1.2 million for building baseball and softball fields on school property. Financing of the project would be through the normal budgeting process which may include fund balance, fund 38 borrowing, donations and fundraising efforts.

On October 9, the board approved site improvements for the Doc Mitchell turf and site, not to exceed \$1.4 million. Financing of the project was to be through the normal bud-

geting process which may include fund balance, fund 38 borrowing, donations and fundraising efforts.

Smasal said Monday night that the school district is looking into advertising in order to solicit donations for the athletic field projects. Advertising is different from fundraising, he said.

### School Budget

At Monday night's School Board meeting, the School Board approved spending \$5.19 million on accounts payable.

Of that amount, about \$4.68 million is going to C.D. Smith for the school's capital project that voters approved in the 2016 referendum. Approximately \$600,000 of the accounts payable went toward the school district's regular budget.

School Board Member Tim Ramthun pointed out that the amount was markedly higher than what the board usually approves each month because of the referendum. At last month's meeting, the board approved spending approximately \$459,000 on accounts payable.

"There is a lot of good going on in the district. I just want to make it clear [where the money is going]," Ramthun said.

The board also approved the March payroll of \$1.2 million.

### Adult Athletic Passes

At Monday's meeting, the Kewaskum School Board approved creating an athletic pass for adults to use at home events. Passes will cost \$35 for the 2018-19 school year.


